Arsenal, held at home by Liverpool the previous Wednesday night, played as if they had lost interest in the season, as well as the championship, and Breacker, with several timely interceptions and a series of surging runs, inspired a victory which leaves Sheffield Wednesday trapped in the danger zone.

The only disappointment on a day of unlikely encouragment for Luton came when captain Danny Wilson, who had led by example with an intelligent and energetic display, was carried off 10 minutes from time with a damaged calf muscle

Luton had used both substitutes and were forced to survive the last 10 minutes with only 10 men, a task they completed comfortably thanks to the coolness of Beaumont and an outstanding save by Chamberlain from Smith.

Luton manager Jim Ryan was pleasantly surprised at the tactics adopted by Arsenal who fielded three central defenders and three centre-forwards on a plastic pitch which places the emphasis on nimble, skilful midfield play.

With none of Adams, Bould and O'Leary in complete command, Luton were able to exploit the spaces left in midfield and take the lead when, from a centre by Preece, Dowie punished their hesitation in defence by stealing the ball from Winterburn and steering it past Lukic.
