



he struggle to keep our momentum going could leave a sour taste to what had been a tremendous season.

The recent Oldham game here was a non-event and although I felt last week's performance against Grimsby was lively enough, the Tranmere match last Saturday was again a poor affair.

It was a typical end of season contest and I have to admit we did not give value for money.

Tranmere passed the ball better than us without it really hurting. All the play was in front of us and I could not see them threatening too much with just the one man up front. We have come up against a lot of problems against sides who play with three against our two in midfield but it is up to us to gain the ascendancy and force them to change their formation.

GRATEFUL

It didn't help either that we gave away what was a poor goal against Tranmere so we were grateful to Tony Naylor for salvaging a point.

The players have been reminded in no uncertain terms that they have a responsibility to entertain the paying customer to give them optimism for next season.

Port Vale, apparently, have not finished higher than eighth at this level of football since 1934 so that at least should give us some incentive for the remaining games.

It is my intention to introduce one or two fresh faces but we still want to win matches; we also have to bear in mind that teams like Luton are striving to get out of trouble.

Their manager Lennie Lawrence worked miracles in often keeping Charlton afloat and Luton will still be hoping he can do the same with them.

It is remarkable how fortunes have changed in the First

Division this season. For example, when we were BOTTOM with 14 points from 19 games Millwall were TOP; now they, too, have a fight on their hands even though they reached the normal safety margin of 50 points. Compare that to last season when four teams went down and 48 points were enough.

good season against play-off seekers Charlton next Saturday.



onsidering that the season has only twelve days to run, it is unusual that tonight's game is the first meeting of the season for the Vale and Luton Town.

Luton are currently desperate for points to avoid relegation to the Second Division and prior to last Saturday's game against Watford had only one victory to show from their previous 12 outings.

Away from home they have four wins to their credit, at Southend (1-0), Ipswich (1-0), Norwich (1-0) and West Brom (2-0), six draws, at Grimsby (0-0), Wolves (0-0), Watford (1-1), Leicester (1-1), Derby (1-1) and Charlton (1-1), whilst losing on eleven occasions, at Reading (1-3), Millwall (0-1), Tranmere (0-1), Stoke (0-5), Barnsley (0-1), Portsmouth (0-4), Sunderland (0-1), Huddersfield (0-1), Crystal Palace (0-2), Sheffield United (0-1) and Birmingham (0-4).

In the F.A. Cup they lost 7-1 at Grimsby in the Third Round whilst in the Coca-Cola Cup they went out at the Second Round stage to Bournemouth. They also competed in the Anglo-Italian Cup, being in the same preliminary group as ourselves but lost their first three games before thrashing Ancona 5-0 at Kenilworth Road.

Dwight Marshall is their leading scorer with 13 in all competitions but a broken leg has prevented him from

competing in the run-in to the end of the season. Recent signing Kim Grant, who cost £250,000 from Charlton has made a good start with three goals to his credit already.

Last season Luton did the double over the Vale, the aforementioned Marshall scoring the only goal of the game here at Vale Park whilst in the return Luton won 2-1, with Telfer and Dixon (now Watford) on the mark for the home side. Andy Porter scored the Vale consolation.

Vale haven't met Luton too often over recent years, last season's league encounters being the first since 1967-68 and for the Vale's last victory you have to go back to November 1966 when Mick Mahon notched the games only goal here at Vale Park.

The two teams met in the third round of the F.A. Cup in the 1973-74 season and only a late equaliser prevented Vale from winning the game at Vale Park after Dave Harris had given us the lead. In those days there was a power crisis which prevented the use of floodlights and so the replay took place on a Wednesday afternoon.

Vale actually led 2-1 at one stage thanks to goals from Bob Mountford and John Woodward but Luton eventually won 4-2 with two goals in the last four minutes.

THE MAN IN CHARGE - LENNIE LAWRENCE

Born - 14th December 1947 in Brighton Managerial Career

Lennie took over at Luton last December with the task of enhancing his 'Houdini' reputation by trying to save the club from relegation.

A good friend of our own manager John Rudge, he began his managerial career with a short spell at Plymouth in 1978 and was the assistant manager at Lincoln City when they were promoted from Division Four in 1981. In 1982 he took over at Charlton Athletic and despite the problems of having to groundshare at Selhurst Park he took them to promotion to the old First Division in 1986 and a year later led them out at Wembley in the Simod Cup Final (which they lost).

Despite some narrow escapes, they survived in the top flight until 1990 and a year later Lennie moved on to Middlesbrough. In his first season he took them to promotion to the Premier League but they had not got the finance that they have available nowadays and the club were immediately relegated. In 1994 he took over at Bradford City but parted company with them earlier this season.

PLAYING CAREER

One of the few managers never to have played league football, Lennie spent his playing days with non-league outfits, Croydon, Carshalton Athletic and

Goalkeeper lan Feuer, who stands 6ft 7in tall, was born in Las Vegas and joined the Hatters from West Ham in December, 1995 for a fee which could rise to £580,000 depending on appearances. At Upton Park he was understudy to Ludek Miklosko and never played a first team game. His league debut was while on loan to Peterborough in 1994-95 playing 16 games in Division Two. Spotted by West Ham playing in Belgium, although he was signed from Los Angeles Salsa.

Defender/midfielder Graham Alexander was former manager Terry Westley's first recruit last July, joining from Scunthorpe for £100,000 having been watched by the scouting staff for two years.

Former England under 21 international Mitchell Thomas is Luton born and made over 100 appearances for his home town club before moving to Spurs shortly after David Pleat in 1986. He played in the 1987 FA Cup final and later moved

to West Ham. Returned to Luton on loan in the 1993-94 season before a free transfer.

Defender Richard Harvey resurrected his career in 1994-95 after two years plagued

by injury. The former England youth international missed the entire 1993-94 campaign following a cruciate ligament operation. His appearance at home to Watford in March, 1995 was his first at Kenilworth Road for three years and he held the left back spot for the remainder of that season. Wembley born Marvin Johnson made his Football League debut against Wimbledon in 1988 and quickly established himself as a versatile defender. Started last season at left back but then switched to the heart of defence, he was one of only three players to appear in every first team match last term and was awarded the players' player of the year trophy.

Irishman Darren Patterson joined Luton from Crystal Palace last August for £150,000, a fee which could rise to over £200,000 based on appearances. The Northern Ireland

international started his career with Wigan and moved to Palace for £250,000 in 1992. Made his Luton debut in the Anglo-Italian Cup defeat in Cesena

last November.

Seasoned midfielder Gary Waddock, 34, completed a free transfer from Bristol Rovers in December, 1994 after three months on loan. Started his career with

Moved to Belgium with Charleroi as he recovered from a serious knee injury and also had spells at Millwall, OPR again and Swindon before joining the Bristol club. Talented Scott Oakes ioined Luton from Leicester in October 1991 and his performances in the 1994 FA Cup run attracted much interest from Premiership clubs until he signed a new contract. The England under 21 international was Luton's leading scorer that season and he scored 10 last term. Missed the opening two months of this campaign with a

hamstring injury.

Tony Thorpe made an immediate impact when he scored on his full debut at Newcastle in the fourth round of the FA Cup in January 1994.

Started with his local club Leicester and joined Luton at the start of the 1992-93 season.

Australian David
Oldfield returned to
Kenilworth Road last

summer from Leicester for £150,00 six years after leaving Luton. Started his career with the Hatters, progressing through the junior ranks and made his full league debut in May 1988. Capped by England at under

21 level, he joined Manchester City for £600,000 in March 1989 before transferring to Leicester.

Striker John Taylor joined on deadline day last season for £200,000 from Bradford City having started his career at Colchester.

Was later snapped up by Cambridge via non league Sudbury and scored 46 goals in 176 outings, moved to Bristol Rovers and netted 44 goals in 95 games. Had scored 13 for Bradford prior to his switch to Luton but struggled with a back injury at the start of this season, requiring an operation that ruled him out until Christmas.


Newcomer Kim Grant cost Luton £250,000 when signed from Charlton just before last month's transfer deadline. Born in Ghana, he made his League debut for Charlton in the 1990-91 season and spent five years with the London club. Bulgarian international Bontcho Guentchev, 31, recently appeared against England at Wembley. He joined the Hatters on a free transfer from Ipswich last July,

having played in the 1994

World Cup finals in the USA where Bulagaria reached the semi finals. Had been at Ipswich for three seasons in which time he played 58 games in the Premiership.

CHELSEA V PORT VALE Saturday 24th November 1928

Although 1928-29 proved to be a relegation season, the Valiants were running up one or two telling results by the time they made their

to Stamford Bridge for this second division encounter. They had defeated Barnsley at the Recreation Ground the week before by the three goals without

Wilf Kirkham was finding the back of the net with regularity and he did not disappoint the Vale fans who travelled to Chelsea to witness a 3-3 draw. Jack Simms was Port Vales other marksman.

This was a tremendous result for the Valiants, and a thrilling match for the crowd of 23,305, which turned out to be the largest attendance to watch the vale throughout the season.

Post Vale spent just one season in the Third Division (North) before bouncing to division two as champions.

Port Vale lined up as follows: Prince, Shenton, Briscoe, Smith, Connelly, Rouse, Mandley, Page, Kirkham, Gillespie, Simms.

Stoke City v Port Vale

Monday 27th April 1936 As the result of a public meeting called to discuss the precarious nature of the Clubs finances, it was decided that Port Vale should embark upon a 40,000 shillings appeal to bolster the clubs coffers. The appeal was quite a success, the highlight being a friendly game against Stoke City at the Victoria Ground. Between eight and nine thousand fans helped raise £528 for the Vale. Nottingham Forest also sent a cheque for £25 for good measure.

Prior to the game's commencement four jazz bands marched to the Victoria Ground from the Recreation Ground to add to the occasion.


The Lady Mayoress, Mrs J H Dale kicked

off a game which ended 2-3 to Stoke City, whose goals were scored by Welland, Mathews and Steele. Vale had been three goals down at one stage, until Caldwell and Dean pulled two back. The game over the Lord Mayor, Alderman J H Dale, entertained officials and players to dinner. This event went a long way to keeping this club afloat at a difficult period in its history.

ICARAGE ROAD, Watford does not rate as one of my all-time favourite grounds. In fact, I hate the place.

Don't get me wrong. I have nothing against the stadium itself. In fact, I think that three sides are as good as anything in the League and there ends an object lesson to us all. No complaints, either, that the car park is behind some allotments a mile from the ground (the very same car park Elton John was forced to use for the recent game against Portsmouth, causing him to storm from the ground half an hour

before full-time). The hospitality before, during and after the game is excellent.

No, what I really hate about Watford is the fact that whenever we play there the game end in heartbreak, despair and misery.

The last occasion we won at Vicarage Road was on May 18th, 1962 when goals by Richard and Wright gave us a 2-0 victory. I have to admit that even as a keen, 3 year-old supporter I missed that game but have Watford made us suffer since?

SCRAPE

Watford really began to blight my life during the 1968-69 season when they put an end to what in those days was our stupendous FA Cup run. We had won replays against Shrewsbury and Workington before losing at Vicarage Road. During season 1972-73 I really thought we would bring home the points when Sammy Morgan shot us ahead only for Watford to scrape a late equaliser. The following two seasons yielded single goal defeats before meetings were suspended until season 1987-88. That was the season of our famous FA Cup run in which we defeated Tottenham only to finally taste defeat at - yes, you've guessed it, - Watford in a fifth round replay.

Our first season back in the old Second Division (1989-90) saw a 1-0 defeat at Vicarage Road, while the following season we had a midday kick-off on Boxing Day which ruined many Vale fans'

festivities, combined with a 1-2 defeat in which Rod Thomas's winner was scored in injury time. For good measure Nicky Cross damaged knee ligaments and was out for 12 months. Merry Christmas!

Season 1991-92 provided a rare point at Vicarage Road in a dismal goalless draw. We were in the midst of a run of 18 games without a win and the last team we had beaten was - Watford at Vale Park! Even our joy at this rare point was tempered when we were relegated that season.

The ecstacy of being back in the new First Division last season was slightly subdued by the apprehension of a visit to Vicarage Road and the hoodoo did not disappoint us on a bitterly cold New Year's eve afternoon.



After going I-0 up, Kevin Kent then hit the underside of the bar with a shot that on any other ground in Britain would have been nestling in the back of the net.


True to form we then went I-2 down before storming back to 2-2 and then, with minutes left, Peter Billing hit the inside of a post with a tremendous free kick that incredibly spun away from goal instead of towards it.


Just to emphasise we were playing at Vicarage Road, Dean Glover was stretchered off and was to be out for three months and deep, deep into added time Watford won the game. Happy New Year.

So to our most recent visit a week or so ago. Could the horrors of Vicarage Road continue with Watford anchored at the foot of the table? Of course they could.

With no disrespect to Graham Taylor's troops when I say that I hope it is a long time before we visit Vicarage Road again. I used to have similar fears about going to Fellows Park, Walsall and Springfield Part, Wigan but in later years those ghosts were exorcised.

To expect anything more you'd have to be as mad as a bucket. Might as well plan a romance with Cindy Crawford." Ed Horton's account of the involvement of the Maxwell family in Oxford United is equally rivetting. Read it and weep!

DREAMS

The best footie book I've read in a long time is Gerry Nelson's "Left Foot Forward". The Charlton forward kept a diary of last season, assuming (incorrently as it happened) it would be his last in league football.

It is a wonderful behind the scenes look at life of a professional footballer, not a Cantona or a Shearer, just an honest hard working pro who is attempting to make the best of his talent. It's worth reading if only for his description of his time at Swindon under Lou Macari! If really desperate for a Vale "fix" you can get a copy of Jeff Kent's Port Vale: A Complete Record" from the club shop and relive some of your most wonderful moments by scanning the pages - the 6-0 win at Fulham, the Wembley trips, Andy Jones's five goals against Newport and if you go back that far, the '53-54 season. You might even like to try writing something yourself - possibly for next season's programme. Mr Harper, the editor, has been known to pay huge sums for such contributions, in your dreams!





Whilst the Blues' programme contains 48 pages it is disappointing that almost half of these contain advertising. As with many First Division club programmes this season once you have taken away the advertising, commercial and marketing news there is little left. Indeed, the Birmingham publication is no different - in this programme at one place there are seven consecutive full-pages of advertisements.

In his column, Barry Fry pays tribute to John Rudge by saying "John has worked miracles year in year out in his 15 year reign at the club, one more this year when two months ago Vale looked certs for relegation. But after a fantastic run they have shot up the table and now look a great bet for the play-offs.

They have already had a super season and if they did get into the Premiership then I am sure everybody would be pleased for John. Vale splashed out on two wingers, Jon McCarthy and Steve Guppy, spending almost £800,000 and along with the rest of an excellent team that consists of a good blend of youth and experience, they are a real force to be reckoned with.

John Rudge must surely be one of the favourites for the coveted Manager of the Year award.

From the statistics page it is really evident the extent to which Barry Fry as swapped the team round this season. Already he has used a staggering 46 different players. Whilst recently people like Paul Devlon, Martin Grainger and Andy Legg have been brought in, others like Ken Charlery and Steve Claridge are long gone. Indeed, upto the publication of the Birmingham programme an amazing 22 different players had made their first team debut for the Blues.

Barry Fry also likes to involve all his substitutes whenever he can. On 37 occasions he has used all three substitutes. He has only on one occasion not used any substitutes at all. This was when Birmingham lost 3-2 at Wolves, conceding two goals in the last two minutes. It is also interesting to note from the statistics page that Barry Fry also uses 'outfield' players as substitutes and never names a second goalkeeper in his squad of fourteen.
