

HATTERS ARE ON SONG TO PUSH FOR PROMOTION

THE beat of heavy music is the latest ingredient in Luton Town's search for a promotion recipe.

The players have joined the likes of Wimbledon in using a ghetto blaster in the dressing room to psyche themselves up. Their football played the right tune on Tuesday.

After an impressive 3-0 win at Shrewsbury on Saturday, the Town found Stockport a much tougher proposition.

After bossing the first half, Luton had to battle through the second when Stockport came at them in numbers after a bit of a roasting from their manager.

David Jones had seen his team outplayed.

The only result that looked likely at the break was Luton's fourth consecutive league win.

But Stockport had the better of the second half, and both managers thought the result was right.

The Town dropped a place in the table, but are only a point below the play-off zone. And Stockport boss Jones thinks the Town could do well: "They are the best side I have seen this season," he said.

With Graham Alexander and Paul Showler extending Stockport on the wings, the Town deserved the 26th-minute lead they took through Steve Davis's header from

Alexander's corner.

And the defence was on top form after the break, when Stockport tried to batter them.

Four quick corners led to a 57th minute equaliser by Brett Angell, but Ian Feuer ensured that was the only setback.

He made three good saves, and Paul Jones one at the other end, from David Oldfield.
