




FRONT COVER: Kim Grant takes on the Watford defence during last saturday's 0-0 draw at Kenilworth Road.

Some chances were created, but it looks as though we may be up against the Hornets again next season.

Following on from the Watford game, the players attended the Loyal Luton Supporters' presentation evening on Sunday, with Ian Feuer a deserved winner of their Player of the Year Award.

It was an enjoyable evening, and tomorrow we attend the Supporters' Club event, when the Players' Player of the Year is among the awards to be handed

out.

Hopefully there will be something to smile about after today's game, as we welcome back Darren Patterson and Bontcho Guentchev from midweek international duty.

EURO 96 NEWS UPDATE

Football 'Embassies' are one-stop centres for fans

WITH Euro 96 only a few weeks away, The Football Supporters Association's plans for the tournament are now in place.

The key element is the establishment of a 'Football Embassy' in the centre of each of the eight host cities.

The 'Embassies', an expansion of similar successful ventures the FSA undertook at both Italia 90 and Euro 92 in Scandinavia, will act as a one-stop centre for fans to gain help and guidance on travel, tickets, accommodation, Euro 96 cultural and sporting events - indeed any and everything that crops up during the tournament.

The Football 'Embassies' will be stocked with a wealth of leaflets and other information to help fans make the most of Euro 96.

The 'Embassies' will provide a venue and a means by which officials involved in different aspects of the tournament organisation (such as the FA, local council staff, transport officials, campsite and accommodation owners) can meet FSA representatives and discuss issues and problems as they arise. They will also be a crucial point of contact for the media so they will be keen to hear from fans who can tell them what's happening, where and why.

Finally, the FSA will be asking fans for their tales and photos of Euro 96 for inclusion in a book of the same, that they are planning to publish early next season.

Profits from the book will be split 50/50 between the FSA and the St John Ambulance Service (their chosen charity for the Finals).





LEE BUTLER - Goalkeeper who had spells at Lincoln, Aston Villa and Hull, before joining Barnsley for £215,000 in July 1991.

DAVID WATSON - Goalkeeper who has won England honours at Under 19 and 21 levels, having joined the club as an associated schoolboy. Established himself as the Tykes' first-choice keeper last season, and is one of the most highly-rated young keepers in the country.

CHARLIE BISHOP - Joined Barnsley from Bury in July 1991 for £90,000, but is currently back in Lancashire on loan at Burnley.

STEVE DAVIS - Started his career at Stoke, moving to Crewe and then on to Burnley, before joining the Oakwell club. Former England youth international defender, currently ruled out through injury.

NICKY EADEN - Defender who joined the club as a schoolboy, and established himself in the first team in the 1993/94 season.

GARY FLEMING - His move to Oakwell in March 1990 for £65,000 was the second time former Barnsley boss Mel Machin had signed the Northern Ireland international. Machin had signed him for £150,000 from Nottingham Forest for Manchester City during his spell in charge at Maine Road.

ADRIAN MOSES - Defender who made his league debut in last season's 3-1 win over Luton at Oakwell.


OWEN ARCHDEACON - Glaswegian who joined Celtic from school and won two championship medals whilst at Parkhead. Joined Barnsley in June 1989 for £80,000, but injury restricted him to just 12 appearances last season.

MARTIN BULLOCK - Joined Barnsley for £15,000 from non-league Eastwood Town in September 1993, establishing himself in the Tykes' midfield last season.

ABOVE: Barnsley keeper David Watson, pictured during November's match at Oakwell



BARNSLEY 1995/96

BRENDAN O'CONNELL - Made his Football League debut with Exeter, before moving north to Burnley. Joined the Oakwell club in March 1990 for £45,000 and was voted Supporters Player of the Year in season 1990/91.

NEIL REDFEARN - Team captain who started his career at Nottingham Forest, before moving to Bolton in 1982. Moves to Lincoln, Doncaster, Crystal Palace and Watford followed, before he joined Oldham for £150,000 in January 1990. He joined Barnsley on loan in September 1991 and the move became permanent the following month for a fee of £180,000. Has been a virtual everpresent for the last four seasons, and scored the winner in November's 1-0 win over Luton at Oakwell.

DARREN SHERIDAN - Midfielder who, like his brother John, started his career at Leeds, but was released after a two-year traineeship. Barnsley signed him from non-league football and he became a regular last season.

GLYNN HURST - Born in Barnsley, but emigrated to South Africa aged just six years old. Was spotted by Tottenham playing for an Under 16 side in South Africa, and returned to England. After his Youth training programme at Spurs, he joined his home town club.

CHRIS JACKSON - Former England Schoolboy international forward who made his first team debut in 1992/93. Suffered serious injuries in a car accident in the autumn.

ANDY LIDDELL - Scottish Under 21 international who joined the club as a schoolboy, and established himself as a first-team regular last season.

ANDY PAYTON - Arrived at Oakwell in November 1993 from Celtic in a part exchange deal which took Wayne Biggins to Scotland; Payton being valued at just over £300,000. Formerly with Hull and Middlesbrough, and was Barnsley's leading scorer during the 93/94 season with 13. Bagged 12 last season.

DAVE REGIS - Striker who joined Barnsley last month from Southend, in an exchange deal which saw Andy Rammell move to Roots Hall. Regis started his career with Notts County, and has since played for Plymouth, Bournemouth, Stoke and Birmingham.



After eventual relegation Paul continued to give excellent service in the heart of the Luton defence and the big clubs began to sniff around.




After a short spell at Derby, Futcher was on his way again in March 1984 to Barnsley, where he had the longest stay of his career to date.



Rioch's rocket sets up five-goal blast

AFTER the Town won promotion from Division Four with style in 1968, Kenilworth Road was a hive of activity the following close season with new directors Tony Hunt and Reggie Burr making £100,000 available to be spent on the playing squad as well as the ground and facilities

The money was spent in double-quick time with half immediately going on ground improvements including plastic seats to replace the old wooden benches in the main stand, and the first of what is now the group of buildings that includes the Eric Morecambe lounge.

Of more interest to Luton supporters was the strengthening of the playing squad and big money, by third division standards, was spent on Mike Harrison from Plymouth, Laurie Sheffield from Oldham, and Brian Lewis from Coventry.

There was now competition in all positions and with youngsters coming through from a revitalised youth set-up the future looked rosy.

The optimism off the pitch spread to the playing side and some impressive pre-season results added to the general euphoria around Kenilworth Road.

Second division Oxford were seen off 3-0 at Kenilworth Road, while a fighting 2-2 draw at Norwich, also of Division Two, gave ample evidence that we had nothing to fear from our new higher status.

Despite all this we needed to see the proof in

proper competitive action and the first game of the new campaign saw Oldham visit Kenilworth Road on a hot, sunny August afternoon, in front of a shirt-sleeved crowd of 14,747.

They were not disappointed as the new-look side gelled immediately with Harrison and Lewis on the scoresheet, along with old favourites Fred Jardine and Keith Allen, in a 4-0 win which could have been a lot more.

The next visitors to Kenilworth Road were old enemies Watford, in a midweek League Cup tie, and a crowd of 20,167 saw Harrison, with two, and Lewis score in an emphatic win to please new supporter Eric Morecambe. Watford manager Ken Furphy was not so pleased, saying: "It is impossible to play football at such a small ground."

After a hardfought 0-0 draw at Barrow the following week it was the turn of Tommy Docherty's Rotherham to visit Kenilworth Road and another large crowd was present to see Bruce Rioch put the Town two-up in the first 15 minutes.

Rotherham, relegated the previous season, fought back to halve the deficit, but Lewis scored a third just before the break and that is how the score remained as the Town went top of the first league table of the campaign.

Four days later the Town were at home again, this time to Barnsley who had followed us out of Division Four the previous season. On a wet evening that guaranteed a greasy surface a crowd of 15,899 gathered to see the team extend its lead at the top of the table still further.

The game turned out to be an absorbing clash of styles with the Town's use of the long ball pitted against the short passing game of Barnsley.

Due to the wet pitch the slick passing movements of the Tykes looked likely to embarrass the Town's defence but after weathering the early storm a goal out of the blue from 'wonder boy' Rioch turned the game on its head

Collecting the ball in his own half, Rioch surged forward and, with the Barnsley defenders backing off, advanced into the penalty area before unleashing a rocket shot that gave Brian Arblaster in the Tykes' goal no chance.

"Rioch for England" chanted the crowd, little knowing that he would eventually captain Scotland!

Barnsley refused to lie down and the Luton goal came under a fair bit of pressure before Town skipper Terry Branston headed home a Graham French corner after 28 minutes.

The scoreline was extended even further when Lewis took advantage of another accurate French corner five minutes later, and the half ended with the Luton forward line in full flow against a beleaguered Barnsley defence.

The Town started the second period as they had ended the first but it was Barnsley who drew first blood when Bob Earnshaw, who was played onside by a hesitant Town defence, netted in the 51st minute. The goal was just reward for the enterprising play of the Barnsley forwards.

The Town's three goal advantage was restored though a few minutes later when Lewis blasted the ball home, after Harrison touched a free kick to him, and the night was complete when Keith Allen hit another rocket into the top corner of the net.

This was a happy time to be a Luton supporter and the month of August 1968 was seen out in style when we went to Gillingham on the following Saturday and returned with a 3-1 win to go two points clear at the top.



Pilgrims announce new stadium move

THIRD division Plymouth Argyle have teamed up with their local council to announce a £25 million scheme to create a state-of-the-art stadium in the Central Park area of the city.

The Devon club's 23,000 all-seater development will be ready for action by April 1999 and will also be able to boast the highest quality sports, leisure and entertainment facilities within the design.

The Central Park stadium will be built adjacent to the Pilgrims' current Home Park venue and in addition to the seating capacity will cater for an extra 37,000 people standing which could attract the biggest pop bands in the world.

An extensive sports centre will be built under one of the two-tier stands and will allow the new development to host basketball, badminton, tennis, netball and indoor bowls events. A golf driving range, international standard cross-country course, outdoor floodlit all-weather facilities and car parking will also be incorporated into the

Argyle Vice-Chairman Peter Bloom explained: "Football, however, is the first priority and the target is to get Plymouth playing at the highest level. This is a tremendous step forward for the city and potentially for the whole of the West.

"Accommodating football fans is our first consideration and with getting use out of the new stadium every night, instead of just once a fortnight, we will be able to keep admission prices down."

Meanwhile, Burnley opened the first phase of redevelopment at Turf Moor on Tuesday with a new two-tier stand seating 8,600 fans.

Work on the construction of the second part of redevelopment has already started and will see the Beehole End enclosure reduced to rubble, to be replaced by a 6,000 seater East Stand bringing Turf Moor's all-seater capacity to 21,943 for the start of the 1996/97 season.

A REMINDER that the Football League have agreed theat the Endsleigh League First Division programme for the final Saturday of the season will be moved back 24 hours to Sunday May 5.


The decision follows a request from ITV, under the terms of their contract with the League, to move selected fixtures to the Sunday for live transmission purposes.

Lee Walker, Controller of Broadcasting at the Football League, commented: "The integrity of the League Championship was paramount in the considerations of our Board of Directors.


"We were not prepared to sanction the movement of fixtures in isolation on the deciding afternoon of the season, and a s a result all First Division games will kick-off at 3pm on Sunday, May 5."

Should it become apparent that a particular club's final match of the season will not have a bearing on promotion or relegation issues, or if it has not been selected for a live broadcast by ITV, then there will be the option of moving the fixture back to the Saturday.


IN the event of any emergencies at Luton Town Football Club, the emergency services and the club have agreed on an evacuation policy which is designed to:
