

'Second cup-tie a different game'

JIM RYAN is sure it will be a very different game at Bradford next Wednesday in the second leg of round two of the Rumbelows Cup.

He shared the fans' disappointment at the Town's failure to cash in after a dream start against Third Division opposition at Kenilworth Road. Nightmare finishing was no help, although Bradford earned enormous credit for the way they hassled and harried.

Their man for man marking, perfected by manager John Docherty when he was running Cambridge United on a shoestring, smothered the Town and led to frustration both sides of the touchlines.

Richard Harvey scored a memorable first senior goal after only two minutes. The Bradford defence very kindly retreated as he ran at them from near the half-way line, and they were still standing off as he hit a right foot drive low into the corner past Paul Tomlinson's left hand.
