## From the manager's chair

LAST Saturday's hard won victory against Blackpool sealed a very good September for us - the only major blemish being the home defeat by Chesterfield.

The game against Blackpool was well contested, and the 1-0 scoreline scarcely reflected our superiority, especially in the second half.

It was pleasing to me that the players could finish strongly after a hard game against Derby in the Coca-Cola Cup the previous Wednesday.

I have been critical of the inability to play two games in a week before, but there were no such problems this time.

This week, with the cancellation of the Wrexham game, we have had an opportunity to let the players recover from the physical demands of the previous three or four weeks, although disappointingly, at the time of writing, one or two injury doubts remain as we go into today's game against Walsall.

Although the rest is much needed physically, we must ensure that the players do not lose the momentum and fail to focus or prepare properly for this game today.



What we cannot afford to do is to slip back into our old ways, and we need to be tuned in to today's game right from the start.

We welcome Walsall, their players, officials and supporters, and manager Chris Nicholl who some of you will no doubt remember from his playing days here at Kenilworth Road.

Walsall have won their last two games, with a 3-1 home win against Bury last Saturday, and a 1-0 win at Bournemouth on Tuesday, and they will perform like the hardworking side they are, and we must make sure that our application and commitment is spot-on from the start.

I am pleased to announce that our 19-year-

old striker Andrew Fotiadis has signed an extension to his contract.

Andrew has only been a professional for three months, but has made an impact in the first team and has already been rewarded with this extension to a contract signed in the summer.

On the subject of contracts, I hope to soon be resolving the out-ofcontract situations regarding Julian James, Mitchell Thomas and Des Linton.

With the departure of John Taylor on loan to Lincoln, Jamie Woodsford on loan to Kettering, Gary Simpson's departure, and the possibility of one or two other loans pending, we need to stabilise the playing staff and should have somewhere near the right numbers in the squad.

Both John Taylor and Jamie Woodsford scored on their debuts for their respective clubs.

John scored for Lincoln on Saturday, and then played in an eventful game at Brighton on Tuesday.

His first team opportunities here have been limited by David Oldfield's good form, and by the promise of Andrew Fotiadis which I mentioned earlier.



John needs first team football somewhere, rather than reserve team football here, and we will review the situation with both loans at the end of the month, with regard to extending the loans or permanent deals etc.

Once again this afternoon we are without Kim Grant who scored against Derby and Blackpool, but who is again required by Ghana, this time for an African Nations Cup game which is due to be played tomorrow.

Carl Asaba and Nick Forster scored the Bees' goals, but Millwall had the opportunity to reduce the lead to four points as the Lions entertained Stockport on Wednesday.

With the game at Wrexham being postponed, due to the home side's international call-ups, Luton dropped one place to 13th after Tuesday's games as Gillingham moved above us with a 1-0 home win against Notts County.

This afternoon's opponents Walsall scored their third win of the season with a 1-0 victory at Bournemouth, thanks to a seventh minute goal from John Hodge.

Elsewhere, Bury beat Burnley 1-0 in the Lancashire derby at Gigg Lane; Crewe moved into second place with a 3-2 win at home to Blackpool; and Watford's Steve Palmer scored an injury-time goal to give his side a 1-0 win over Preston.

In the match between the bottom two, Wycombe, who parted company with manager Alan Smith earlier in the week, recovered from 2-0 down to beat Rotherham 4-2.

Luton's opponents next Saturday, Shrewsbury, lost 2-1 at Chesterfield.



I'm sure you can appreciate that our printing deadlines are such that the programme could not be changed, but of course messages were given out over the public address sytem, and local press were informed, with the postponement details also carried on ClubCall.



A PROFILE and history of Walsall FC follows. For more information about today's visitors see pages 12 to 15, with a look back to a previous meeting between the two sides on pages 34 & 35.

Travel along the M6 motorway between junctions 9 and 10, watch out for the illuminated Daewoo advertisement, and you are looking at the Bescot Stadium, the home of Walsall Football Club since 1990.

The sign reflects the commercial approach of Walsall since their move, and the club has sought to exploit its proximity to the busiest stretch of motorway in Europe by erecting three prominent illuminated signs, all sold to major companies.

A variety of events other than football take place at the Bescot Stadium. The 200-stall Sunday market attracts over 15,000 shoppers weekly, the floodlit synthetic sports pitch is used throughout the week, and Bescot Stadium has earned itself a reputation as a major conference venue.

The income from these activities has restored financial stability to the club, and this has been reflected in improved playing fortunes.

# Saddled up for new stadium success

Walsall Football Club was founded in 1888 as an amalgamation of two clubs, Walsall Town and Walsall Swifts. In 1892 they became founder members of the Football League Second Division and missed promotion to the First Division by four points in 1898/99.

After failing to gain re-election in 1901, they spent 20 years in the non-league wilderness before joining the newly-formed Third Division North in 1921. They alternated between the southern and northern section of the Third Division, until reorganisation into the Third and Fourth Division in 1958.

Walsall's most successful period came under the management of Bill Moore, when in successive seasons, 1959/60 and 60/61, they moved from the Fourth to the Second Division.


But, after only two seasons, they returned to Division Three and after missing promotion to Division Two by only four points in 1978, the following season saw them relegated to the Fourth Division. After heading the Division for most of the 79/80 season they finished runners-up to Huddersfield Town and so once more regained their Third Division status.

Over the years Walsall have earned themselves a reputation as a formidable cup fighting team. Their famous FA Cup triumph was a 2-0 win over Arsenal in January 1933.

In more recent years they have reached the fifth round of the FA Cup on three occasions. In 1974/75 they defeated both Manchester United and Newcastle, before losing to Birmingham. In 1977/78 they knocked out Leicester before losing to Arsenal, and in 1986/87 they defeated Charlton and Birmingham, before losing to Watford in a fifth round second replay.



## SPOTLIGHT ON TODAY'S VISITORS

**JAMES WALKER - Joined Walsall on a free** transfer from Notts County in August 1993, and quickly established himself as first choice keeper, until breaking his leg at the end of the 93/94 season. Made 33 league appearances last season, competing with Trevor Wood for first choice spot.

**TREVOR WOOD - Jersey born Wood made 50** appearances for Port Vale before joining Walsall in July 1994. Made 23 first team appearances in 95/96, and achieved international recognition with Northern Ireland.

**RAY DANIEL - Has made over 300 apperances in a** career that has included spells with Luton, Hull and Cardiff, before moving to Walsall in August 1995. Made 26 appearances for the Saddlers last season.

**WAYNE EVANS - Joined Walsall from Welshpool in** August 1993. Consistent performances at right back earned him a call up to the Welsh international squad last season.

**DEREK MOUNTFIELD - Vastly experienced central** defender with top flight experience with Everton, Aston Villa and Wolves. Joined Walsall in November 1995, making 33 first team appearances last season.

**PAUL MOUNTFORD - Former youth trainee, Paul** signed professional forms for Walsall in July 1995, and is a highly rated central defender.

**CHARLIE NTAMARK - Cameroon international now** in his seventh season with the Saddlers. Utility player who has played in most outfield positions, before enjoying a successful spell at right back last

STUART RYDER - England Under 21 international whose progress was halted in September 1995 with a serious knee injury.

(Continued from page 11). Walsall came nearest to winning one of the game's major trophies in the 1983/84 season, when they reached the semi-final of the Milk Cup. However, a first Wembley appearance was denied them by Liverpool who, after a 2-2 draw at Anfield, won the second leg 2-0 and so ended Walsall's dreams.

The Saddlers have experienced more than their share of traumas over the years. In 1986 a proposed ground-sharing scheme with Birmingham City at St Andrews was defeated following fierce opposition from the local community.

The club enjoyed a promotion season in 1987/88 when they

returned to the second division via the promotion play-offs. This success was short-lived however, and following two successive relegations the club fell back to the fourth division. The Saddlers were to remain in the soccer basement for five seasons. However, in 1990 the club left Fellows Park, its home for 87 vears, and relocated to the brand new Bescot Stadium.

Whilst playing success did not immediately follow, the excellent facilities at Bescot Stadium enabled the club to exploit its commercial potential. In 1991, Jeff Bonser became Chairman, and under his guidance the club has achieved a level of financial stability not

previously enjoyed in its 107-year history.

Following the appointment of Chris Nicholl as team manager in September 1994, the Saddlers enjoyed a measure of playing success which saw them finish runners up, achieving promotion to the second division.

Last season they finished the campaign in storming style; winning five and drawing two of the last seven games, missing the play-offs by just four points. This season they find themselves at the bottom end of the table after their first nine games, last Saturday securing their second win of the season with a 3-1 win over Bury.



He made his league debut early in the following year. coming on as a substitute in a 2-1 win over Chester, before enjoying four years at Fellows Park which included appearances in the semi-finals of the Milk Cup.

Luton manager David Pleat had been given some money to spend to help bolster his struggling Division One side, and a bid of £150,000 plus forward Steve Elliott was accepted by Walsall, and Preece made his way to Kenilworth Road in December 1984 to join a squad that was soon to include Steve Foster, Mick Harford and Peter Nicholas.

He made his Luton debut in a 1-0 home win over Aston Villa in December 1984, scoring the only goal, and went on to make 395 first team appearances, including one in the Littlewoods Cup Final win over Arsenal in 1988 when he made the team at the 11th hour, after being on the injured list for most of that season. He also won England B honours during his time with the Hatters.

Following his testimonial game against Manchester United at the end of the 1994/95 season, he decided to move to Derby, but after an initial bright start at the Baseball Ground he spent most of last season on loan, firstly at Birmingham, and then Swindon.

Earlier this season, David accepted the position of player/coach at Cambridge United, but unfortunately broke his leg in one of his first games for the Division Three side. - ROGER WASH.



Des Linton has started jogging again after his knee operation, and the 'long term' duo of Dwight Marshall and Richard Harvey continue to progress well.







## Saddlers beaten on the way to promotion.....

## Those were the days

**LUTON Town made very** hard work of winning promotion from Division Three in 1970.

Following back-to-back defeats at Bristol Rovers and Barrow in February we looked dead and buried after a tremendous start to a season that was beginning to turn into a bit of a disaster

**Draws with Torquay and Brighton** did not help but just as we had given up all hope we turned in a superb performance at Reading, where the home side were protecting a long unbeaten run.

Back we came with home draws against Mansfield and Bury followed by a miserable defeat at bottom club Tranmere to send Town fans into the depths of despair. At least we were being consistently inconsistent!

Surprisingly the home crowds were holding up and over 14,000 turned up at Kenilworth Road on Good Friday to see Alan Starling make his debut in

the Luton goal. After a nervous start Starling put on a sound display as the Town won 2-1, and kept his place the following day when Reading were the visitors.

Reading were still challenging strongly at the top, but a hat-trick from Malcolm MacDonald in a 5-0 win just about ended their hopes of promotion and put our train well and truly back on the rails, as promotion fever swept through the Town again.

In about the eighth 'false dawn' of that season we travelled to Barnsley three days later and were met by sleet, snow and rain and a determined home side who took a first-half lead. We were a different side in the second period however, and after Mike Keen headed an equaliser on the hour we looked good for both points.

Unfortunately, a slip from Starling, when he let the ball squirm from his hands, gifted the winner to Barnsley in the final minute.

Depths of despair time again for Luton supporters, but by the following Saturday we were ready to bounce back and made another long trip to Yorkshire, this time to Halifax. We had clinched promotion from Division Four at the Shay two years earlier, but we looked

anything like a promotion side this time as we fought out a tired scoreless draw against an equally inept side.

We now had five games left and it was reckoned that nine points out of the ten left on offer was the bare minimum required for promotion. As a supporter I was probably at my lowest ebb at this stage, but it did not prevent me from making my third away trip in a week, joining a best of the season crowd of 18,987 at Craven Cottage where the Town were due to take on Fulham, who themselves still clung on to a faint hope of promotion. In a frantic, breathless game, the Town put on another performance to split the promotion chase wide open again, in winning 1-0 against a side that had scored a hatful of goals that season.

MacDonald scored the only goal, as he had in the home game earlier in the camapign, thus proving that the Cottagers had made a slight mistake

in letting him go for a pittance.

With all the other results going with them, the Town were now back in the driving seat with only four games left. The trouble was we had to win them all to be certain of promotion but, with confidence surging again, home games against Walsall and Southport followed up by matches at Mansfield and Rochdale could not possibly prove a problem. This was our chance to make sure.

Repeating a successful experiment of four years before, it was decided to play a home game on the evening of the FA Cup Final and, after watching Leeds and Chelsea fight out a 2-2 draw at Wembley on our televisions in the afternoon, we all trooped to Kenilworth Road to see the Town take the final steps to promotion.

The visitors Walsall had nothing to play for, which made them doubly dangerous bearing in mind our performances against the lower lights that season. But we need not have been worried as, roared on by the crowd of 17,193, we took the game by the scruff of the neck from the start.

Newcomer to the side Viv Busby opened the scoring after eight minutes, when he crashed home a cross from MacDonald, and the game was as good as over shortly afterwards when goalscorer turned provider MacDonald headed down a cross from Keen for John Collins to rifle the ball home.

The crowd went wild shortly before half-time when MacDonald got the goal his unselfish play deserved, when he headed in an inch perfect cross from Graham French, leaving Phil Parkes in the Saddlers' goal bemused.

Just as we settled back expecting the Town to turn on the style in the second period, disaster struck when Starling, going down to save a shot from Walsall veteran Colin Taylor, collapsed when he tried to stand up and had to be replaced by substitute Keith Allen who had only played once before in goal, several years before during his days at Grimsby.

To be truthful Allen did not have a lot to do, with the Luton defenders resorting to safety-first tactics and booting the ball into the crowd at any sign of danger. I seem to remember that he twice let shots go out for a goal kick only to turn and see the ball cannon off the

We managed to hold out to the end, leaving three unbeaten games left which ensured a promotion spot back to Division Two that had looked unlikely many times during that season.

3/10/81: An easy 3-0 win at Orient with Mark Aizlewood, Ricky Hill and Steve White scoring the Luton goals. The win preserved our 100% away record that season.




