Mr. Wilkes played SOUTHAMPTON MANAGER Ian Branfoot had the good grace to admit that his team's controversial winner should have been ruled out.

He agreed that Alan Shearer was guilty of dangerous play when he raised his foot high in a challenge on Mervyn Day, and was then in an offside position when Iain Dowie netted. But on a day when he thought the result was all-important, he

added crudely: "I don't give a f***." Day was furious about both

Southampton goals.

He disputed the linesman's decision that he had carried the ball outside his area to concede a vital free kick. And he added that when the corner came over, he missed the ball because he was fouled before Shearer netted.

Dissent by deed

He had not said a word to the ref when he demonstrated his displeasure by running upfield before the game could be restarted. But David Pleat agreed that it could be seen as dissent

Day was angered again by the winner, seeing it as everyone in the ground did, with the exception of the referee, Clive Wilkes.

The Town manager gave a remarkably relaxed performance in the Pressroom.

He said everyone connected with Luton felt shattered by what had happened, but he concentrated on his hopes of a brighter future for Luton Town because of the talent on its way
