

## SECOND DIVISION NEWS

with Mandeep Sanghera

After only a clutch of games into the Division Two season there is a danger of reading too much into the early league table, but you can also discard it at your peril. It can be dangerous to make any sort of predictions so briefly into the season, but you cannot help drawing a number of conclusions about Northampton's rivals from their respective starts.

The facts never lie and the pacesetters, slowstarters and strugglers have all given a brief insight as to what to expect as the season progresses.

Watford suffered their first defeat of the season 10 days ago away at fellow pacesetters Preston when beaten 2-0, but with a 100 per cent record prior to that game gave clear indication that they will be one of the teams challenging for promotion come the end of the season in May.

Manager Graham Taylor, who returned this summer to reform his partnership with Elton John, has seen his side knock Swindon out of the Coca-Cola Cup as well as beat last season's play-off finalists Brentford, and although he was not happy with his team's defeat the former England manager seemed glad the attention, which was gaining momentum due to their unbeaten start, was curbed somewhat to ease the pressure on his players.

Their opponents last Sunday were John Gregory's Wycombe side who although knocked out of the Coca-Cola Cup by Fulham (6-5 on aggregate) have built on the promising form during the climax to last season when they lost only one game at home from November onwards. They have continued this record this season - their last victims were the seaside club of Southend beaten 4-1 last Tuesday night. Southend and Grimsby, who were both relegated last term, are in the bottom quarter of the table and managers Alvin Martin and Alan Buckley respectively are struggling with the aid of little finances and lack of squad strength to turn around the fortunes of the clubs.

However, it is another seaside club in Blackpool that stole the headlines when they knocked first division Manchester City out of the Coca-Cola Cup in a pulsating contest that finished 1-1 on aggregate after extra-time and was decided 4-2 on penalties.

Gary Megson's side were beaten 2-0 by Bournemouth, another of the early seasons

high-flyers, in the next game, but bounced back with the help of a Tony Ellis hat-trick to defeat Wrexham 4-3 last Tuesday.

Wrexham have failed to match the preseason expectations which were borne from their reaching the FA Cup quarter-finals last season, but Brian Flynn knows they will need to rediscover that form on a weekly basis to get back on the promotion trail.

Lennie Lawrence's Luton are another side who will need to quickly get back on the winning trail to reaffirm their promotion aspirations and credentials. Lawrence's side were beaten 2-0 by rivals Millwall last week and with league goals becoming hard to come by a move into the transfer market could be beckoning. Luton have the second worst goalscoring record in the Division, but it is managerial newcomer Chris Waddle whose Burnley side are bottom in that category as well as propping up the league table.

The two Bristol sides in City and Rovers met in the Coca-Cola Cup with the former coming out on top by an aggregate score of 2-1 after extra-time and now face Leeds United in the next round.

Bristol Rovers, though, are narrowly ahead of their local rivals in the league after last Tuesday's 1-1 draw at Bournemouth and City's 2-0 defeat at home to Fulham.

Mickey Adams' Fulham have made the best start of the other three promoted sides, namely Wigan Athletic and Carlisle. Wigan have fallen away after their opening day 5-2 home win against Wycombe with a 3-0 loss at Bristol City and a 1-0 defeat to Carlisle. That was Carlisle's first win of the season, but at the time it failed to lift them out of the bottom three.

In another all Division Two encounter Oldham were hammered 5-0 by Grimsby in the second leg first round tie as Jack Lester gave the Mariners a break from their poor league start with a nine minute first-half hat-trick. Triple strikes have been the feature of the last couple of weeks and none have been more spectacular than that of Frenchman Roger Boli. The brother of Besile, who famously headbutted Stuart Pearce, proved the division has its own continental flavour.

Boli hit three against Southend including a bicycle kick which flew into the top corner from 15 yards to give Danish coach Jan Sorensen something to smile about.

### LENNIE LAWRENCE -

Lennie Lawrence was appointed manager of Luton Town in December 1995, following the departure of Terry Westley.

A player with non-League Croydon, Carshalton Athletic and Sutton United. Mr Lawrence was an assistant manager at Plymouth, where he was also caretaker manager, and at Lincoln, before becoming manager of Charlton Athletic in 1982, having initially joined the



Charlton finished as runners-up in Division 2 in 1985/86 earning promotion to the top flight after an absence of 29 years. In the following season they were involved in the first promotion/relegation play-offs, overcoming second division Leeds United in extra-time in a dramatic play-off final replay, but were relegated in 1990. Mr Lawrence left Charlton in 1991, after nine years with the club which at the time made him the longest serving manager in the country behind Nottingham Forest's Brian Clough and Oldham's Joe Royle.

He headed north to Middlesbrough, where he took the Teeside club into the FA Premier League in 1992 in his first season with them. They returned to Division One in 1993, and Mr Lawrence left in 1994, when Bryan Robson took over at Ayresome Park.

He then joined Bradford in May 1994, leaving Valley Parade in November of this year. He is the 21st manager in the history of Luton Town.

### PAGL SHOWLER

Signed in August 1996 from Bradford City, where he played under current Luton boss Lennie Lawrence. Played non-league football for Altrincham and Barnet, with league appearances for the latter following their promotion from the Conference. Scored his first goal for the Hatters in the 3-1 win over Walsall in

October 1996.



Ian signed for the Hatters from West Ham in December 1995 for a fee which could rise to £580,000 depending on appearances. At West Ham he was understudy to Ludek Milosko, but never played a first team game, and due to restrictions on overseas players was kept off the bench by Les Sealey. His Luton debut wasn't his league debut though, as he was on loan at Peterborough in 1994/95, playing 16 games in Division Two before being spotted by West Ham playing in Belgium, although he actually signed from Los Angeles Salsa.

### SIMON DAVIES

Joined the Hatters from Manchester United for £200,000 in the summer of 1997, after only rare appearances in the Old Trafford first-team. Made 11 league appearances for the Reds, and also played six matches during a loan spell at Exeter. Scored for United in a European Cup match v Galatasaray in December 1994, when they won 4-0.

### KELVIN DAVIS

Kelvin is a highly rated keeper who made his league debut for the Hatters on the final day of the 1993/94 season in a 2-2 draw at Stoke. He spent a month on loan at Torquay in September 1994, before winning a place in the Luton starting line-up in March. With Jurgen Sommer on international duty, Kelvin made his home debut in the televised 'derby' with Watford, saving a penalty in the 1-1 draw. he kept his



place until the end of the season, and also won two England youth caps.

Richard resurrected his Town career in 1994/95 after two years plagued by injury. The former England youth international missed the entire 1993/94 season after a cruciate knee ligament operation, and made his first appearance of the following campaign at Barnsley in January. His appearance at home to Watford in March 1995 was his first at Kenilworth Road for three years. A regular on the left side of defence/midfield for the frst half of the 95/96 season, he lost his place to Mitchell Thomas after the arrival of Lennie Lawrence as manager. Suffered with another knee ligament injury in the 96/97 pre-season campaign. Was given free transfer at the end of last season, but remains on month-tomonth contract.

Julian joined Luton as a trainee, and was introduced to First Division football in 1988, but was sent off on his full debut in a Littlewoods Cup win at Leeds in November of that year.

A former England Under-21 International, he was a regular at left-back in the 1993/94 season, but made the right-back position his own in 1994/95 with a string of consistent displays which earned him the Player of the Year award from the Loyal Luton Supporters Club.

Marvin made his Football League debut against Wimbledon in 1988, and quickly established himself as a versatile defender. Started the 1994/95 season at left-back, but then switched to the centre of defence to

from a reliable partnership with Trevor Peake. Marvin was one of only

three players to play in every first team match in 94/95 season, and was awarded the Players' Player of the Year trophy. He was again a

consistent performer in 95/96 at centre-back, alongside Steve Davis for the most part, and Darren Patterson.

POWARVIN JOHNSON



Paul made his debut in the Town first team on the final day of the 1993/94 season, coming on as a substitute at Stoke City. He joined the Hatters from school, and is an England Youth international. He started as a centrehalf, but spent much of the 1994/95 season in the reserves in central midfield.

Made his full debut at Tranmere in October 1995, and then played in the Anglo-Italian Cup game at Genoa. Was an able deputy for Gary Waddock and/or Ceri Hughes in 96/97 and is set to be a regular this term.

The former England Under-21 international made over 100 appearances for Luton before moving to Spurs, shortly after David Pleat, in 1986.

He played in the 1987 FA Cup Final, and later moved to West Ham. He was on loan at Luton in the 1993/94 season before a permanent free transfer move, and after missing the start of the season through suspension was a regular at left-back in the 1994/95

Recalled by new manager Lennie Lawrence in

December 1995, and responded with an ever-present record until the end of the season. Was regular leftback during the 96/97 campaign.

Darren signed for the Hatters in August 1995 from Crystal Palace for £150,000, a fee which could rise to over £200,000 based on appearances. The Northern Ireland international started his league career with Wigan and joined Palace for £250,000 in 1992. An achilles injury ruled him out of the first two months of the season, and kept him out of Northern Ireland's final European Championship qualifying

Made his first Luton appearance in the Anglo-Italian Cup defeat in Casena in November 1995. Went on loan to Preston in October 1996, and won his place back in the Northern Ireland squad at the end of

Graham joined the Hatters in July 1995, and was Terry Westley's first signing after being confirmed as Luton's new manager.

The Town coaching staff had been watching him for two seasons before deciding to make their move, with the fee in the region of £100,000, with further

payments depending on appearances. A regular on the right-hand side of midfield, he played in all but one of Luton's league and cup matches in the 96/97 season.

Trevor started his league career at Lincoln City in 1979, before moving on to Coventry City in 1983. He enjoyed eight full seasons at Highfield Road, winning an FA Cup winners' medal in 1987 as the Sky Blues beat David Pleat's Tottenham 3-2 at Wembley. Trevor joined Luton for £100,000 in August 1991, and signed a new one-year contract in the summer of 1994.

For the first time in his career he maintained an ever-present record throughout the season, being voted the Supporters' Club Player of the Year, and signed a further one year deal in the summer of 1995, and was appointed reserve team coach during the 1995/96 season.

David returned to Kenilworth Road in the summer of 1995, six years after leaving Luton Town. He started his career with the Hatters, progressing through the junior ranks to a two goal senior debut in the 2-1 Simod Cup win at Everton in February 1988. Australian born Oldfield joined Manchester City for £600,000 in March 1989, before moving on to Leicester City. Re-signed from Leicester City in July 1995 for £150,000.

Tony made an immediate impact in the Town side when he scored for the Hatters on his full debut at Newcastle United, in the fourth round of the FA Cup in January 1994.

He joined the club at the start of the 1992/93 season, following a spell at Leicester. He was restricted to just five substitute appearances during the 1994/95 campaign. Scored Luton's winning goal at Southend in August 1995 - the Hatters' first win of the season. and their first under Terry Westley. Signed a new contract in the summer of 1996 and went on to enjoy a record-breaking season, becoming the first Luton player since Malcolm MacDonald in 1970/71 to reach 30 goals.

### GARY WADDOCK

Gary completed a free transfer move from Bristol Rovers in December 1994, after a three-month loan spell at Kenilworth Road.

Started his career with QPR making over 200 appearances, including an FA Cup Final against Spurs in 1982, and the subsequent replay.

That was followed by a spell in Belgium with Charleroi as Gary recovered from a serious knee injury, he also had spells at Millwall, QPR again and Swindon before moving to Bristol.

Gary missed only one game, after joining the Hatters in 1994/95, and scored his first goal for the club on the final day of the season. His consistent displays in 95/96 were rewarded with the Players' Player of the Year Trophy.

### STEVE DAVIS

Steve joined the Hatters in the summer of 1995 after making over 160 league appearances for Burnley, scoring over 22 goals.

He joined the Turf Moor side in August 1991 for £60,000 from Southampton, after loan spells at Burnley and Notts County.

He captained Burnley during their rise up the league into Division One, and played in both their victories over Luton in the 1994/95 season.

Was a commanding figure for the Hatters in 95/96, but again suffered the agony of relegation as Luton, like Burnley the previous season, dropped out of Division One.

Regular in the centre of defence last season.

## Did you know?

- When the clubs met in a friendly in October 1899 the score ended 6-5 in Luton's favour.
- Christmas 1927, the Cobblers decided to travel to Luton by road due to the poor weather, but got stuck at Wendover, and never made the game.
- In the return at Northampton, Luton took a 5-1 half time lead only for Northampton to win 6-5, Reid of Luton scored 4 times and still finished on the losing side.
- Between 1902 and 1908, the Southern League fixture at Luton was always played on Boxing Day.
- The club met twice over Christmas 1915, in friendlies, Luton won their home tie 9-2, and Northampton theirs 8-2.
- A Southern League match in 1904/05 saw Five penalties awarded three to Luton, all converted, and two to Northampton, just one scored.
- It was goals galore during the 16 World War 2 games, Cobbler's recorded an 8-1, two 7-1's as well as a 5-1, two 5-2's and a 5-4, while Luton had a 7-1 and a 6-2 victory.
- Terry Branston helped Northampton from

the Fourth to the First Division, then joined Luton, and helped them to the Division Four Championship.

- The 19,251 that watched Cobblers win 4-1 at the County Ground in December 1929, was a record crowd for a league match, at the time.
- During the late 30's Northampton signed Bell, Thayne, Turner, Cook and Parris from Luton, then in the 60's Luton signed Reid, Smith, Hails and Branston from Northampton.
- Strangest transfer was in 1926, when Cobbler's signed Bill Jennings, a centre half from Luton, he was 35, and played just three games.
- The last Luton player to score at the County Ground was Bruce Rioch in 1968, his brother Neil had a loan spell with the club four seasons later.
- Tony Adcock became the 42nd player to have played for both First teams, when he joined Luton in 1994.
- Biggest crowd for a Northampton v Luton clash was 26,220 for the FA Cup match at Kenilworth Road in 1961. Luton won 4-0.


## Trust Update





## Continental Appeal

The Italian league's kick-off 10 days ago had been eagerly awaited by fans around the world who were desperate to see how Ronaldo, the World Footballer of the Year, would fair in his league debut for Internazionale - but after all the fuss surrounding his move from Barcelona it all turned out to be an anti-climax.

Ronaldo may have hit the bar against Brescia in the San Siro Stadium but it was his Uruguayan team-mate Alvaro Recoba who stole the headlines with two stunning goals in the 2-1 win after coming on as a second-half substitute. Champions Juventus also made a shaky start against newly promoted Lecce and had to wait until seven minutes from time for last season's Serie A top scorer Filippo Inzaghi to open the scoring. Antonio Conte added a second in the last minute for an unconvincing 2-0 victory for

Marcello Lippi's team.

Argentinian international Gabriel Batistuta twice levelled the score for Fiorentina against Udinese before completing his hat-trick with an overhead kick in the dying seconds to earn a 3-2 victory. In the Italian Cup Parma, who have lost in the early stages in the last two years, went down 3-2 to Serie B side Venezia in the first leg of the second round match last Wednesday. Another top side to lose to a Serie B side were Sampdoria who lost 2-1 away at Graeme Souness's Torino. In the first weekend of the Spanish League the South American contingent were also out in force. Former Middlesbrough playmaker Juninho scored his first goal for Atletico Madrid as they drew 1-1 with fierce rivals Real Madrid. Barcelona's Portuguese international keeper Victor Bais could be out for three months after knee surgery and Dutch coach Louis Van Gaal has brought in Ruud Hesp as cover. The only promoted side to pick up any points on the opening weekend were Real Mallorca who beat Valencia 2-1.

Swedish international Tomas Brolin's hopes of a move to Real Zaragoza to end his troubled time at Leeds United have disappeared after the Spanish side pulled out of the deal last week. The English Premiership games may be called off when there is an international but, despite 51 of Spain's foreign legion being on World Cup duty, the (September 6 and 7) programme

still went ahead with Tenerife the worse hit with seven players missing.

Benefica are only mid table after they lost 1-0 to newly promoted Setubal. Sporting Lisbon lie third after their 1-0 home victory against bottom club Chaves.

Dutch side Ajax thrashed Utrecht 7-1 to take their goal tally to 17 in three games which leaves them top of the first division on goal difference over Fevenoord and Heerenveen -

the only other side who are unbeaten after three games, Vitesse Arnhem are below mid-table after they drew 1-1 with Voledam last Tuesday. Newly-promoted Kaiserslautern are still top of the German Bundeslige after beating third-frombottom Bochum 3-1, although Bayern Munich also won 3-1 away at Hansa Ronstock to move into second place. Rostock meanwhile have taken South Africa international striker Wilfried Mugeyi, who won the South Africa Player of the Year award last season, on trial from Bush Bucks

Borussia Moenchengladbach, 12th after only one victory from their first five games, have been assured by captain Stefan Effenberg that he will stay until his contract runs out in the year 2000. while Champions Cup holders Borussia Dortmund have German international Matthias Sammer back in training after knee surgery a month ago. Hertha Berlin, promoted to the Bungesliga this season, have not enjoyed such a profitable time as leaders Kaiserslautern in their first season back in the top flight. Berlin are still looking for their first league victory after they lost 2-0 at

In Turkey there are no real surprises at the top of the league with Trabzonspor leading Fenerbahce by one point with champions Galatasaray a further point back. Galatasaray thrashed bottom side Vanspor 6-2 in the latest round of matches. while Fenerbahce won 2-0.

home to Hamburg.

Rosenborg Trodheim have opened up an 11 point lead in the Norwegian first division after they beat second-placed Stabeak 5-0. Stronsgodset moved into their place ahead of Molde after their 6-1 victory over bottom club Lyn Oslo, while Brann Bergen remain fifth after they overcame Tromso in a seven goal thriller.

The leaders in the Danish super league are still FC Copenhagen, despite their 1-1 draw with neighbouring AB Copenhagen, although Silkeborg climb over Brondby into second after beating them 2-1 away. OB Odense are bottom and still looking for their first victory after six matches. Meanwhile on a world scale we now know that, after the previous round of World Cup qualifiers, Romania have become the first European country

to qualify for the finals in France next summer. They join the holders Brazil, the hosts France and the five qualifiers from the African nations - South Africa, who qualify for the first time in their

history, Cameroon, Tunisia, Morocco and the Olympic champions Nigeria for France 1998. FIFA, the sports ruling body, confirmed last week that the draw for the European playoffs, involving eight of the nine runners-up from the qualification groups, will

be held in Zurich on October 13.







## 'Master Cobblers'

### 1924 - LOCKETT SCORES FOUR

Inside-forward Bill Lockett scored four goals as the following Northampton Town team gained an emphatic 5-0 Third Division (South) win at home to Aberdare Athletic on 4th September 1924: Charlie Smith, Billy Watson, Frank Brett, George Needham, Edmund Wood, Billy Williams, Billy Pease, Jack Cook, Bill Poyntz, Bill Lockett, Louis Page. It was only the second time that a Northampton player had netted four goals in a League game. Lockett had been the Cobblers' leading marksman for the previous seasons and scored 68 times in 185 League outings overall.

### 1932 - COBBLERS HAMMER COUNTY

Four goals by Bert Dawes plus others by Tommy Boyle (2), Fred Dawes and Bob Mortimer gave the following Northampton Town side a thrilling 8-0 Third Division (South) win over struggling Newport County in front of 8,920 at the County Ground on 3rd September 1932: Len Hammond, Jim Oakley, Fred Dawes, John Dowsey, Ossie Park, Frank Davies, Bob Mortimer, Tommy Boyle, Bert Dawes, Fred Forbes, Tommy Wells. Having netted seven goals in the opening three games of the 1932/33 campaign, Bert Dawes scored another four in Northampton's 6-0 home win over Swindon Town two weeks later.

### 1958 - BARON'S DEBUT GOAL

Experienced inside-forward Kevin Baron scored on his Northampton Town debut to give the following team a 1-1 Fourth Division draw at home to Workington on 25th September 1958: Tony Brewer, Jim Bannister, Ron Patterson, Ray Yeoman, Colin Gale, Joe O'Neil, Barry Hawkins, Kevin Baron, Ollie Norris, Alan Woan, Tommy Fowler. Signed from Southend United, Baron

had played for Liverpool in the 1950 FA Cup final and was destined to score four times in 25 League games overall. Centre-forward Ollie Norris was also making his debut after moving from Bournemouth where he had starred in their 1956/57 FA Cup run.

### 1967 - ENGLAND INTERNATIONAL SIGNED

Former England international left-half Ron Flowers joined Northampton Town as player-coach in September 1967. Capped 49 times by his country, he had starred in three League Championship successes and the 1960 FA Cup final triumph during 16 years at Wolves. His arrival at the County Ground coincided with the appointment of former Spurs defender Tony Marchi as team-manager when Dave Bowen became general-manager after two consecutive relegation campaigns. Subsequently appointed player-manager for a year in May 1968, Flowers scored four goals in 61 League outings for Northampton.

### 1982 - COBBLERS' SEVENTH HEAVEN


Dave Syrett's four goals and others by Steve Massey (2) and Peter Benyer gave the following Northampton Town team an exciting 7-1 Fourth Division win over Bristol City in front of 2,967 at the County Ground on 19th September 1982: Neil Freeman, Paul Brady, Ian Phillips, Wakeley Gage, Adrian Burrows, Mark Heeley (Peter Denyer), Paul Saunders, Gary Saxby, Dave Syrett, Steve Massey, John Buchanan. It was the first time for 22 years that a Northampton player had scored four goals in a League game. Bristol City had plummeted from the First Division to Fourth in successive seasons, beating Northampton's unwanted record.

### 1993 - BARNWELL TAKES CHARGE

John Barnwell succeeded Phil Chard as Northampton Town's manager in September 1993. Chard had been dismissed as playerboss with Northampton bottom of the Third Division after failing to win any of their opening six games of the 1993/94 campaign and losing to Reading in the Coca Cola Cup. A former Arsenal team-mate of Dave Bowen's, Barnwell had previously managed Peterborough United, Wolves (1980 League Cup win), Notts County and Walsall and had been Northampton's managerial consultant for six months. Initially appointed on a caretaker basis, he remained in charge until dismissed in January 1995.




