TUESDAY'S DETAILS

BRISTOL CITY 5 LUTON TOWN 0

Half-time 2-0

TOWN: Feuer; James, Davis, Patterson, Thomas; Grant (Fotiadis 71 mins), Waddock, Thorpe, Hughes, Showler (Alexander 53 mins); Oldfield (Guentchev 80 mins).

BRISTOL CITY: Welch; Carey, Cundy, Shail, Barnard; Goodridge (Partridge 67 mins), Owers, Kuhl, Tinnion; Nugent, Goater (McLeary 71 mins).

GOALS: Greg Goodridge, 12 mins, shot between Ian Feuer and his near post after the defence failed to deal with a long free kick down the middle; Kevin Nugent, 41 mins, after he and Shaun Goater inter-passed to cut through the Town defence; Goater header, 50 seconds into the second half, from Brian Tinnion's left-wing cross; Goodridge again, 50 mins, after more poor defence from a corner; Jason Cundy header, 63 mins, as the Town lost a game of head tennis following a corner.

OTHER STRIKES: Town one saved and six wide; City six saved and five wide.

REFEREE: Steve Bennett, Dartford, A schoolteacher in charge of a real caning.

BOOKED: Greg Goodridge, for a mistimed tackle on Mitchell Thomas.

SENT OFF: Tony Thorpe, after 52 minutes, for lashing out with his fists in retaliation after he was fouled by Darren Barnard.

ATTENDANCE: 7,028, including a couple of hundred from Luton. It was 2,000 down on City's opening day, when they were beaten at home by Blackpool, and Joe Jordan's future was said to be on the line. He must be hoping to meet more teams like the Town, but it's doubtful.

ENTERTAINMENT: Unacceptable performance said the manager, and he was right. The whole team was a shambles, with little sign of any self-belief.
