Luton, well on top, continued to waste several chances when Kingsley Black and Sean Farrell should have put them well ahead.

With four minutes left in the first-half David Preece directed a well flighted free-kick into Derby's packed defence.

As several players jumped to get a connection, Harford was the only one successful to glance his header passed Shilton.

In the 47th minute Luton secured their First Division place
