TWO of Manchester City's derby heroes were again on the mark against Luton at Maine Road.

David Oldfield gave the Blues an 11th minute lead with his fourth goal in three games — two of them against Manchester United last week.

Ian Bishop, who also struck in the 5-1 demolition of the Reds, restored City's advantage almost on the stroke of half-time after Kingsley Black had equalised for the Hatters.

Luton also missed a 39th minute penalty when spot kick specialist Paul Cooper kept out Roy Wegerle's effort after Ian Brightwell had fouled Town skipper Danny

City kept the side which humiliated Manchester United a week ago and instantly began by attempting to rekindle the derby festive spirit with a series of positive attacking movements.

But the start was marred by Wilson, the Luton skipper, retaliating to a late tackle

by Morley and the referee intervened before further damage could be done.
