Fenwick: Fans can play big part in Pompey's revival

Terry Fenwick wants fans to play their part in backing Pompey's drive away from the division one basement.

His team have taken seven points from a possible nine since he was appointed manager three games ago.

And last night's win against a Luton side eyeing a place in the play-offs has lifted them up the table to 16th place in the table.

They have 37 points, three above Bristol City who head the four teams trying to get out of the relegation zone.

There are four teams between them and the cellar and Pompey have a game in hand on four of the club trying to overhail them.

All in all, their position at the foot of the table looks a lot rosier and victory over Grimsby at Fratton Park on Saturday would cushion their position.

The 7,363 crowd was dis-

appointing and shows that stay-away fans think there is still work to be done.

But Fenwick knows that supporters can help by turning up in numbers and giving their backing to the players - just as they got behind the team as they floored Luton by scoring twice in the last 15 minutes to snatch a 3-2 victory.

Fenwick said today: "We were on a knife-edge in the first half but as the game wore on the fans were excellent and got right behind us.

"There was a lot of passion out there. The lads needed a lift and we have got a couple of good results now.

"It was a good home win against a very good side and confidence is getting better all the time.

"If the fans come through the gates in greater numbers on Saturday and give us the same support who knows what can happen?"

Suddenly Pompey are the comeback kids of the first division.

Two down at Roker on Saturday, they come back to take a point. And last night they gave Terry Fenwick the warmth of a winning Fratton Park debut by coming from behind twice to take three more priceless points.

Just how important that was became evident afterwards with the news that Sunderland had ended Watford's Vicarage Road impregnability by stealing a precious victory while Port Vale had beaten Derby County.

So Fenwick has made a two-win, one-draw start to his managerial life. And while he knows there is much still to be done, he has irrefutable evidence that there is little wrong with the attitude and commitment of the players he has inherited.

For this was a win chiselled out by a display of character.

Pompey were suckered into conceding a soft early goal and, to the obvious disillusion of another disappointingly small crowd, were still trailing at half-time.

They needed only four second-half minutes to equalise but then midway through the second half were blasted back into deficit by a superb long-range strike by Luton's full-back Julian James.

This time they were behind only four minutes before Preki etched himself more deeply into the crowd's affections with the equaliser - and another four minutes had gone when referee Ken Leach gave Gerry
