When all games are completed, the top English sides from each League will make up one semi-final lineup, while the two top Italian clubs compete in the other semi, resulting in an Anglo-Italian Final at Wembley Stadium, on Saturday March 19 1994.

UTON will probably be happy if they can repeat last season's goalless draw, in the corresponding stage of the Anglo-Italian Cup competition.

Disappointing away form plaqued the Hatters for much of last season and they come to Vicarage Road without a win in any

of their last ten away matches.

A good run in this competition would come as a welcome bonus, in view of their early exits from all knockout competitions last term. Following the draw here in Anglothe Italian Cup, the

Hatters were held 1-1 at home by Bristol City and thus failed to qualify for the next phase.

They were knocked out of the Coca-Cola League Cup by Second Division Plymouth Argyle, suffering an aggregate 4-5 defeat. The FA Cup third round provided Luton's only Cup victory of the 1992/93 season, when they overcame Bristol City 2-0 at Kenilworth Road.

In the next round, however, they were crushed 1-5 at home by **Derby County.**



DAVID PLEAT

David returned for his second spell as Luton manager in June 1991. He was previously in charge at Kenilworth Road between 1978 and 1986, when he led the club back into the former First Division and to an FA Cup semi-final.

After leaving Luton, he moved into the manager's chair at Tottenham Hotspur and later Leicester City, before returning to take charge of the Hatters.

He spent his playing days with Nottingham Forest, Luton Town, Shrewsbury Town, Exeter City and Peterborough United, plus a return to Luton in 1974 as reserve team coach. He had a spell in charge of the senior side before taking over as manager.

aged 36, and looks set to top the 500-mark in senior outings.

JOHN DREYER: His professional career started at Oxford United, having previously played for non-League Wallingford Town. Gained League experience while on loan with Torquay United and Fulham, before joining Luton in 1988 in a £140,000 deal.

MARVIN JOHNSON: Wembleyborn 24-year-old defender, who served his apprenticeship at Kenilworth Road. Celebrated his 100th League appearance during the 1992/93 season.

MIDFIELD

PAUL TELFER: Originally from Edinburgh and joined Luton as a youth trainee. Progressed to the senior squad and made his club debut three seasons ago. He secured a regular first-team slot last season.

DAVID PREECE: Served his apprenticeship with Walsall and recorded well over 100 League appearances for the Midlands side, before signing for the Hatters in 1984. Played in two League Cup finals for Luton and is a former England 'B' international.

CERI HUGHES: Welshman, born in Pontypridd and is another product of the Hatters' youth scheme. Rose through the ranks to make his senior debut in 1990. Now a member of the full Wales international squad.

SCOTT OAKES: Leicester-born midfielder who served his traineeship with his hometown club. Found his opportunities limited at Filbert Street, but has established a regular place in Luton's senior side, since his move to Kenilworth Road two seasons ago.

JASON REES: Like fellow midfielder, Ceri Hughes, also hails from Pontypridd. Also a former Hatters youth trainee who has won international caps with Wales at under-21, 'B' and senior levels.

SCOTT HOUGHTON: A summer signing from Tottenham Hotspur. Another Hertfordshire-born Hatter originally from Hitchin. A former Spurs youth trainee, who gained League experience during loan periods with Ipswich Town, Gillingham and Charlton Athletic.

FORWARDS

KERRY DIXON: Currently on loan from Southampton. Luton-born striker who served his apprenticeship with Tottenham, before moving to non-League Dunstable and then on to Reading. Top-scorer for the Royals and later with Chelsea. Holder of eight full international caps for

IAN BENJAMIN: Signed from Southend United last year. A former apprentice with Sheffield United, and went on to play for West Bromwich Albion, Notts County and Peterborough United. Earned his scoring reputation later at Northampton Town, Cambridge United, Chester City and Exeter City before his move to Roots Hall.

MARTIN WILLIAMS: 20-year-old former Hatters trainee, who also hails from Luton. Made an early impact at Kenilworth Road, breaking into the first team two seasons ago.

JAMIE CAMPBELL: Another former Luton trainee, who also recorded his first-team debut two seasons ago. Born in Birmingham and will shortly be celebrating his 21st Birthday.

NEIGHBOURS - ANOTHER EPISODE!

Home advantage has always been important in derby Cup ties against the Hatters. 7.45pm. They have yet to win here in 1898/99 and 2-1 in 1901/02 - both in FA Cup qualifying rounds.

LIONS SHARE A SECOND ROUND OF COCA-COLA


The draw for the second round of the Coca-Cola League Cup has paired us with First Division Millwall.


