OTHER STRIKES: Town six saved, five wide, and a header by Steve Davis hit a post; Rovers eight saved, seven wide, and drive by Ian Holloway was tipped onto the

bar by Ian Feuer.

REFEREE: Paul Taylor, Cheshunt, Will presumably claim he did it by the book with his yellow and red cards. But how come Clark got only a yellow when he brought down Kim Grant from behind to stop him scoring?

BOOKED: Visitors Tillson, dissent, and Lockwood, Clark and Parmenter for fouls; Gary Waddock twice, encroachment 82nd minute and a foul on Lee Martin 86th minute, with the second offence getting him sent off.

ATTENDANCE: 2,643, lowest post-war gate for a domestic league or cup game, 85 fewer than the previous worst, for the visit of Bournemouth in the same tournament 12 months ago, also a few days after the opening game of the season had been a home defeat.

ENTERTAINMENT: Town fans were not complaining, as at last they saw goals scored, and enjoyed a touch of good fortune to even up Saturday's bad luck against Burnley.
