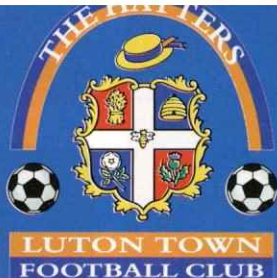
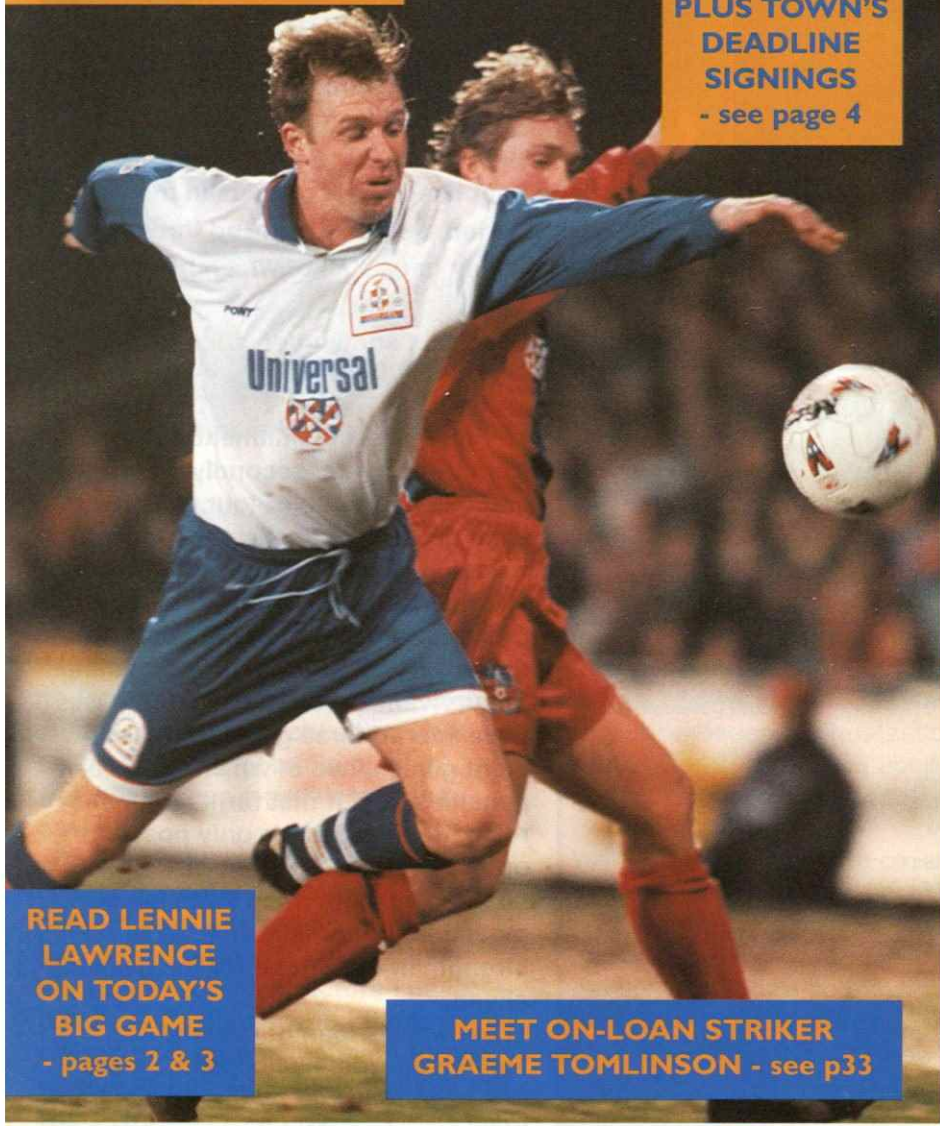

## NEW ARRIVALS CAN BOOST OUR FIGHT FOR DIVISION ONE SURVIVAL

IT seems a long time since our last home game against Crystal Palace at the start of this month, and fate has not been too kind to us in the intervening period, as we have faced three consecutive away games all of which have resulted in narrow defeats.

Much has been said and written about these games but they all have three things in common.

Firstly great commitment and spirit from the players, secondly creating and missing three or four chances in each game, and finally succumbing to a goal in unfortunate circumstances.

Nevertheless we find ourselves in a precarious position in the bottom three, yet still with a fighting chance of survival. The facts remain that we have scored three goals in the last eight games, two of which have been penalties, and if that form continues relegation can be the only possible outcome.

It is with this in mind that I have moved in the transfer market to strengthen our squad for the games ahead.

Last week's loan of Graeme Tomlinson from Manchester United has been followed by the loan of Paul Wilkinson from Middlesbrough, as well as the purchase of Kim Grant from Charlton, to add hopefully some much needed firepower to our team.

These extra players can also provide competition for places amongst the front players which has been sadly lacking.

With these signings, and in spite of the absence until the end of the season of Ceri Hughes and Dwight Marshall, we should now have greater competition for places in all departments of the team, and I shall no longer be concerned about the effects of many matches in a short space of time on certain players which has been a problem in the past.

Obviously in our current financial situation, to buy any player at this point in time was not an easy decision to arrive at, but thanks to the support of the directors I have purchased a player who I think will be a good long term investment for us, as well as hopefully helping us in the short term.

We have 10 games to go, five at home and five away, and obviously we need to win as soon as possible and today is our earliest opportunity.

I still believe that if we can get to the last fortnight of the season, during which we have five games to

play, and still be in touch with the teams outside the bottom three the job can still be done.

As I have said to the players, I have been in bigger scrapes than this and have managed to climb out of trouble, and what I need around me are smiling faces, enthusiastic and willing people, and good vocal support from the fans, especially in our home games.

We have suffered some cruel strokes of ill fortune in recent weeks and if we apply ourselves enough the tide will turn.

Finally, a welcome to Ipswich Town, their manager, players, officials and supporters. After a shaky start they have climbed up the table to a situation where they are challenging strongly for a play-off position.

But we need the points for an entirely different reason, and I ask you to get behind the team this afternoon and throughout a final month which is so crucial to the future of the club.

## Guentchev's Wembley bow, plus Town sign Grant & Wilko

TOWN striker Bontcho Guentchev made his Wembley debut on Wednesday evening, playing the second-half of Bulgaria's 1-0 defeat by England.

"For me personally it has always been a big ambition to play at Wembley," said Bontcho.

"England are strong, and they are one of the teams that Bulgaria really want to avoid in Euro 96."

As today's programme went to press, the Hatters were in the process of completing two signings.

Striker Kim Grant was set to join the Hatters from Charlton in a £250,000 deal.

The 23-year-old Ghanian-born striker is set to make his debut this afternoon.

Lennie Lawrence signed Grant as a schoolboy, trainee, and then professional at Charlton, and he scored on his debut against Wolves in 1991.

"It's a good signing for us, he has been in and out of Charlton's team in recent years, but has scored 10 goals in 24 games this season, and hopefully he can come here and do a job for us," Lennie Lawrence told ClubCall.

"It's a long term investment as well, but it pains me quite honestly, considering the financial situation of the club, to spend any money at all.

"But our situation warrants something being done and I think that's the most sensible course of action I can take."

Middlesbrough striker Paul Wilkinson was set to arrive on loan at Kenilworth Road, following Graeme Tomlinson's signing from Manchester United last week.

Wilkinson was signed by Lennie Lawrence for Middlesbrough, and has this season had loan spells at Oldham, playing here at Kenilworth Road in November, and at one of his former clubs Watford.

**JOHN WARK** - Now playing in a central defensive position, and has a player/coach role at Portman Road. Was a key figure in Ipswich's success under Bobby Robson, before moving to Liverpool from 1983-87. Rejoined Town, then moved to Middlesbrough for a year before returning to Portman Road for a third spell. Capped 29 times for Scotland.

**NEIL THOMPSON** - Formerly with Nottingham Forest and Hull, before joining Ipswich in 1989 for £100,000 from Scarborough, having helped the east coast club achieve league status.

**LEE CHAPMAN** - Much travelled striker who has spent part of this season back on loan at one of his former clubs Leeds United. Made his Ipswich debut against Chelsea in January last season.

**PAUL MASON** - Made his name with Groningen in Holland, where he spent five years, before moving to Aberdeen in 1988 for £250,000. Joined Ipswich for £400,000 in June 1993.

**GERAINT WILLIAMS** - Became Town's record buy when he joined the club from Derby in a £650,000 deal in July 1992. Welsh international who started his career at Bristol Rovers.

**TONY VAUGHAN** - Made his first team debut last season after progressing through the club's youth and reserve teams.

**CRAIG FORREST** - A former ice hockey player in his native Canada, is his country's first-choice goalkeeper. Made his debut for Ipswich in 1988, but has suffered with injuries this season.

**MICK STOCKWELL** - Joined the club in 1981, and is a versatile player who has featured in defence, midfield and up front as an emergency striker.

**IAN MARSHALL** - Started his career at Everton, and made his name with Oldham, both at centre-forward and centre-half for the Latics. Joined Ipswich for £750,000 in the summer of 1993, and has been a consistent goalscorer at Portman Road.

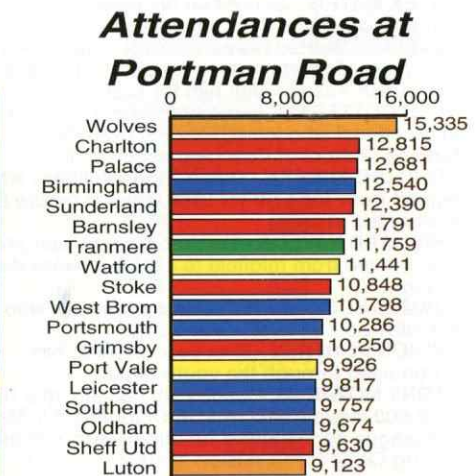
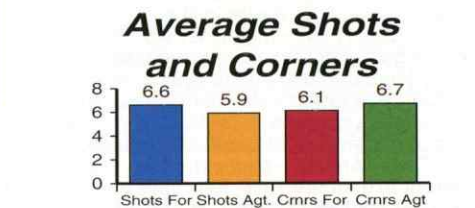
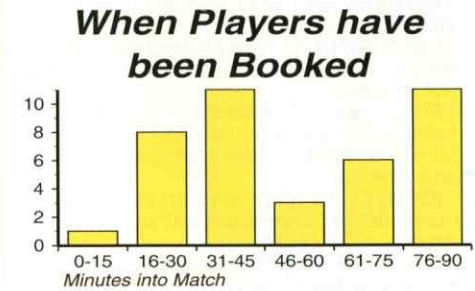
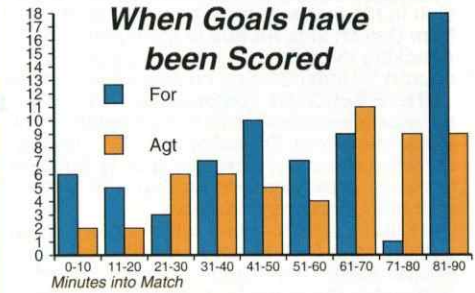

**CLAUS THOMSEN** - Finished top scorer for the club in his first season in England, after joining from Danish side Aarhus in the summer of 1994. Attacking midfielder who has skippered his country's Under-21 side on several occasions.

**STEVE SEDGLEY** - Defender or midfielder who became Ipswich's first £1 million signing when he joined them from Tottenham in 1994. Started his career at Coventry, where he won 11 England Under-21 caps. Has won FA Cup winners' medals with both Coventry and Spurs.

**CHRIS SWAILES** - Started his career at Ipswich, and returned to Portman Road after spells at Peterborough, non-league Bridlington, and Doncaster. Resigned for £150,000 from the latter, a fee which will rise to £225,000 depending on appearances.

**LEE NORFOLK** - New Zealand-born midfielder who made his debut for the first team in February last season.

**SIMON MILTON** - Midfielder who joined Ipswich from non-league Bury Town, and has established himself in the side after loan spells at Torquay and Exeter.

**KEVIN ELLIS** - Former youth team skipper who made his first team debut last season against Arsenal at Highbury.

**STUART SLATER** - England B and Under 21 international who started his career at West Ham before a £1.5 million move to Celtic. Returned to England with an £800,000 move to Ipswich.

**RICHARD WRIGHT** - England youth team keeper who was asked to train with the full England squad prior to this week's international against Bulgaria. Started last season as youth team keeper, and finished in the first team making his debut against Coventry in May.

**LEE DURRANT** - Midfielder who has progressed through the youth and reserve teams, making his first team debut in March 1994.

**NEIL GREGORY** - Born in Zambia, and a consistent goalscorer for the Town reserves side, earning a first team debut last season.

**ADAM TANNER** - Midfielder who scored on his debut in January 1995, following that up with the winner against Liverpool at Anfield.

**ALEX MATHIE** - Scored on his Ipswich debut last season after a £500,000 move from Newcastle. Started his career with Celtic, before moving to Morton where 31 goals in 74 games saw Kevin Keegan sign him for £285,000.

**LEO COTTERELL** - Former England Schools international who joined Ipswich from the National School of Coaching at Lilleshall.

**GUS UHLENBEEK** - Dutch winger/fullback who signed from Tops SV for £100,000 just before the start of the season.

**RICHARD NAYLOR** - Leeds-born first year pro, who moved from midfield to centre-forward last season.

**JAMES SCOWCROFT** - Local youngster who can play both in midfield or up front.

**SIMON PORTREY** - First year pro who has progressed through the youth ranks.

**TONY MOWBRAY** - Made club captain after his £300,000 move from Celtic in October 1995. Made 348 league appearances for Middlesbrough before joining Celtic for £1 million in 1991.

## Meet the Manager



**GEORGE BURLEY** joined Ipswich as an apprentice in 1972 and made his senior debut the following year against Manchester United at Old Trafford.

He was an integral part of the successful Town side in the late 70s and early 80s, tasting FA Cup glory in 1978 when Ipswich beat Arsenal.

He made over 500 appearances for the club, and was capped 11 times by Scotland.

In 1985 he started a mini-tour of Britain, with spells at Sunderland, Gillingham, Motherwell, Ayr, and Falkirk, before becoming player/manager at Colchester in June 1994. A fine start at Layer Road led him back to Ipswich, and he was appointed manager in December 1994.

## A Hatter and a Blue.....

**DAVID GEDDIS**, born in Carlisle in 1958, was picked up by the extensive Ipswich scouting system and signed on for the Portman Road club in 1975.

Finding difficulty in forcing his way past Ipswich forwards such as Trevor Whymark and Paul Mariner, Geddis was beginning to get a little frustrated until Luton manager Harry Haslam stepped in and brought him to Kenilworth Road on loan in February 1977.

The Town had just begun a run of straight wins that was to see them have sight of the leaders and Geddis played his full part becoming an instant crowd favourite.

Making his debut in a 2-1 win at Nottingham Forest as substitute he made a full appearance the following week, scoring in a 2-0 home victory over Blackburn. His most important goal, however, came a few weeks later during a home game against Oldham.

The Latics, in a bid to prevent the Town extending their run of straight wins to nine, quite blatantly came for a point and at the first sign of danger would boot the ball out of the ground.

The Town forwards were frustrated but when substitute David Geddis came on just before the end everyone received a lift and his winning goal was just reward for his enthusiasm.

We tried to sign Geddis but Ipswich manager Bobby Robson recalled him to Portman Road and played him as substitute in a couple of



meaningless end of season games. He was in and out of the Ipswich side the following season, although he did pick up an FA Cup winners medal, before he was transferred to Aston Villa in 1979.

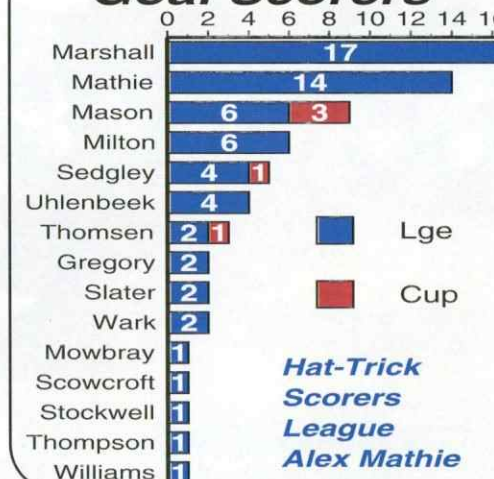
During his spell at Villa Park he was invited back to Kenilworth Road on loan in 1982, but after four games, where he failed to show his old spark, he was sent back and continued on a nomadic journey that took in Barnsley, Birmingham, Brentford, Shrewsbury, Swindon and Darlington.

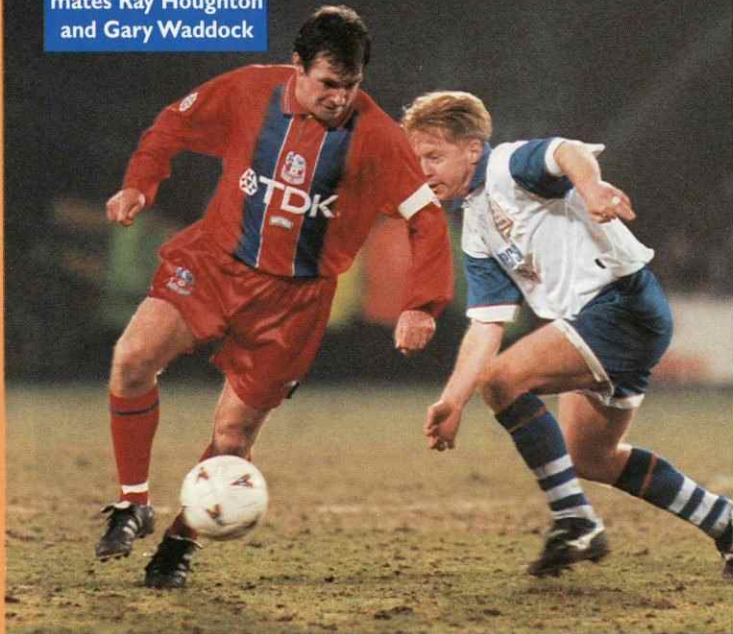

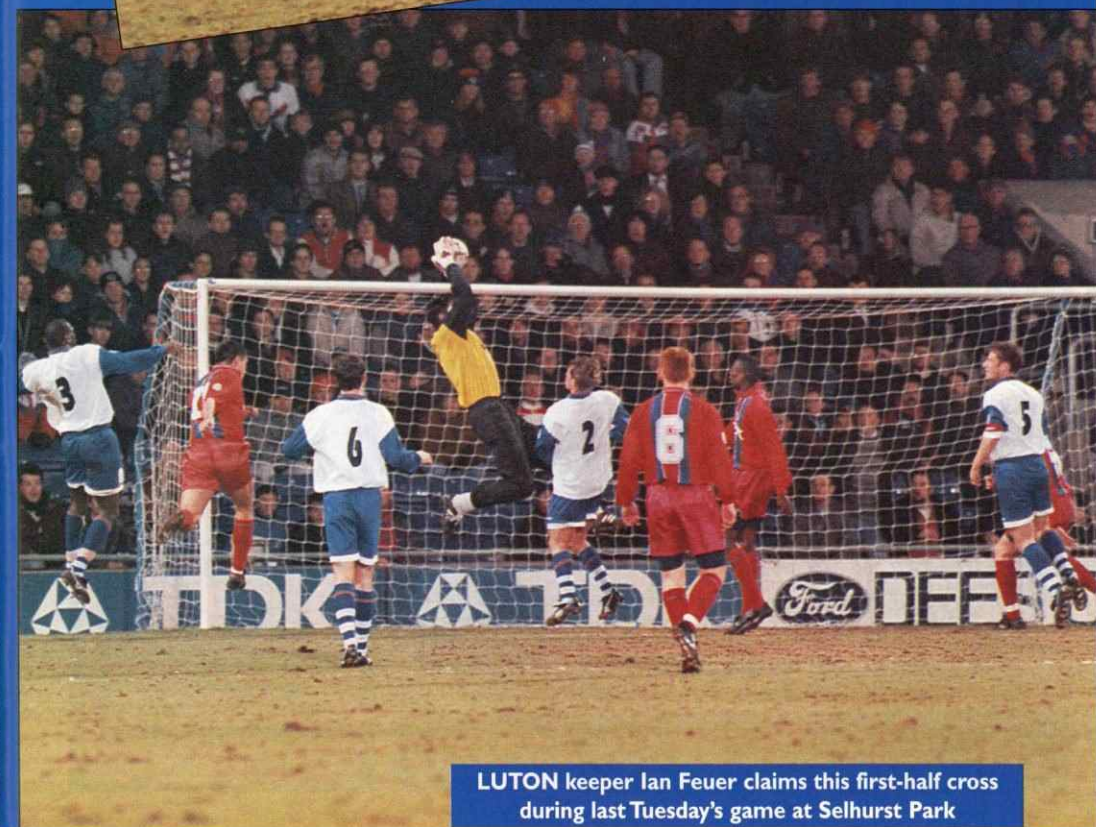

RECENT signings Johnny Vilstrup and Vidar Riseth are returning to Scandinavia on loan, as their country's domestic seasons resume after mid-winter breaks.

Vilstrup, who signed for the Hatters from Lyngby in September, has returned to Denmark, with Riseth, who arrived from Kongsvinger a month later, set to head back to Norway.

"In our current position we need people with experience of league football, and who know the situation, or if from abroad then someone who has been in this country a while."

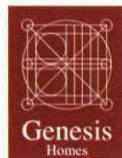

# Only visit number eight for the Blues!

## 5 YEARS AGO

30/3/91: Despite leading at half-time through a goal by Lars Elstrup, the Town went down 2-1 at Sheffield United in front of a crowd of 18,487.

## 10 YEARS AGO

29/3/86: A point gained from a 0-0 draw at Leicester kept us in eighth position in Division One. This game marked the last appearance of Andy King in his 'second coming'.

## 15 YEARS AGO

31/3/81: Another 0-0 draw, this time at Wrexham in front of a crowd of only 4,157. This was the second goalless draw in three days, and was another setback as the Town attempted to climb out of Division Two.

## 20 YEARS AGO

27/3/76: A John Ryan goal earned us a point in a 1-1 draw with Charlton at Kenilworth Road. Coincidentally this match was Andy King's last for the Town, first time around, before his transfer to Everton for a paltry £40,000

between the two sides. We did not play particularly well in the return at Ipswich over Christmas 1985, but still came away with a point following a 1-1 draw; Marc North scoring an equaliser in the closing minutes.

WE welcome Ipswich Town to Kenilworth Road this afternoon for what will be only their eighth visit in league competition stretching back over the last 40 years.

The first meeting between the two sides took place in August 1954 at Portman Road following Ipswich's promotion to Division Two.

Still riding on the crest of a wave Ipswich ran out 3-1 winners in front of a crowd of 20,265, although the press did make the point that the Hatters were unfortunate and that the Ipswich goalkeeper on four occasions "knew little about how the ball was kept out of the net" and that his Luton counterpart, Bernard Streten, was fouled in the lead up to one of the Ipswich goals.

By the time of the return, the following January, the promotion euphoria had worn off and Ipswich were struggling at the wrong end of the table while we were challenging for a promotion place that we eventually succeeded in winning.

Goals from Roy Davis, Bob Morton and George Cummins sealed the points in a 3-2 win, and it is interesting to note that one of the Ipswich goalscorers was Ted Phillips, who was to have a short spell at Kenilworth Road ten years later.

After the parting of the ways at the end of that season we did not meet again until 1960/61 following our relegation from Division One.

This time the boot was on the other foot with

Ipswich on their way to the Second Division championship while we had to be content with a mediocre mid-table position.

The season was not without its surprises however, with the Hatters achieving the 'double' over their Suffolk opponents starting with a 3-2 win at Kenilworth Road with goals coming from Alec Ashworth and Gordon Turner with two, in a game which marked the home debut for goalkeeper Jim Standen.

A solitary goal from the hardly prolific scorer Alwyn McGuffie was enough to win the points in the return game at Portman Road before an incredulous crowd of 21,744.

Another decade was to pass before the two sides were to meet up again, this time in Division One when we had a brief stopover in 1974/75.

Ipswich were far too powerful in the game at Kenilworth Road, winning at a canter 4-1 with the goals flying in from all angles, but the return on Boxing Day 1974 was a completely different story.

We had, quite frankly, struggled during the first half of that season and by Christmas were in a true position at the foot of the table, while Ipswich were clear at the top.

Ipswich piled on the pressure for the whole of the 90 minutes and only a mixture of woeful finishing and inspired defending kept the game scoreless until the final seconds when, in just about their only meaningful attack, the Luton

forwards combined to set up a chance for Ron Futcher, making his debut, to head home.

I have never seen so many cushions rain down on to a football pitch after a goal, either before or since. The locals were not amused!

Although we made an impressive effort to avoid relegation it was back down to Division Two at the end of the season, and another seven years were to pass before we were to meet again after our promotion back to the top flight in 1982.

The first meeting following our promotion took place on a wet, miserable day at Kenilworth Road in October 1982, when Ipswich, then at the peak of their powers, were very fortunate to return to Suffolk with a point following a 1-1 draw.

The Ipswich goal, scored by Alan Brazil, should have been disallowed because of offside, as proved conclusively on the television later.

There was no controversy in the game at Portman Road though, with the Hatters turned over 3-0 in a poor performance.

In the 1983/84 season we hit the heady heights of third position at Christmas but the second half of the campaign saw an alarming slide and by the time of Ipswich's visit to Kenilworth Road, in March 1984, we had only recorded one win since Boxing Day and the 2-1 victory was therefore most welcome.

Two goals from Trevor Aylott secured the win in front of a snow covered crowd of 8,776, but in the return, played a couple of weeks later, we were rolled over 3-0 again in a game marking the debut of Tim Breacker.

By the 1984/85 season Ipswich were beginning to lose the invincible look they displayed a few seasons earlier and this was typified when they allowed a poor Luton side to escape with a point in an early campaign clash.

When the teams met again, at Kenilworth Road in March, both were in the relegation area although we were showing firmer signs of pulling clear.

Two goals from Mick Harford and a single effort from Emeka Nwajiobi sealed an important win in front of a crowd inflated by seekers of FA Cup semi-final tickets.

Our final meetings, before this season, took place in 1985/86 with Ipswich dropping back into Division Two at the campaign's end.

By this time we were regarded as the team in the ascendancy, and an early season home win emphasised the gap that had appeared

## Fans give thumbs-up to Coca-Cola Cup

FOOTBALL fans across the country have confirmed their commitment to the Coca-Cola Cup competition by flocking through the turnstiles for this season's competition, say the Football League.

Last Sunday's final took the total attendance for this campaign's competition beyond the 1.75 million mark, an increase of 250,000 on last year's figure, providing a real testimony to the Coca-Cola Cup's enduring attraction.

And in keeping with their long-running policy for the game known as 'The People's Final', the Football League directed more than 75% of the tickets for the final to the supporters of the two competing finalists which represented 32,000 to each club.

Centre-half David Greene has spent the month on loan at second division Brentford.

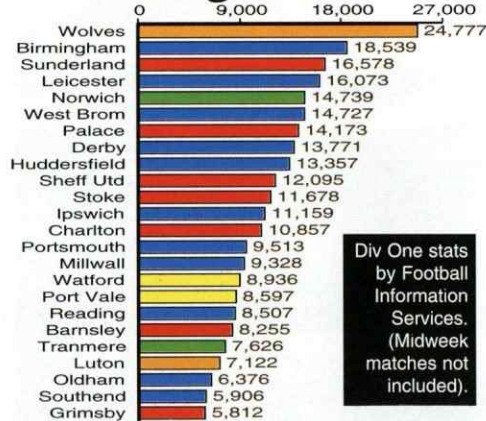
The Irish Under-21 international had just returned from a three-month loan spell at third division Colchester.

One of the Baldock scorers was former Luton midfielder Matthew Woolgar, who was released by the Hatters earlier this season.

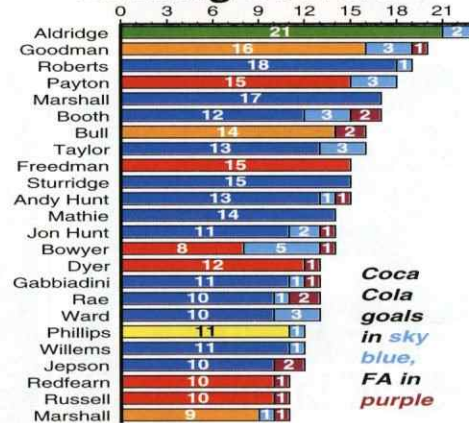


### Average Gates

In the event of any emergencies at Luton Town Football Club, the emergency services and the club have agreed on an evacuation policy which is designed to:

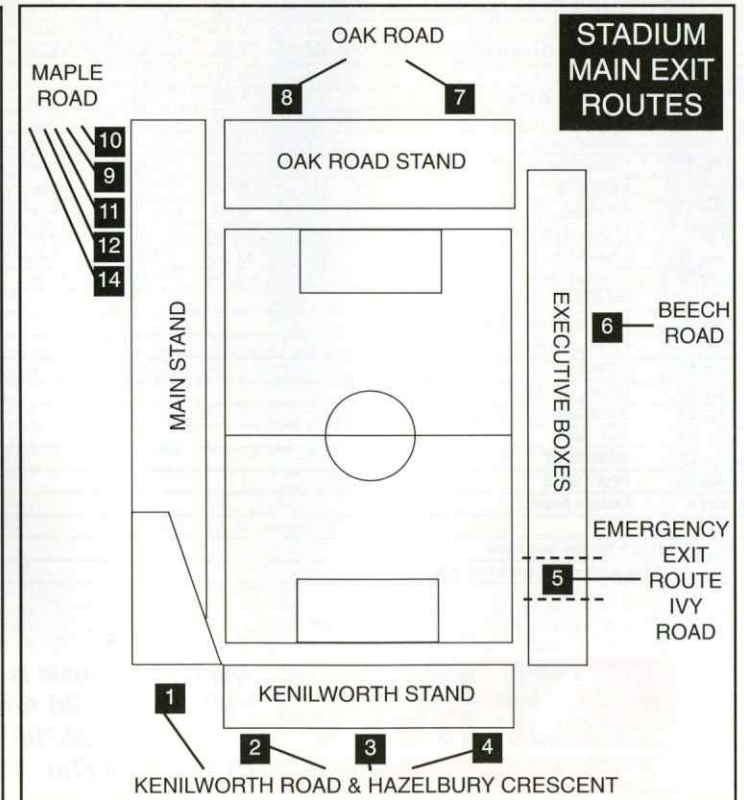
- Ensure the safe and controlled evacuation of the ground.
