

# CUP OF JOY FOR HATTERS

Leeds United . . . 0 Luton Town . . . 2

GOALS from Danny Wilson and David Oldfield earned Luton a comfortable passage into the last 16 of the Littlewoods Cup at Elland Road last night.

Wilson struck a great shot after half an hour to put the Hatters ahead and Oldfield wrapped the game up in the 68th minute.

One player unlikely to forget the game is 18-year-old full-back Julian James who was plunged into a testing debut because of the Hatters lengthy injury list.

With Rob Johnson (flu) and Tim Breacker (hernia) both unfit James made his full debut—having played



just six minutes at this level, as a substitute at Southampton last season.

Key striker Mick Harford was again missing from the Hatters attack and manager Ray Harford recalled David Oldfield with Ian Allinson joining Ashley Grimes on the bench.

The Hatters took the lead after 30 minutes with a classic counter-attack that stunned the Elland Road faithful.

Les Sealey denied Leeds striker Ian Baird and from his long clearance Steve Williams set up Danny Wilson for a superb 20-yard strike into the corner of Mervyn Day's net.

David Oldfield sealed the game after 68 minutes when he scored after fine work by Roy Wegerle.
