GOALS: 1-0 44 minutes: Tony Thorpe's eighth penalty of the season after Lee Taylor tripped Andrew Fotiadis; 2-0 74 minutes: Dwight Marshall's first goal since January, flicking in a cross-shot by David Oldfield.

OTHER ATTEMPTS: Town five saved, six wide and cross-cum-shot by Graham Alexander hit the bar; Shrewsbury four saved and three wide.

CORNERS: 12-4 to the Town.

FOULS: Town six, Shrewsbury seven.

OFFSIDE: Town twice, Shrewsbury 13 times.

BOOKED: Paul McLaren for a foul on Paul Evans; Shrewsbury's Mark Dempsey for dissent and trying to con the ref into giving him a penalty.

REFEREE: Chris Foy, Merseyside. Infuriated Shrewsbury by playing an advantage that vanished with a save by Ian Feuer when the visitors should have had a penalty for Mitchell Thomas's foul on Ian Stevens. Thomas was lucky to escape a red card.

ATTENDANCE: 6,968, with very few from Shrewsbury.

ENTERTAINMENT: Made by the result for Town fans. The news that other leading rivals had dropped points made it all the better, but the Town were less than convincing in completing their fourth double of the season.
