

PAUL MUSSELWHITE - Goalkeeper who was an ever-present member of the 93/94 promotion winning team, part of a run of consecutive matches stretching to over 100 following his arrival from Scunthorpe.

ARJEN VAN HEUSDEN - Dutch goalkeeper who was signed from Noordwyk in August 1994, and played against the Hatters last week.

NEIL ASPIN - Defender, and skipper of Vale, who began his career at Leeds United, playing in the top division at the age of 16 and helping them to the FA Cup semi-finals in 1987. Moved to Vale Park for £140,00 in July 1989.

GARETH GRIFFITHS - Central defender who was signed from non-league Rhyl in January 1993, winning a regular place last season.

DEAN GLOVER - Central defender who started his career with Aston Villa before moving to Middlesbrough. Joined Vale for then club record £200,000 in February 1989.

DEAN STOKES - Strong-tackling left-sided defender who cost a small fee from non-league Halesowen Town in January 1993.

BRADLEY SANDEMAN - Began his career with his home town team Northampton, and joined Vale on a free transfer from Maidstone in July 1992.

ALLEN TANKARD - Fullback who cost £87,000 from Wigan in July 1993, having started his league career at Southampton.

KEVIN KENT - Born in Stoke, but didn't arrive at Vale Park until March 1991, in exchange for £80,000 plus Gary Ford going to Mansfield Town.


RAY WALKER - Former England youth international who started his career with Aston Villa, but has proved a bargain for the £12,000 Vale paid for his services in 1986.


ABOVE: Vale defender Dean Stokes with Stuart

PORT VALE 1995/96

CRAIG LAWTON - Signed on a free transfer from Manchester United in July 1994, initially on a monthly contract to prove his fitness after a double hernia operation. Made only his second full appearance against the Hatters last week.

ANDY PORTER - Released as a schoolboy by Manchester City, and joined Vale in 1985. Made his debut in 1988 and has goneon to make over 250 league appearances.

WAYNE CORDEN - Winger who turned professional in July 1994, and made his full debut in last Tuesday's 1-0 win over the Hatters.

MARTIN FOYLE - Joint leading scorer with 13 goals this season, and was the club's record signing when he joined for £375,000 from Oxford United in June 1991. Started his career with Southampton.

LEE GLOVER - Signed from Nottingham Forest for £200,000 in July 1994. Formerly on loan at Luton, and is a Scottish youth and Under-21 international.

TONY NAYLOR - Led Crewe's scoring list with 23 goals in 1991/92 and 20 the following season. After he had netted 16 times for Crewe in 93/94, Vale signed him in July 1994 for £150,000, after the striker was close to signing for Luton.

STUART TALBOT - Midfielder who was snapped up at the start of last season, after impressing ina pre-season friendly against Vale for Moor Green.

STEVE GUPPY - A reserve player with
Southampton who made his league debut for
Wycombe Wanderers in 1993. Was then signed by
Kevin Keegan for Newcastle in 1994, but he moved
on to Vale in November of that same year for
£225.000.

ANDY HILL - Right-back who was signed from Manchester City in August. Won England youth honours in his Manchester United days, but did not make the first team at Old Trafford and moved to Bury in 1984. Transferred to Manchester City in 1990.

JON McCARTHY - Northern Ireland international winger who missed last week's game as he was on international duty against Sweden. Made one league appearance with Hartlepool before going to non-league Shepshed. Returned to league football with York in 1990, moving to Vale in the summer of

LEE MILLS - Started his league career with Wolves before moving to Derby in February 1995. Arrived at Vale Park last summer as part of the deal that took Robin Van Der Laan to the Baseball Ground.

IAN BOGIE - League experience started with Newcastle and continued with Preston, Millwall and Leyton Orient. Joined Vale last season.

Meet the Manager

JOHN RUDGE is the second longest serving manager in the League, and this season led Port Vale to Wembley, where they lost 5-2 to Genoa in the final of the Anglo-Italian Cup.

He has been the boss at Vale Park since 1983, a record currently only bettered by Dario Gradi at Crewe, and back in '83 Vale

were in the old Fourth Division.

Now they are on the fringes of the play-off places, having followed their FA Cup success this season with a surge up the Division One table after at one point looking like



contenders for the relegation places.

In the cup they saw off holders Everton after a replay, before going out to Leeds - to a last minute Gary McAllister goal - also in a replay after a 0-0 draw at Elland Road.

"We have had a sample of the big time by travelling to places like Goodison Park and Elland Road in the FA Cup this season and we want more of it," said Rudge. "That is the ultimate aim of the club."

A Hatter and a Valiant....

Born in Hednesford in February 1949, BRIAN HORTON was snapped up by the local non-league outfit before catching the attention of Port Vale and signing for the Valiants in July 1970.


After almost five years at Vale Park, during which time he turned out against the Hatters in the FA Cup, he attracted a bid of £30,000 from Brighton and joined up with the south coast club as they were riising up from Division Three to Division One.

In a surprise move in the summer of 1981, Luton manager David Pleat engineered an exchange deal involving Tony Grealish which brought the experienced Horton to Kenilworth Road. Not only had Pleat bought a good midfield player but more importantly a superb skipper.

With the final piece of the jigsaw in place, the Town took DivisionTwo by storm in 1982 and walked away with the championship, ably led by Horton who still had much to offer in Division One.


He enjoyed two good seasons in the top flight with the Town before accepting the position of Hull City player-manager in June 1984.

After retiring from the playing side in 1986, Horton has enjoyed varying success as a

Battles with Valiants into double figures

DESPITE the long histories of both the Town, formed in 1885, and Port Vale, formed in 1863, this will be only the 10th time the Potteries club has played in Luton for league points with the first played almost a century ago.

In 1898/99 we were enjoying our second season as members of the Football League and entertained 'new boys' Burslem Port Vale, fresh from the Midland League, at Dunstable Road on November 5. In front of a 2,000 crowd we had most of the play but a goal from Evans, two minutes from the end, sealed a win for the visitors.

In the return, the following March, at the Athletic Ground, Cobridge we went down 4-1 with prolific marksman Hugh Galbraith netting the sole Luton effort. We fared little better the next season losing 1-0 in the Potteries, where "the exchanges from the inception were of a spirited nature" and only managed a point following a 1-1 draw at Dunstable Road.

By this time our home attendances had dipped as we prepared to leave the predominantly northern Football League, and only 500 watched our game with Vale.

It was to be over 50 years before our paths were to cross again, and in 1954/55, just as we were about to be promoted to Division One for the first time, we fought out a 1-1 draw at Vale Park, with Roy Davies scoring the all important goal, while in the home game Davies was on the scoresheet again

as we ran out comfortable 4-2 winners in front of a crowd of 16,704.

Our next meetings all took place in the 1960s and started following our relegation from Division Two in 1963. On October 9, 1963, we switched on our new £10,000 floodlights and welcomed Port Vale who looked likely to snatch a point especially when Gordon Fincham missed a penalty.

Fortunately we managed to snatch only our second victory of the season when Tom McKechnie stabbed home the winner with 10 minutes left to play.

The return was played the following week, but this time it was Vale who scored the only goal when Town's ex-England international goalkeeper Ron Baynham was beaten just before the interval, to send the crowd of 11,449 home happy but push us down nearer the bottom of Division Three.

In 1964/65 both games were again played within days of each other and in the clash at Vale Park the Town were unlucky to go down to a Cheesebrough goal four minutes from the end.

This victory ended Vale's run of eight games without a win, which included an earlier 1-1 draw at Kenilworth Road when David Pleat equalised just before the end with an unstoppable shot.

As can be gathered both the Town and Port Vale were pretty poor sides at the time, and they accompanied each other down into Division Four at the end of that season.

As the Town found their feet at this new level we finally managed a win at Vale for the first time when John O'Rourke and Ray Whittaker were on target in a 2-1 win in October 1965 at the end of a six game unbeaten run.

The return was played on the evening of the FA Cup Final, in an experiment which has surprisingly never been repeated as an excellent crowd of 12,054 saw the Town go in at half-time five goals to the good with all the strikes coming inthe first 23 minutes. In the second period we could even afford the luxury of a missed penalty!

Season 1966/67 was the lowest point in the Town's history as we sunk to eighth from bottom in Division Four and our results against Vale reflected this.

When we went to the Potteries on November 5, 1966 we had gained one point and scored two goals on our travels that season, and new manager Allan Brown, taking charge for the first time, would only say: "I have a lot of work to do," following a dismal 1-0 defeat.

In the return, the following April, a goal from John Moore secured a point, after three straight defeats, as the Town struggled to avoid having to apply for re-election.

By the following season some of manager Brown's hard work was beginning to bear fruit and a hard-earned point at Vale Park in a 0-0 draw in January was followed by a comfortable 2-0 home win in March - courtesy of goals from Ian Buxton and Bruce Rioch - as we consolidated our position at the top of Division Four on the way to the championship.

Apart from a couple of FA Cup clashes in 1974 our paths did not cross again until last season when we achieved our first double over the side from the Potteries.

Dwight Marshall scored the winner at Vale Park in September, with Paul Telfer and Kerry Dixon netting in the 2-1 win at Kenilworth Road in March.

Nominations were once again sought from both clubs and referees regarding the best playing surface encountered during the course of the season, but, in a new departure, the judges also considered fully the resources available to the groundsmen at the 92 professional clubs and actual construction of pitches, before making their final decisions.

A REMINDER that the Football League have agreed theat the Endsleigh League First Division programme for the final Saturday of the season will be moved back 24 hours to Sunday May 5.


The decision follows a request from ITV, under the terms of their contract with the League, to move selected fixtures to the Sunday for live transmission purposes.

Lee Walker, Controller of Broadcasting at the Football League, commented: "The integrity of the League Championship was paramount in the considerations of our Board of Directors.



PROCEDURE


IN the event of any emergencies at Luton Town Football Club, the emergency services and the club have agreed on an evacuation policy which is designed to:
