POMPEY BURIED AS HATTERS HIT FOUR IN SNOW

LUTON TOWN 4 PORTSMOUTH 1

ON Sunday Luton Town overcame the fire and brimstone of Welsh passion to win a cup-tie at Cardiff.

Last night at Kenilworth Road it was a winter wonderland for the Hatters as they saw off Portsmouth in a blizzard in the First Division.

Manager David Pleat was concerned to ensure that his men got on with the important business without being distracted by cup glory after their marvellous victory at Ninian Park.

He need not have worried. The only danger to Luton last night was the chance that the match might not get played.

But it went ahead on a soft snow covered surface and Luton adapted their football exactly right.

They took only five minutes to roar into the lead. Scott Oakes went down the left wing and knocked over a deep far post cross and Paul Telfer met it with a perfect

header.
Former Hatter Ray Daniel was given off-side when he thought he had headed the equaliser, but Luton took the game to Portsmouth and soon had them all at sea,

Des Linton was unlucky with a shot which was deflected for a corner, but the luck did not hold for Portsmouth because they failed to clear the flag kick properly and David Preece whacked in a stunning

There it had been a matter of battle to make quality tell and they did it superbly with goals by Oakes and Preece quenching the Welsh passion.

Last night they had to change the game plan a little because of the conditions and did it with another superb team performance.

It should all add up to putting them in very good heart for the visit of Sunderland on Saturday.
