## Spurs' late brace leaves Luton in danger of drop

LUTON, just 11 days away from their second successive Littlewoods Cup final, edged closer to the Second Division last night when they failed to end a dismal run which has brought one League point from a possible 21.

Luton are now a point from the relegation zone but have played two more games than Southampton, who are in the third relegation place.

Spurs, enjoying their best run
one defeat in nine games
under Terry Venables, went
behind to a late first-half goal
from Foster before replying in
the second period through Howells, Walsh and Gascoigne.

Spurs are now seventh in the First Division — the highest they have been during Mr Venables's 15-month reign at White Hart Lane.

Ray Harford, Luton's manager, would not fault his side's attitude, but said: "The euphoria of reaching Wembley has long since gone. The players are now fighting for their lives and every game is a big one for us."

Luton had the incentive of a 42nd-minute opening goal when, from a Preece corner, Foster headed downwards past Thorstvedt for his third goal of the season and only Luton's third in seven League games.

However, Spurs replied in the 55th minute when Howells, the young striker, converted Waddle's cross.

The former Luton striker, with only two previous goals this season and without a goal this year, slid in to finish from close range in the 84th minute

Gascoigne added a third when he ran half the length of the pitch before skipping the attentions of Foster and Beaumont and coolly slipping the ball past Sealey.
