It was ironic that Kingsley Black should score it, with time and space to get the left foot shot exactly right after Roy Keane and Thor Orlygsson had mounted a swift raid down the Forest right wing.

But that was the worst damage Black was allowed to do, with Julian James having a storming

As Forest marked space from a corner by David Preece, James hurtled upfield and flung himself horizontally to power a diving header into the net.

Mick Harford's 11th goal of the season had given the Town the equaliser, and they were unlucky not to win by a bigger margin. Harford had a header from a cross by David Preece ruled out for offside, and Imre Varadi clipped the top of the bar with a header from a free kick by Mark Pembridge.

Teddy Sheringham had one in the net for Forest, but that too was offside.
