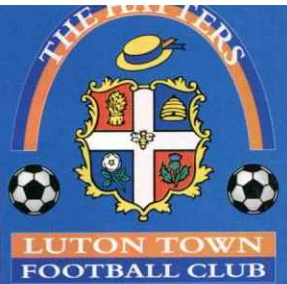
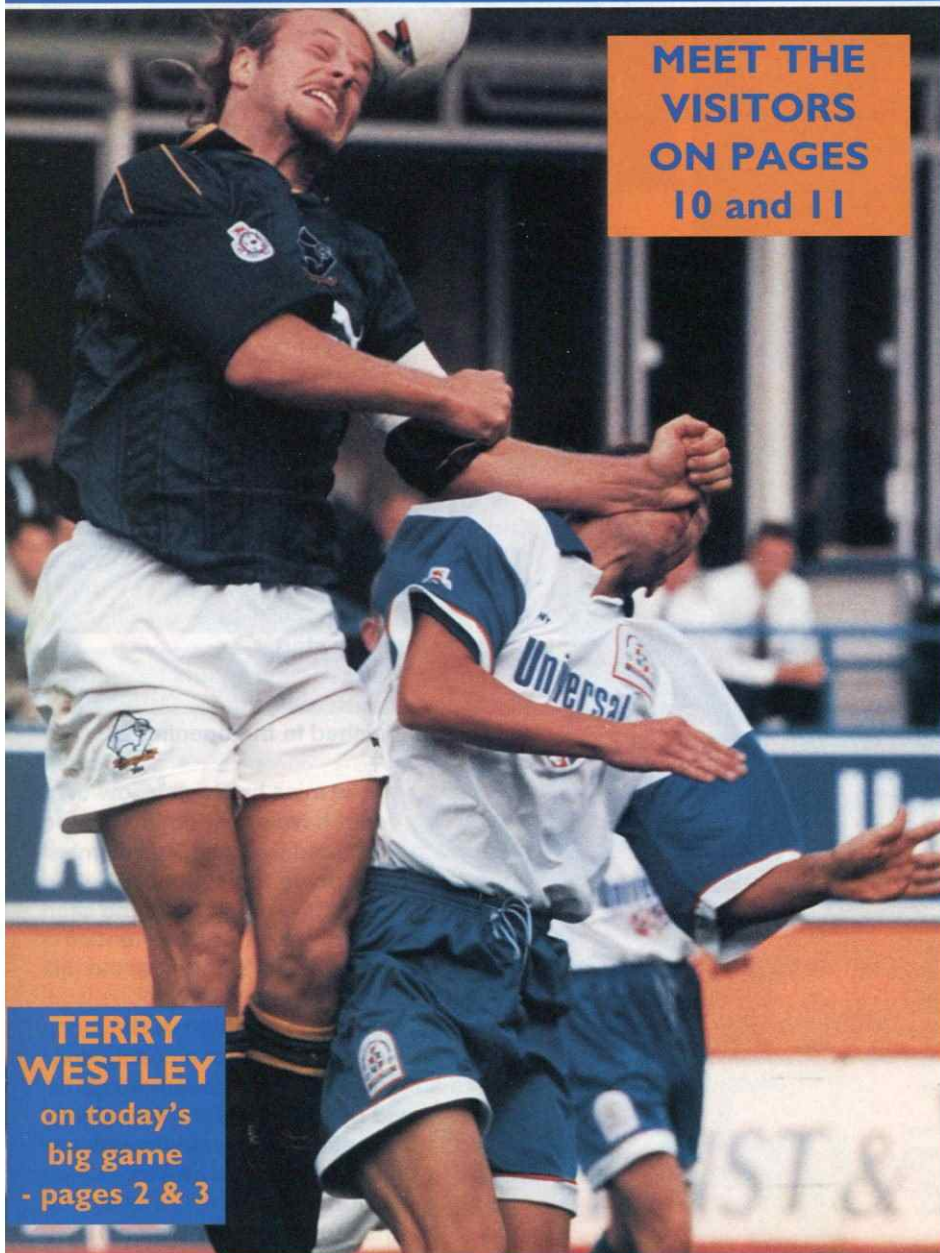

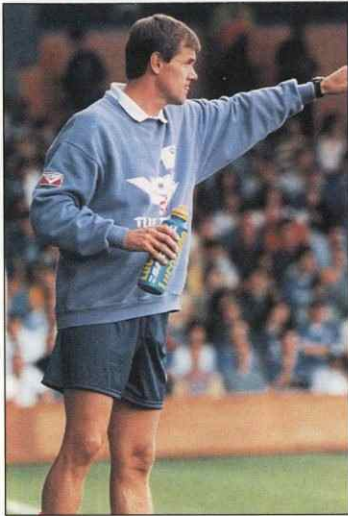

## A CHANGE OF OPPONENTS AND DIFFERENT STYLES

TONIGHT'S game is a relief in many respects to get out of the competitiveness of Division One, and in some ways the calmer waters of the Anglo-Italian Cup.

We welcome our Italian opponents, Perugia, their directors, officials, players and supporters, and I would not expect tonight's game to be as fierce in terms of pressurising and tackling in the defence and middle thirds as we see in the Endsleigh League.

Everybody concerned with the club was hugely disappointed after Saturday's game against Derby, especially after a magnificent early start.

Dwight Marshall's goal should have given us the impetus to really go for Derby and get the job finished in the opening 20 minutes.

The unfortunate miss by Bontcho Guentchev could have provided the platform we required, but players will miss chances up and down the country all season so it would be unfair to blame or point the finger at individuals. We tended to become nervous and frightened and did not really express ourselves.

This club has a long tradition of the passing game, and I have as a coach, and now as a manager, only believed the game can be played by passing and moving with flair and imagination in the middle and attacking thirds. This has to be our number one priority.

Everybody has to remember we are supposed to be entertainers, and I certainly want players to go out to express, entertain and enjoy themselves.

The players will be given different problems tonight, and I would expect the Italians to be full of high technical ability, and have the ability to shoot from distance with strong man-to-man marking in

defence.

We would love to progress and do well in this competition. It will not be taken lightly and hopefully the entertainment will be of high value for all those loyal supporters who have come along.

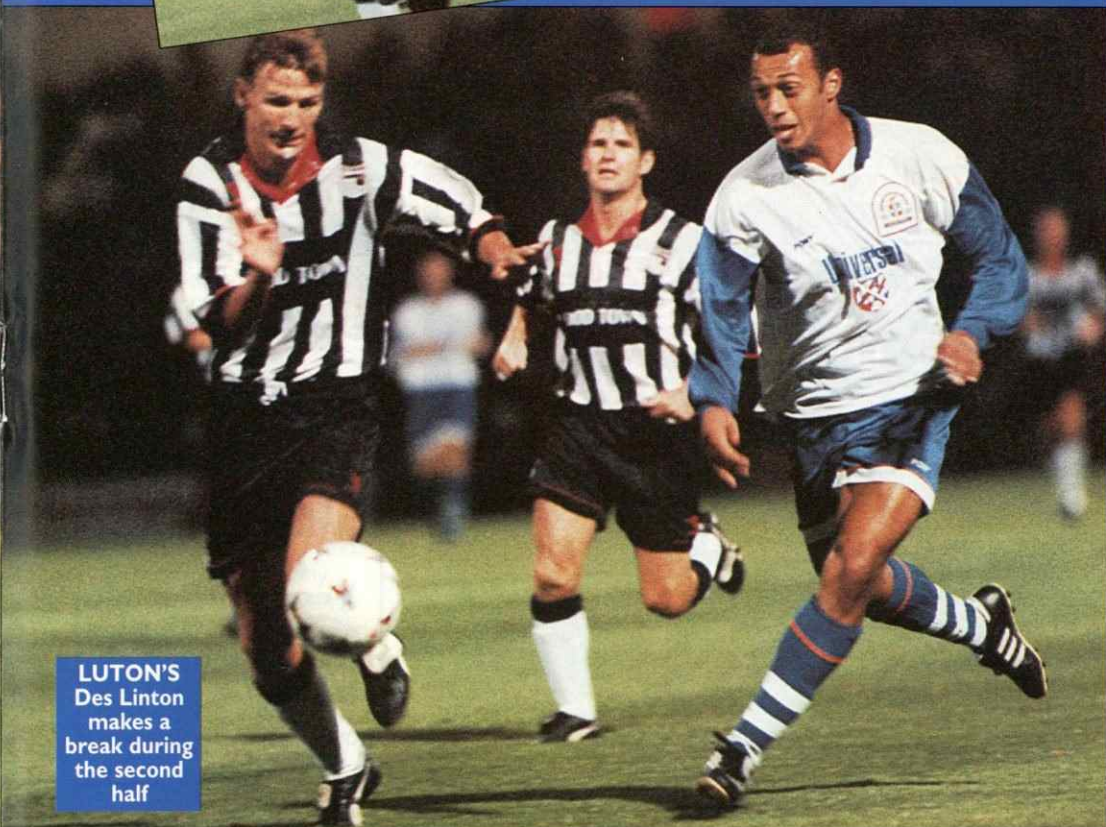

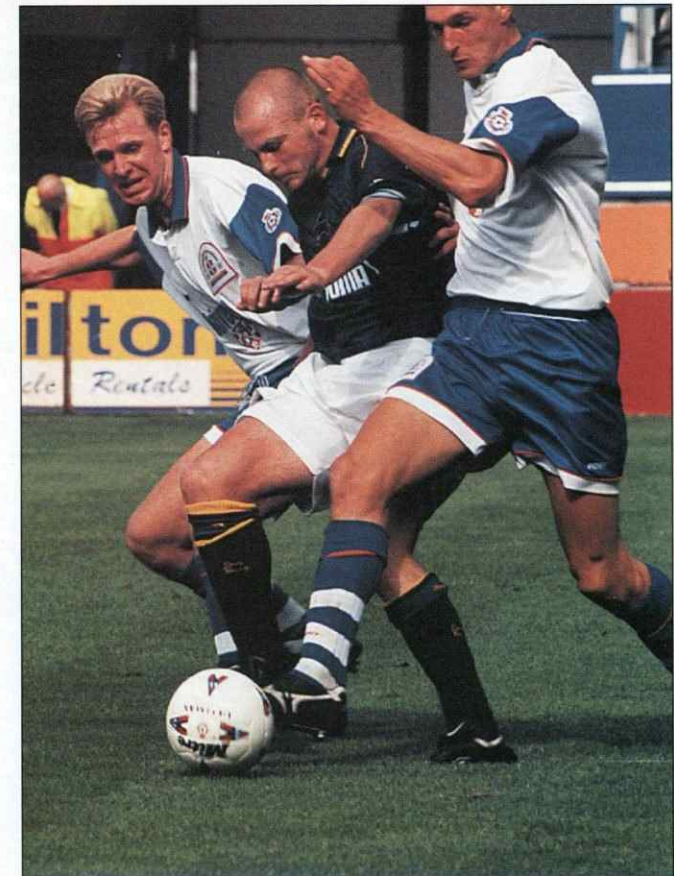

# Luton Town in the Anglo-Italian Cup 1973



THE Anglo-Italian Cup which was the brainchild of Gigi Peronace, an agent (in the nicest sense of the word) and Alan Hardaker, Secretary of the Football League, was set up in 1970 and included invited teams from Divisions One and Two in England and Serie A in Italy.

The initial competition was on a broadly similar basis to the one proposed this season and the first winners were Swindon Town who beat Napoli 3-0 in the final in Naples. Swindon were invited due to the fact that they were current holders of the Anglo-Italian League Cup Winners Cup (a not surprisingly short-lived competition) and they won the English Group after a series of amazing results including a home and away 'double' over Juventus!

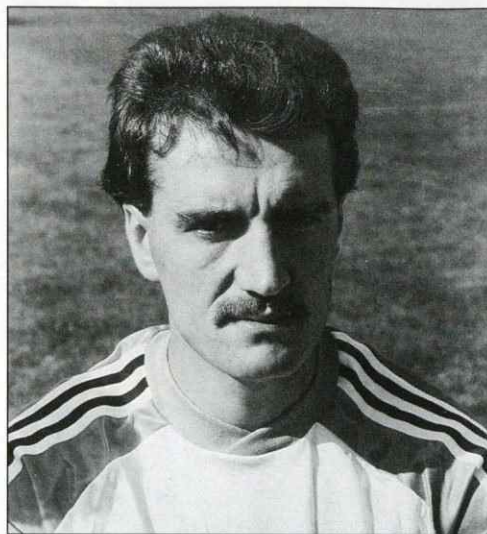
In 1971, Blackpool, who were then a rather better side than they are now, came out victorious beating Bologna in the final 2-1 after extra-time. The Seasiders won through to the final the following year but this time were beaten 3-1 by Roma in front of a crowd of 40,000 in the Olympic Stadium in Rome.

With Blackpool complaining that the competition was set too late in the season (their final against Roma was not played until June 24 in the blazing sun) and the Italians none too keen on the system whereby points were also awarded for goals scored, the 1973 competition was to show major changes.

Out went 'points for goals' and in came a series of games that started in the mud of February! There were to be two groups, each consisting of four English teams and four Italian with each English team playing four games against Italian opposition (as in this season). The top-placed English teams in each group would then play each other in a home and away semi-final before the winner would meet the victors of the Italian semi-final for the trophy.

Despite all these convoluted rules (remember this was 1973 when everything in the English game was much simpler), the Town were desperate to be included in the competition and were one of the first to put their names down when the Football League asked for volunteers.

The application was successful (along with teams such as Manchester United and

Newcastle) and Luton secretary Bob Readhead flew out to Milan in early February to watch the draw which paired the Town with Bari and Fiorentina at home, with trips to Verona and Lazio.

The date for the first game was two weeks after the draw but as the Town were still involved in the FA Cup the club's first venture into European competition had to be put back to March 7, when we were due to entertain Bari at Kenilworth Road.

A decision to increase admission prices by 50% "to watch top class teams" immediately upset the supporters who were not happy to pay £1.50 for a main stand seat or 60p to stand on the terraces.

"From a gate of 11,000 we take gross receipts of £5,000, whereas in Italy the average charge is £3," said secretary Readhead. "We are bringing top class Italian sides to Kenilworth Road and I think the increases are justified."

We did not know anything about this "top class" opposition called Bari in those far off days before 'Football Italia' on Channel Four, or even where it was and, not surprisingly, a crowd of only 4,518 turned up to see this historic occasion which the Town won at a canter.

Defender Don Shanks, moved into midfield for the match, was the Luton hero netting after 33 and 42 minutes with Bobby Thomson and John

Moore adding to the scoreline to complete the rout. In truth Bari were swept aside and although they were quite skilful going forward they found the Luton defence in a mean mood, and were unable to compete with the pace and strength of the English game.

The Town's second game in the competition, away at Verona, came only four days after the disappointing 2-0 defeat at Sunderland in the FA Cup quarter-final, and several players were rested following their previous week's exertions.

A crowd of only 1,000 was present in the 40,000 capacity Bentegodi Piazzale Olimpico Stadium in Verona to see the home side get off to a flying start when Busatta opened the scoring after only six minutes getting on the end of a fine flowing move, before hammering the ball past Luton goalkeeper Willie Carrick.

A spell of Luton pressure then brought about the equaliser when, after 19 minutes, Graham French expertly controlled a corner from John Aston before shooting past the goalkeeper as the Bari defenders looked on.

From then on the Italians drew 10 men back behind the ball if danger threatened and attacked the Town on the counter with the result that the Luton defence was caught exposed just after half-time, when Jacomuzzi dribbled through, drew out Carrick and scored with ease.

Try as they might the Town could not get back on terms and although they had two penalty appeals turned down late on the 2-1 score was probably a true reflection of the game.
