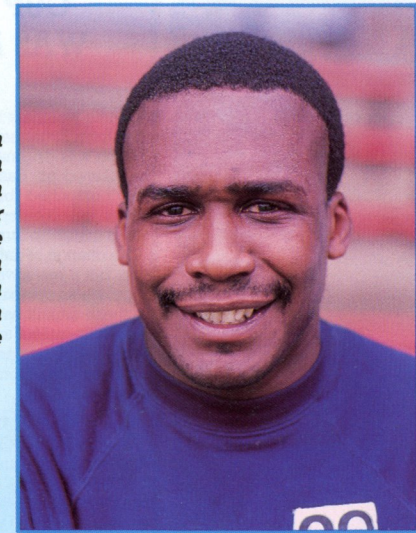

with Raphael Meade



Raphael Meade joined the Town on March 19 in a £250,000 transfer from Dundee United. Born in Islington in November 1962, he began his career with Arsenal as an apprentice. He has also played for Sporting Lisbon and Dundee United. Tonight in Dressing Room Talk, he reflects on his varied career and his latest move to Kenilworth Road:

Sporting spotlight

"I went straight from school to Arsenal and joined them on schoolboy forms as a 15-year-old. I was a striker then just as I am now. But I used to play at centre-forward and wide on the right. I spent all my early career at Arsenal and broke into the first team before I left to join Sporting when I was about 22.

"I really enjoyed it there. I stayed for about two and a half years. It was the first time I had ever been to Portugal when I flew out to visit the club and have talks and it was a great place. A terrific climate and a lot of fun. The league has a lot of Brazilian players so you can imagine what they were like!

"Sporting had a Portuguese manager when I joined them His name was Manuel Jose. We did quite well under him while I was there and finished third in the league and reached the quarter-finals of the UEFA Cup one season when we went out to the West German club Cologne.

"It was a tremendous experience. I was lucky enough to get quite a few goals and I was the top scorer. Sporting was one of the big three clubs in Portugal - the others are Benfica and Porto. So, it was expected of us to keep challenging for success.

"My problems began when Keith Burkinshaw took over as manager. He asked me to play right side of midfield. It really was not my position and I knew

it was a matter of time before I moved.

"In the end, the move came to Dundee last year. I was here at Kenilworth Road training for a couple of days at that time before Dundee moved in so I know a bit about Luton already. And I used to play with Steve Williams, Steve Foster, Les Sealey and Ricky Hill in my Arsenal days - so they are not all strangers to me.

"I've seen Luton on the box a few times and of course saw the semi-final at West Ham. They looked very impressive that day so I knew I was joining a good side even they are in need of a few goals and points right now.

"I am not at all concerned about the pitch. I played on it the other day and was quite surprised how much grip there was. The last time I played on a synthetic surface was when I was at Arsenal and that was not half as good.

"Obviously my ambition now is to settle in quickly and start scoring a few goals. If that happens I shall be well pleased and a chance of playing in the Littlewoods Cup final would be a real bonus."

A warm welcome tonight to our visitors from Tottenham. This evening's fixture was originally scheduled to be played on Easter Monday, but was postponed for a day owing to Spurs' involvement in a live televised match on Sunday.

The change of date attracted attention, but it has always been our policy to be as sympathetic as possible in these situations although we are usually reluctant to move fixtures to midweek because it restricts our younger fans from coming to the game.

Guest tickets

As everyone will know, we have reviewed our guesting policy for matches against London clubs this season, but have made guest tickets available as usual for this game.

A large number of Tottenham supporters live in our area and there has never been any trouble when we have enjoyed their presence in well-integrated crowds here in recent seasons.

Our Littlewoods Cup final ticket allocation went off very smoothly on March 19 when the response from our supporters was very good and

queuing was kept down a maximum of one hour during the sales period.

More than 23,000 of our 30,000 allocation was taken up leaving 7,000 tickets remaining for those members and season ticket holders who require further tickets.

Sunday signing

These went on sale from Sam on Wednesday, March 22 from the Kenilworth Road ticket office. Telephone bookings were available on the Credit Line (Luton 30748). More than 4,000 seats at £20 remained and a limited number of seats at £26 and £12 and standing at £9.

Strangely, the day of the ticket allocation was also the day we signed Raphael Meade. He has to fight his way through the crowds to get in that Sunday morning - perhaps it reminded him of the queues to watch training sessions in Lisbon!

Finally, may I urge our fans to come along and support the team in our 'other' cup final this season - the Bedfordshire Premier Cup final against Barton Rovers. The second leg is here on April 4 and deserves to have a good crowd.

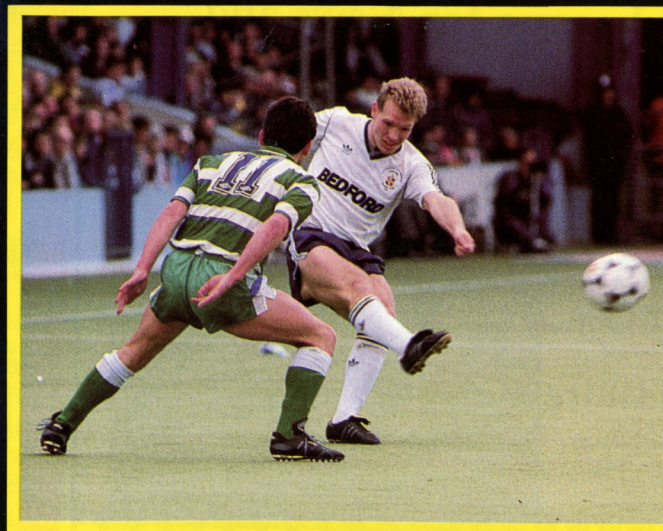
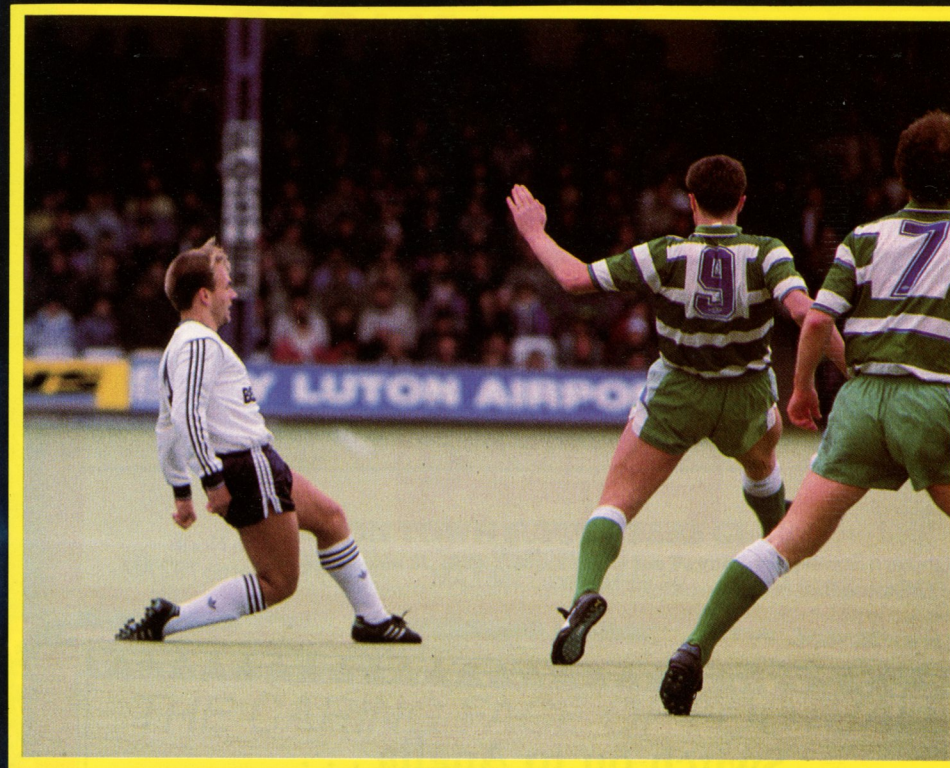
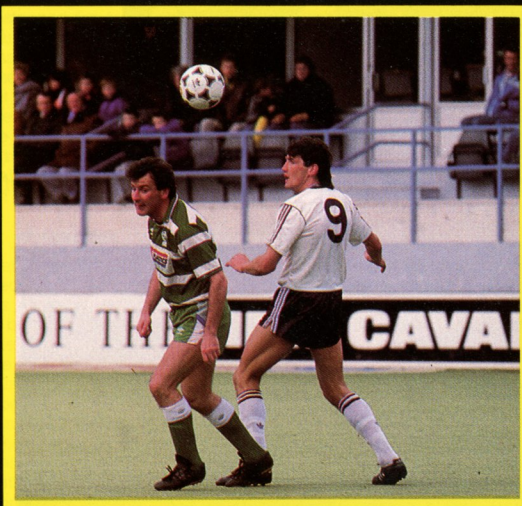

THE CARING FACE OF FOOTBALL



Strenuous efforts are being made to provide modern facilities for the safety and comfort of all football spectators.

This year, more than £1.25 million will be spent on improvements projects at Football League grounds and areas for people with disabilities form a major part of this programme. 1989 will see further initiatives including new and better toilet facilities and additional enclosures for family support.

The Football Grounds Improvement Trust is responsible for all these measures. Each year it receives £4.5 million from the Spotting-the-Ball competition run by Littlewoods, Vernons and Zetters and spends it on schemes to improve standards at British football stadia.

After three months at Kenilworth Road, former Hendon striker Iain Dowie is now becoming established as a member of the first team squad and pressing hard for a regular place in the side. 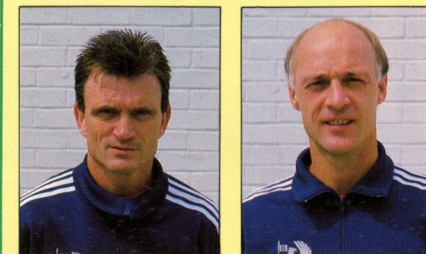


• In the air: Ceri Hughes and Paul Telfer in action against Spurs' reserves.

RESERVES RESULTS BAFFLE EVERYONE

After a generally successful and consistent season, our reserves came unstuck on March 15 when they were soundly beaten 6-0 at Crystal Place in a one-sided Football Combination fixture. WARM WELCOME TONIGHT FOR ONE OF OUR OLDEST VISITORS

Although games Tottenham have been played since our earliest days in the Southern League, our first Football League meeting was as recent as 1937/38, writes club statistician Roger Wash.

Since that time meetings have been rather more frequent but results have tended to go with Tottenham starting with the first clash on 18th September 1937 at Kenilworth Road.

Following our promotion the previous season, the game against Tottenham was eagerly awaited as it is to this day, but early season enthusiasm was not enough to beat seasoned guile as Spurs ran out 4-2 winners.

The Town opened the score early on through Bill Refern but fell away despite holding territorial advantage.

The return at White Hart Lane saw a similar story with two of the Spurs goals taking wicked deflections off Luton full-back Tom Mackey in a 3-0 defeat but ample revenge was gained the following season when a solitary George Stephenson goal gave us the points in a rather fortunate victory.

In the period after the War, leading up to Spurs' promotion in 1949/50, such was the drawing power of the North London team that the League attendance record at Kenilworth Road was broken three times.

Starting on 16th November 1946 when 26,362 crowded into the ground to see Ted Duggan, Hugh Billington and Dally Duncan score in a thrilling 3-2 win leading progressively to the 27,319 who witnessed the 1-1 draw on 22nd October 1949 the Tottenham fixture was always the one that attracted the most local attention.

During this period player-manager Dally Duncan made his last league appearance in the home fixture in 1947/48 at the same time becoming the oldest player to turn out for the Town in a League game at the grand age of 39 years 11 days.

We joined Spurs in Division One in 1955 and our first home fixture was against our near neighbours. Gordon Turner, who loved scoring against London sides, notched a lasdt minute winner to secure our first victory in the top sphere.

During the rest of the period leading up to our eventual relegation in 1960 results went Tottenham's

way although one notable exception took place in 1959/60 as SPurs were preparing their double team when George Cummins gave the Town a 1-0 home win that set up false hopes of avoiding the drop.

Paths crossed again, briefly, in both 1974/75 and 1977/78 but results, again, went Spurs way with the 2-1 defeat at White Hart Lane on April 5th 1975 particularly difficult to take due to the controversy surrounding the winning goal and the fact that the loss virtually assured relegation.

After our eventual promotion back to Division One in 1981 our first game paired us with F.A. Cup holders Tottenham at White Hart Lane with the Town fighting back to a 2-2 draw after being 2-0 down at one stage. Our first Division One victory in North London finally arrived three years later when goals from Mick Harford, Brian Stein and a cracker from Ricky Hill set up a 3-1 win.

INTRODUCING...

TOTTENHAM HOTSPUR

Tonight we welcome a Spurs side currently edging their way into the top half of Division One after a five-game unbeaten run recently including a win over high-flying Norwich and in this, Terry Venables' second season at the helm, they could well improve on last season's final position of 13th, writes *Geoff Allman*.

Founded in 1882 from members of Hotspur cricket club in an area where those famous amateur clubs Royal Engineers and Old Etonians had played a few years earlier, they first entered the FA Cup in 1894-95, going out to us in a fourth qualifying round replay.

In 1896, came their election to Division One of the Southern League and by a remarkable coincidence they again went out to us in the FA Cup in their first two seasons there. Then in 1900-01, the first season in which we met them in the Southern League, they won the FA Cup, beating Sheffield United in a replayed final at Burnden Park.

In 1908, they resigned from the Southern League and at first seemed to have failed to get into the Football League, but then Stoke resigned and they

squeezed into Division Two, just pipping Lincoln on a third vote. They made the best possible use of the opportunity, pipping West Brom on goal average for promotion and then staying in Division One until the last season before the First World War.

They kept going in the London Combination during the war years and then topped Division Two in the first postwar season, following up by winning the FA Cup a year later. They were runners-up to Liverpool in Division One in 1921-22 and then came two spells in Division Two between the wars, the second lasting until 1950 when with a side that included Ted Ditchburn in goal and Len Duquemin up front they won Division Two and Division One in successive seasons.

A season later they were runners-up in Division One and they achieved a similar position in 1956-57 before enjoying their finest hour in 1960-61 when Danny Blanchflower led them to a Football League and FA Cup double, the first side to achieve that this century. On the crest of a wave, they retained the FA Cup a year later then won the European Cup winners

Cup a year after that and took the FA Cup again in 1966/67.

Spurs' successes continued to go in bursts as they won the League Cup in both 1971 and 1973 and the UEFA Cup in 1972. Then after a season back in Division Two in 1977-78, they won the FA Cup again in both 1981 and 1982, both times after a replayed final. These were the days of Ray Clemence in goal. Steve Perryman in midfield and Steve Archibald up front.

When they slipped to 13th in Division One last season, this was the first time they had been out of the top ten since 1980. This was a disappointment for in October they had been as high as third, but the departure of David Pleat in controversial circumstances rocked the boat and Terry Venables' spate of transfers out with Steve Hodge, Clive Allen, Johnny Metgod and Ossie Ardiles amongst the men to go, also took its toll.

Now with a restyled team, there are signs that he is getting Spurs on the right track again. They began the season with three successive away draws, one of them at Liverpool, and they have since won at Sheffield Wednesday, West Ham and Southampton. Their home record was shaky in the early months with defeats by Arsenal, Southampton and Derby up to November 5, but since then Nottingham Forest have been the only visiting side to win at White Hart Lane. In their last two away games they have drawn at Derby and Coventry.

Two former Newcastle men **Chris Waddle** (signed in 1985), and **Paul Gascoigne** (signed last summer) have been amongst the goals recently and there have also been signs that **Paul Stewart**, a summer signing from Manchester City, is running into form.

Paul Allen (from West Ham in 1985) has been joined in midfield recently by **Ally Ayar Nayim** from Barcelona and two others to look out for in midfield and up front respectively are **Mark Robson** (from Exeter in 1987) and our former player **Paul Walsh**, who arrived via Liverpool a year ago.

In defence, up and coming **Guy Butters** links with plenty of experience with **Chris Fairclough** (from Nottingham Forest in 1987), **Terry Fenwick** (from QPR a few months later) and long-serving **Chris Houghton** and **Gary Mabbutt**. In goal, Norway's **Erik Thorstvedt** is now making the position his own after **Bobby Mimms** had started the season as first choice.
