relcome to all our supporters who have kept with us during this difficult season. We also extend a warm welcome to all our guests from Peterborough, particularly the chairman Mr Chris Turner and the manager, Mr Lil Fuccillo.

Today is an important game for our club to the full. and we must be very positive in our approach. It would be a frightening quirk of fortune if, after battling so hard to get away from the basement, we are plunged back into trouble.

We are aware of all the circumstances, and the form since November has been worthy of

a team trying to resurrect its fortunes after the knock-on effect of a relegation.

The improvement of results at all levels in our club since November has been quite dramatic. The reserves too were anchored and young players have been pushed along and given opportunities that may not have arisen at clubs with bigger squads.

Some players have either left or will be leaving within the next few weeks. We appreciate their efforts and remind them that when one door closes, another one opens. For example, this season, previous forwards Sean Farrell and Kurt Nogan have found a niche which has enabled them to play regular

"We hope to maker the occasion as enjoyable as possible for the local community and to establish a closer friendship with all who come along." he said.


"We are also hoping to attract people who have never been to Kenilworth Road before and to show them the

## Let's end our home season in style




**CAPTAIN'S LOG BY TREVOR PEAKE**



## Posh make competent start to initial First Division one season



## PETERBOROUGH UNITED F.C. 1992-93

- Peterborough United visit Kenilworth Road this afternoon assured of safety in Division One their first season at this level. The Posh escaped from the old Third Division for the first time in their history at the end of last season, thanks to two Wembley play-off strikes from Ken Charlery against Stockport County.
- However, once the new season had started, the London Road club had to face up to the financial reality of playing First Division football, which included ground improvements to help reach the standard required. The cost prompted the departure of 'goalden' boy Charlery to Watford, but to the club's credit, their spirit remained firmly intact.
- Early season form included victories against Derby County (1-0) Southend (1-0) and Barnsley (2-1), and it pushed Posh firmly up the table to the comfortable position of ninth place. Three points have since been harder to attain on a regular

basis, and the turn of the year saw the club slide unceremoniously down the table.

- A recent home victory against Cambridge United (1-0) and a solitary point against Bristol City has, however, eased their fears. A 3-0 victory against high-flying Leicester City last Saturday even suggests promotion will be a realistic target next season.
- Peterborough United F.C. were formed as Peterborough & Fletton in 1923, although they were suspended by the F.A. during season 1932-33 and disbanded. Local enthusiasts were determined to carry on and in 1934 a new professional club, Peterborough United, was formed, which entered the Midland League the following year. They entered the Football league in 1960, winning their inaugural game against Wrexham 3-0. The club have won the Division Four championship on two occasions: in 1961 and 1974.

## POSH ON PARADE

IAN BENNETT (goalkeeper) - Ian started his career with Newcastle United, but failed to make the grade at St James' Park. He joined Posh two seasons ago and made his debut in the Autoglass Trophy semi-final with Stoke last year.

DARREN BRADSHAW (defender) - Another player who started his career at Newcastle, Darren moved to London Road in 1991 on a free transfer. He was previously with Chesterfield and York City, before joining the Magpies in 1989.

STEVE WELSH (defender) - A former army recruit, Steve joined Peterborough at the start of last season on a free transfer from local rivals Cambridge United, where he failed to make the breakthrough. He has been a regular in the Posh side since his arrival.

LEE HOWARTH (defender) - Lee is a former skipper of the Great Britain students team which competed in the World Games last year. He began his Football League career with Blackpool before going to university. He resumed his league career with Peterborough last season.

TONY SPEARING (defender) - Signed last season from Plymouth, Tony started his career with Norwich City in 1982 and made over 70 appearances for the East Anglian club. Following two loan spells at Stoke City and Oxford United, he joined Leicester City in 1986 before moving to Home Park in 1991.

CHRIS GREENMAN (defender) - A recent signing from Coventry City, Chris started his career with the Sky Blues in 1988. Although he has played top-flight football, he failed to make the grade at Highfield Road and joined Peterborough United two months ago.

JOHN MCGLASHAN (midfield) - John joined Posh from Millwall earlier this season. He started his career with Montrose, making 67 league appearances, before joining Millwall in 1990.

GARY COOPER (midfield) - Gary was signed from Maidstone United on deadline day 1991 and was valued at £5,000 in a £40,000 deal which also saw the arrival of Ken Charlery. Gary has also seen service with Brentford, OPR and non-league Fisher Athletic.

MARCUS EBDON (midfield) - Welsh under-21 international, Marcus signed on a free transfer from Everton two seasons ago. He spent the early part of his Posh career on loan at Redbridge Forest, but has since established himself in the first team.

WORRELL STERLING (midfield) - A £70,000 signing from Watford in 1989, Worrell started his career at Vicarage Road in 1983 and made over 100 appearances for the Hornets. He has been a regular in the Posh side since his arrival and has played over 200 games for the club.

TONY PHILLISKIRK (forward) - An early season signing from Bolton Wanderers, Tony has been free-scoring at London Road this term. He started his career with Sheffield United in 1983 and scored 22 goals before moving on to Oldham in 1988. He also spent a short period at Preston before joining Wanderers in 1989.

BOBBY BARNES (forward) - Bobby spent five years at West Ham United before joining Aldershot on a free transfer in 1986. He moved on to Swindon Town a year later and scored 13 goals in 43 appearances, prompting a £100,000 move to Bournemouth. He moved on to Northampton later that year before joining Posh for £35.000 in 1992.

DOMINIC IORFA (forward) - Formerly with Queens Park Rangers, Dominic joined Posh after failing to establish himself as a regular squad member at Loftus Road. He has international experience with Nigeria.

## **MEET THE BOSS**



If Fuccillo is fondly remembered at Kenilworth Road for his contribution to the side during the 1970's. Bedford-born, he joined the Hatters as an apprentice and signed professional forms for the club in 1974.

One of the most exciting attacking midfield players to have played for the club, Lil was horribly unlucky with injuries, which accounted for his rela-


tively small amount of appearances for the club (140).


He scored on his debut in a 3-2 victory at York City in 1976 and thrilled Town fans with his high work rate and spectacular shooting ability.

He twice broke his leg before returning to the side to play a significant part in the side's promotion to Division One in 1982. The following year he left Kenilworth Road to play for Southend United, via a spell with the Tulsa Roughnecks in the United States.

His appointment at Peterborough United this year is his first in league football, following Chris Turner's promotion to club chairman.

## International call caps consistent season for Scott



## PLAYER INTERVIEW WITH SCOTT OAKES

Since the turn of the year, Town winger Scott Oakes has bedded down a regular place in the Town side. His consistent play in recent weeks has also been rewarded with England recognition.

Scott made fleeting appearances in the side during the first half of the season, but he earned a regular place in the team following the Town's record-breaking clean-sheet run

during February. Playing as an attacking winger, he has proved himself as an exciting prospect and has also scored some memorable goals. The strike against Oxford United at Kenilworth Road being the most poignant.

Scott's stand-by callup to the England under-21 side by Lawrie McMenemy, which faced Holland at Portsmouth during the week, came as a big surprise to the 20-year-old.

"The boss said there are usually around five or six players who pull out of the original squad, so I am hoping I will get the call to join up with the lads," said Scott last week. "It was a nice surprise to be selected and it is always an honour to be recognised

by your country. I would love the opportunity to play for England."

This is Scott's second call-up, following his stand-by appearance against Hungary last season. On that occasion he did not make the squad, but he is obviously hoping for a different outcome this time around. Scott

believes the reason for his selection has been his consistent form, something he struggled with earlier in the season.

"Having played well enough to retain a

regular place in the Luton side has definitely helped," he continued. "That has given me the confidence to enjoy myself and try different things. Without doubt, this has been my most consistent season to date, and the call-up has been the icing on the cake."

Scott's improved form has been reflected in the entire team's play. Only four league defeats since the turn of the year suggests that the Hatters have been more consistent and Scott believes the club should have no problems securing their First Division status.

He added: "The team is confident of staying up and the mood amongst the lads is excellent. Prior to the

game against Derby County, we reckon we only need one win to secure our place in the division. Hopefully by the time of the Peterborough game and taking into account Derby's poor home form we will be safe. If not, we still have a great chance at home against Posh."

ing Dougan quiet which he succeeded in doing on a slippery surface.

The return at Kenilworth March 1964 and although we were fourth from bottom, the previous two games, at home to Hull and at Southend, had been won. The crowds optimism soon disappeared, however, when Roy Horobin opened the scoring for the visitors in the first minute and Mark Lownds deflected a shot from Dougan into his own net shortly afterwards.

On a muddy pitch the 1963 following our Town were frantic and completely disorganised and Frank Rankmore and Ollie Hopkins in the Peterborough defence were too experienced and strong and were rarely troubled. It came as a surprise to the crowd as well as the Posh defence when Tom McKechnie managed to force his way into the penalty area early in the second half, but just as the chance seemed to be drifting away he was fouled but Gareth Salisbury blasted the resultant spot kick over the bar.

> John O'Rourke did manage to score for the Town on

the hour but Keith Smith restored the two goal advantage a minute later. Skipper Dave Pacey, in forcing the ball home in the last minute for the Town, only served to give the scoreline an unrealistic look.

Surprisingly, the Town managed to avoid relegation and as Peterborough had missed out at the other end, the teams met again the following September at Kenilworth Road. A crowd of 9,339 saw Tony Moulden open the scoring for Posh only for O'Rourke to equalise in the second half and have a perfectly good effort disallowed for a supposed foul.

The final match in the quartet took place at London Road the following February, the week after Posh had dumped Arsenal out of the F.A. Cup. Not surprisingly, the crowd of 12,946 were expecting an avalanche of goals against a Town side who were once again in the relegation frame.

Ably assisted by debutant Jim Gibson, the Town managed to hang on until halftime but that man Dougan broke the deadlock early in the second period with Olly






