Tottenham anger fans

TOTTENHAM'S unhappy travelling supporters made known their feelings again last night after another disappointing display, at Kenilworth Road, left their team threatened still further by thoughts of relegation.

Throughout the second half, the Spurs fans seated behind the Oak Road goal repeatedly chanted "Shreeves out" as their team laboured to avoid defeat against perennial strugglers Luton, whose enterprising approach play was wasted by

a lightweight attack.

Tottenham, now without a win in 12 games, during which they have scored only five goals, rarely looked like ending this dismal run or scoring. Their manager, Peter Shreeves, admitted as much afterwards, when he shrugged off the unsettling chants from the fans.

"I'd prefer them to be on at

me in the dug-out than on at the players," he said. "It doesn't bother me. I can shut it out of my mind. Of course, it is not the ideal environment but if that's the one which is created, then I'll have to work in that situation.

"We don't look like scoring at the moment and that was obvious tonight. My concern is not the fans or their feelings but the team. This was a match when we had to battle through and make sure we didn't lose. It's a much better point for us, I think, than it is for Luton," he said.

Luton had the best of the match in terms of possession and goal chances, but were rarely able to claim any clear openings.
