

Hartson punishes Millwall blunder

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JURGEN SOMMER will certainly remember last night's match if Casey Keller is preferred for the final goalkeeping place in the United States' World Cup squad.

Sommer watched despairingly as Keller's long clearance for Millwall bounced over his head in the 10th minute, leaving Jamie Moralee a simple tap-in.

It should have set Millwall on their way to a comfortable victory, but though Luton were ineffective for most of the game, they conjured two goals from two chances and with them an undeserved point.

Sommer partially redeemed himself by denying Moralee a second before Luton's first equal-

iser in the 44th minute. David Preece's near-post corner was flicked on by Paul Telfer and John Dreyer headed in at the far post.

Dave Mitchell headed against the bar in first-half injury time and helped to set up Millwall's second goal just after the interval. Greg Berry, a transfer deadline day signing from Wimbledon last week, finished with aplomb.

Millwall continued to dominate but Luton drew level again through John Hartson after suicidal defending by Ian Dawes and Keith Stevens.

Luton gained in confidence and even had chances to inflict Millwall's first home defeat in the League since August.
