

"As far as that form is concerned it's very much a confidence thing, and perhaps Dwight Marshall's injury was the bit of luck Bontcho needed to get a run in the side."


A hamstring injury kept the Bulgarian on the sidelines at Leicester, but he could be fit to resume this afternoon.

Leaders Derby plan new stadium

FIRST Division leaders Derby County have announced plans to build a new 30,000 all-seater stadium ready for the start of the 1997/98 season.

The location for the new venue is the Pride Park area of the city - a 180-acre site close to the centre of Derby which was shortlisted as one of the four potential sites for the Millennium Exhibition.

The Rams, who are working in conjunction with Derby City Council, originally announced in August 1993 their intention to move from the Baseball Ground to a new stadium at Pride Park, but the club hit a stumbling block over the infrastructure required to service a new stadium.

But with ongoing work on access to Pride Park, the club's directors explored the site once again. Derby were on the brink of embarking on the second phase of the redevelopment at the Baseball Ground with the £4.5 million replacement of the ageing Main Stand.

Rams' vice-chairman, Peter Gadsby, commented: "We have experienced continuing difficulties with the redevelopment of the Baseball Ground.

"The directors have visited Middlesbrough's new Riverside Stadium and were very impressed, and it is similar in size and cost to the development we would like to see at Pride Park."





ASHLEY FICKLING - Defender who joined the Mariners on deadline day last season from Sheffield United.


JAMIE FORRESTER - Joined Leeds United from French side Auxerre in October 1992 for £60,000, and was a key member of Leeds' 1993 FA Youth Cup winning side. First-team chances were few at Elland Road, and he joined Grimsby in October 1995 on a free transfer.

PAUL GROVES - Midfielder who was a club record £150,000 signing from Blackpool in July 1992. Has been an ever-present in each of his three seasons at the club. (Continued on page 14).

PETER HANDYSIDE - Defender who made his Mariners debut in August 1992, and has become a regular choice for Scotland's Under-21 side.

KEVIN JOBLING - Made nine appearances for Leicester City before moving to Blundell Park in January 1988, becoming a regular choice during Grimsby's climb from Divisions Four to Two. Has now played over 200 games for the Mariners

JACK LESTER - A regular goalscorer in reserve team football, having earned a professional contract in 1994.

MARK LEVER - Defender who has progressed from the youth team at Blundell Park, and made his debut in September 1988. Has now made over 200 appearances, despite a two-year spell plagued by injuries.

STEVE LÍVINGSTONE - Completed his first full season at Blundell Park last term, following a £130,000 move from Chelsea in January 1994. First came to prominence as a teenage marksman with Coventry, before a move to Blackburn in 1991.

JOHN McDERMOTT - Defender who is now the club's longest-serving professional, after making his Grimsby debut in a second division match at Bradford City in 1987, going on to experience two relegations and two promotions by his early twenties.

CLIVE MENDONCA - A regular goalscorer for Grimsby since his £85,000 transfer from Sheffield United in 1992, injury and the effects of a car accident forced his absence for long spells last season.

JASON PEARCEY - Goalkeeper who became Brian Laws' first signing when he joined the club from Mansfield in December 1994 for a nominal fee.

GRAHAM RODGER - Central defender who earned an FA Cup winners' medal with Coventry in 1987, before moving to Luton in 1989.

Suffered with injury at Kenilworth Road, and moved to Grimsby in 1992. Born in Glasgow, but is an England Under-21 international.

CRAIG SHAKESPEARE - Former Walsall and

CRAIG SHAKESPEARE - Former Walsall and Sheffield Wednesday midfielder, who joined Grimsby from West Brom in 1993 for £115,000.

TOMMY WATSON - Midfielder who became the first Grimsby player to score in four separate divisions of the Football League following reorganisation in 1992.

NEIL WOODS - Leading scorer last season with 14 goals, who cost the Mariners £90,000 from Bradford in 1990, having previously played for Doncaster, Glasgow Rangers and Ipswich.

NICKY SOUTHALL - Midfielder who joined Grimsby from Hartlepool in July 1995 for £40,000.

IVANO BONETTI - Joined Grimsby on trial in September 1995, with supporters' fund-raising efforts making a permanent deal possible. Started his career with his home-town club Brescia, before signing for Genoa, and then moving to Juventus, Bologna and Sampdoria, amassing over 200 appearances in Serie A. Played for Sampdoria in the 1992 European Cup Final against Barcelona at Wembley.

VANCE WARNER - Central defender who is on loan at Grimsby from Nottingham Forest.

Meet the Manager



BRIAN LAWS was appointed Grimsby Town manager in November 1994, following Alan Buckley's move to West Brom.

Achieved great success as a defender with Nottingham Forest, from whom he joined the Mariners, winning an England B cap and League Cup medals in 1989 and 1990.

Also played for Burnley, Huddersfield and Middlesbrough.

His assistant at Blundell Park is another former Forest star, KENNY SWAIN, who gained managerial experience with Wigan Athletic

A Hatter and a Mariner

Despite his frail frame, MATT TEES was one of the finest headers of a ball to play for either Luton or Grimsby, and had that rare gift of being able to hang in the air while defenders were already on their way back down to the ground.


Tees, born near Glasgow in October 1939, played his early football for Airdrie on a part-time basis while working in a factory and was presumably glad of the chance when Grimsby stepped in with a £5,000 bid in July 1963.

His early career at Blundell Park was not particularly fruitful, but after the Mariners signing of Rodney Green (coincidentally also later to play for the Town) as a striking partner the goalscoring took off and he finished 1965/66 with 28 league goals to his credit.

A bid of £23,000 took Tees and Green to Charlton, where the former player enjoyed some success playing in Division Two and it came as a surprise when he was allowed to step down a division and join the Town in August 1969, for £25,000.

He made his debut at Gillingham alongside another new boy, Chris Nicholl, and soon became a firm favourite acting as a striking foil for Malcolm MacDonald.

In his first season he helped the Town to




promotion to Division Two, but early in the new campaign he lost his place to Don Givens and was allowed to move back to Grimsby in November 1970 for a cut price £5,000.

Matt Tees enjoyed a 'swan song' in his career when he helped Grimsby to the Division Four championship in 1972, before joining Boston a year later and then retiring from the game and returning to Grimsby, where he still lives and works. - ROGER WASH.



WE have been busy in the treatment room this week. trying to get three players back to match fitness for our forthcoming busy schedule of matches.

We suffered three injuries in the home game against Sheffield United, with Marvin Johnson and Scott Oakes forced to leave the field midway through the first half.

Marvin has a hamstring injury, and at the time of writing was unlikely to play this afternoon.

It is just soreness initially, and we have to wait a few days for it to settle down before finding out the full extent of the injury.





THE Town had started their eventually successful season of 1973/74 fairly slowly but, by the time the League Cup campaign got under way in early October, we were handily placed in fourth position in Division Two.

We were looking for a good run in the cup as, in the words of manager Harry Haslam, "winning is a good habit to get into and I have never believed in 'concentrating on the league'".

A good run in the League Cup would have been a novelty at the time however because, in the 13 years since the competition started, we had not advanced further than the fourth round, and that was was back in 1963. Things could only get better!

We were exempted until the second round because of our status, and our opponents were to be GrimsbyTown of Division Three, who had seen off Northampton in the previous stage of the competition.

In view of our league form we were not expected to have too many problems, and a crowd of 9,656 turned up on a wet, windy evening to see the tall Mariners defence soak up all the early pressure and then, using winger Frank Barton to good effect, create their own problems to the Luton rearguard.

The Town continued to hit aimless high balls forward and, with star forward John Aston bottled up, it looked increasingly likely that the away side would be the favourites to open the scoring

because of their incisive breakaways.

It came as a surprise, therefore, when the Town scored first after 20 minutes. Gordon Hindson, playing his first game of the season, took advantage of some panic and uncertainty in the Grimsby defence following a long Alan Garner throw-in to bury the ball in the back of the net.

For the rest of the game Grimsby adapted to the conditions rather better than the Town and with the minutes ticking away, and a Luton victory seeming sure, the press corps were getting ready with their 'Brave Mariners Sunk' headlines.

Out of the blue, and with only four minutes remaining, Grimsby's Lew Chatterley hit home a fierce volley to deservedly level the tie and take the Town back to one of their least favourite venues, Blundell Park.

The replay took place the following week, and in between times the Town had made hard work of seeing off Swindon at Kenilworth Road in the league, but had pushed themselves up to second position in the table.

A best-of-the-season crowd of 13,643 turned up at Blundell Park to see the Town have the better of the first half but fall away as the sheer determination of the underdogs forced them back.

Luton centre-forward Barry Butlin hit the bar with a header in the first period but that was the closest we came, as Barton had the ball in the net for the Mariners only to be penalised for a foul of goalkeeper Graham Horn.

In extra-time Grimsby had two efforts disallowed in the space of a minute by the linesman's flag as first Barton and Mick Hickman seemed to score perfectly good goals. Then Town defender John Ryan caught a through ball in spectacular fashion to prevent another Grimsby breakaway and was lucky to escape with only a booking! A certain red card offence today.

The game finished 0-0 at the end of extra-time and as penalty shoot-outs had yet to be introduced as a way of settling drawn ties, Luton chairman Robert Keens and his Grimsby counterpart tossed a coin for choice of venue for the third game. Keens lost!

The second replay took place on October 23, 1973, but this time in the league game the previous Saturday we had gone down to Orient in a top-of-the-table clash at Brisbane Road, and had dropped down the table a few places as a consequence.

And so it was a dejected squad that travelled to Grimsby, lucky to still be in the competition, and facing an even bigger crowd of 15,365.

Luton manager Harry Haslam decided to 'go for broke' and demanded that the players attack from the start, and his instructions paid immediate dividends as the Town went in at the interval 2-0 up.

Firstly, the recalled Tom Finney headed home an Aston cross in the 17th minute, and then centre-half John Faulkner effectively killed the tie by nodding in an Aston corner just before the break.

Grimsby tried frantically to get back on terms in the second period but sound defending and a superb performance from new signing from Burnley, Alan West, made sure that there would be no upsets.

The reward for this hard-earned victory was a home tie with Bury, another third division side, and again we made hard work of it eventually winning through in a replay at Gigg Lane.

Our dreams of Wembley ended in the fourth round with a Wednesday afternoon (three-day week, no floodlights) defeat at Millwall.



All Manager of the Month winners receive a specially-crafted silver owl trophy, the owl being Endsleigh's emblem, with the presentation to Lennie Lawrence due to take place before this afternoon's game.

The first leg of the final is due to be played at The Hawthorns on Tuesday.


