Coaching

Watford's community officer John McDermott (above) suggests a practice to maximise on opportunities from 'set pieces' focusing this week on freekicks.

Between "40 and 50% of goals are scored from set plays", according to the statistics of the often-quoted Charles Hughes. "The more direct and simple the play, the more likely it is to succeed.

FREE-KICKS IN AND AROUND THE 'D':

1. Obscuring the goalkeeper's

Use two attackers to complete a defensive wall. They should stand about seven yards from the ball, so they can break and spin round towards goal.

- These two players should: stand close together with feet
- break after the ball is kicked
- spin and look for rebounds

2.Taking the kick:

Two players should be placed in position, either of whom could take the kick.

- the opposition are kept in doubt as to who will be taking the kick and the type of shot coming in
- the player not striking the ball runs slightly in front of the ball,

acting as a further screen, and then runs in for rebounds


N.B. Kickers and other attackers will need to practise and synchronise their runs.

Other attacking players should position themselves close to the other defenders in the danger area. Defenders defend less well under pressure.

Once you have the practice set up, and the attackers are confident of their movements and understanding, stage a competition, with five or ten shots per 'side'.

Make sure you encourage:

- chip shots over the defensive wall - chip shot over the attackers' wall
- swerve shot around wall
- drive through attackers' wall

RARE _Treats...

Collectable programmes between today's opponents by PAUL LEVENE



A special 12-page souvenir programme was produced by Wattord for the visit of local rivals Luton Town in February 1937.

A glance at the table printed on

page 11 of that particular programme showed Watford a point ahead of their Bedfordshire neighbours in third place in Division Three (South), two points worse off than joint leaders Brighton and Notts County.

Because of the importance of the

game the club had decided to produce this special edition which included full-page team photographs of the Watford and Luton squads plus a page each devoted to the clubs' respective histories.

Also included as background detail to the clash was a list of the results in derby meetings since

On a sadder note the Watford board offered sympathies to their rivals on the recent loss of the Luton vice-chairman Edward Mouse.

The team line-ups in the centre pages showed Watford in 'Royal Blur Jerseys and White Knickers', while the Hatters turned out in 'White Jerseys and Black Knickers'. An advertisement underneath the

line-ups announced a film entitled 'The Gorgeous Hussey' starring Joan Crawford due to be shown at the old Carlton Cinema the following week.

Pen pictures of both squads appeared opposite a page of news and views on the game and on the two rivals-one item ended with a suggestion that the record attendance at Vicarage Road on February 23, 1924 when Newcastle United were the visitors for an FA Cup-tie bringing in receipts of £1,707 8s. 9d. The theory was correct as an attendance of 27,461 was registered a record that was to remain for a League match until 1969. As for the game itself Luton Town leapfrogged over the home side following a 3-1 victory with goals from Payne, Dawes and Roberts, Watford's consolation came from Fletcher

A look at the current Barclays **League First** Division Scene...

Portsmouth's exhilarating run of six successive victories enabled them temporarily to knock West Ham out of second place last weekend. Yet another goal from Guy Whittingham—his 40th in all competitions—rounded off a 3—0 home win over **Oxford** on Saturday.

As West Ham endeavoured to regain their place, they received an early shock when Jamie Moralee scored for Millwall in the first minute of Sunday's game at Upton Park. But, before the game was 15 minutes old, **Kevin Keen** and **Trevor Morley** scored in rapid succession to regain the initiative for West Ham.

David Speedie, the Scottish international on loan from Southampton, missed two great chances to tie the game up for West Ham who were punished 13 minutes from the end when **Keith Stevens** equalised to win a lucky point for Millwall.

With Portsmouth in their present form. West Ham—who have won only three of their last eight League games-are now in danger of losing the second guaranteed promotion spot.

Another club in exciting form at the moment is Leicester but their run of seven successive victories has probably come too late to give then a chance of ousting both West Ham and Portsmouth from the number two place.

Emergency striker Steve Walsh scored two more goals as Leicester defeated promotion rivals Charlton 3-1 at Filbert Street. Walsh normally a central defender, has now scored eight times in his last seven games.

Birmingham, whose position had looked quite hopeless before the club was taken over by new owners last month, have since remained unbeaten and the Blues looked set to record their fourth win in a row after taking an astonishing 2-0 interval lead at Newcastle on Sunday.

Andy Saville, their £155,000 pre-deadline signing from Hartlepool who had scored twice in Birmingham's 3-0 mid-week win at Barnsley, scored again at Newcastle. Ian Rodgerson got their second goal.

Roared on by a crowd of 27,087 Newcastle, piled on the pressure after the

break and their new forwards Andy Cole and Robert Lee both scored within a minute mid-way through the half to win a

Newcastle smashed their club record when paying Bristol City £1,750,000 for Cole last month. Lee joined them from Charlton for £700,000 in September.

The Magpies, who once held a 15-point lead at the top of the table, must be feeling just a wee bit nervous at the moment. Their recent 1—0 defeat at Vicarage Road was a severe blow and they now look back on only one win in their last five games.

Former England colleagues Glenn Hoddle and Kenny Sansom found themselves in opposition last Saturday. Glenn Hoddle, now player-manager of Swindon, took his side to meet a Brentford side that included Kenny Sansom, who was England's left-back on 86 occasions. Sansom was recently signed on a free-transfer from Everton. The game

ended 0-0.





ON THE ROAD

Away match reports from OLIVER PHILLIPS

AMES against Bristol City are not readily recalled as classics although last season's end-of-term fixture between the two clubs at Vicarage Road was certainly memorable.

'City had three players sent-off and while the Hornets won comfortably, with Player of the Season Nigel Gibbs celebrating with a goal. Meanwhile one of the most eyecatching players was City's striker Andy Cole, then on loan from Arsenal.

Cole was one of the players Steve Perryman had considered signing but the £500,000 price-tag, together with Arsenal's stipulation that they should have 50 per cent of any sell-on profit, just swung the Watford boss's interest away from Ashton Gate.

Cole popped up again in the Anglo-Italian Cup and gave the Watford defence a torrid time in their tie at the beginning of the current campaign.

It was ironic that Steve Perryman should express a degree of relief that Cole had been sold for £1.75m the week before the Hornets returned to Ashton Gate for their League meeting.

The irony being Bristol had sold Cole to Newcastle who were to be the next visitors to Vicarage Road, as Keith Waugh and company could testify.

It was at Ashton Gate incidentally that Watford celebrated their firstever game in the Second Division. the equivalent of today's Division One. That was after Ken Furphy had taken the Hornets to the Third division championship in 1969.

It is hard to imagine the enthusiasm that greeted such a match back then because achieving Second Division status had been the target for some 50 or more years for the Hertfordshire club.

I can recall that one pensioner actually cycled to the game from Watford in gratitude for a day be never expected to see.

The Hornets lost 1-0 to a John Galley goal that afternoon in 1969

and the Hornets lost again at Ashton Gate 2-1 the other week after coming back from a goal behind.

The recent visit to the ground produced something short of a memorable afternoon. The most exciting player on view on the day was the City winger Junior Bent, who scored the first goal after 12

There was an element of luck about this, because ex-Hornet Mark Gavin's free-kick, while challenged for by Leroy Rosenior, appeared to bounce off a defender and caught the Watford defence flat-footed.

Jason Soloman, expecting Perry Suckling to come for the cross, had left Bent, to cover for the 'keeper. Suckling decided not to go for the cross and so Bent was unmarked and duly shot home.

The Hornets bounced back in the 40th minute when Ken Charlery and Paul furlong exchanged passes and the striker rolled the ball home after fooling the City 'keeper by shaping for a firm shot.

The second-half was a rather stilted affair but City stepped up the pressure towards the end and were rewarded with the winner, albeit a very bizarre and disputed goal.

Firstly, Andy Hessenthaler appeared to be fouled by former Hornet Gerald Harrison. Then the ball was knocked in and Barry Ashby attempted to clear, only for it to head directly for Glenn Pennyfather. The former Ipswich player could hardly get out of the way of the clearance but there was further debate over who the ball actually struck. Gerard Lavin was also close to Pennyfather and the ball struck one of them and rebounded past Suckling and in to the net.

Watford's players were adamant that the City player has nothing to do with the goal and that the clearance hit Lavin and rebounded. Pennyfather claimed it had hit his ankle and the debate wound on after the game.

"When Tommy Docherty left Chelsea, I could have gone with him to Villa but then I also turned down the chance to manage Torquay."


