Grimsby Town is going to be very familiar to the Spireites after last Saturday's marvellous draw at Blundell Park, last Tuesday's Autowindscreens clash and next Tuesday's F.A.Cup replay! Luton Town will help us to focus our minds on the Nationwide League promotion chase. Watford and Bristol City are certainly looking very strong at the moment and our visit to Ashton Gate next Saturday should be a cracking game. Town are very nicely placed in fourth position and judging by our excellent display against a strong Northampton side at Sixfields we are well worth the position. I'll have a halfway point of the season in depth look at the division in the article for the York City game. It is interesting to note that at the time of writing, Oldham Athletic is the only club in the Nationwide League Second Division to remain undefeated at home - the Spireites of course going down themselves at Boundary Park.

The club is asking Boro fans to donate toys so that they can get a sack full which Bryan Robson and the players will take along to the local hospital. With the expansion and improvement over the past 18 months we have found that our activities are attracting boys and girls of a very high standard.

Although we do not deal specifically in excellence we feel it is our duty to encourage and hopefully help develop anyone who shows promise.

Kevin Hornsby and Steve Hampton who work for the Community project also coach the Under 12 squad at the Centre of Excellence. It is with this link that 20 of the 24 boys in that squad were recommended from activities done by Football in the Community.

I would like to further our relationship with the School of Excellence, because I see it benefiting the youth in the Chesterfield area, but for this to happen we will need financial backing. We are looking to run the Centre of Excellence separately from the Football Club, so we are calling on local Chesterfield business people, who are willing to put something

back into the Community to help footballers achieve their ambitions of one day playing for Chesterfield F.C.

DEMA GLASS SATURDAY MORNING CLUB

Nothing to do on Saturday mornings? If you are aged 6 to 14 years old why not join our coaches and play football from 10am, to 1pm (mum may also be able to go shopping) for just £3.

The club has been running for many years but Paul Stevens (Stev) with the help of Dema Glass has revamped the club giving certificates and prizes for achieving certain levels of all ball skills and, also rewarding regular attendances.

The certificates have been developed to give the children an objective each week, and 'goal' to aim for. You don't have to be a brilliant player to play, just enjoy yourself.

An awards scheme has been introduced. This involves various evaluations on skills and techniques such as passing, control, shooting, juggling etc. They start at yellow, through eight ability levels, to a gold award.

Each week the players will be coached on specific skills and techniques and then the following week they will be assessed. The starting levels are very easy but obviously some practice will be needed to reach the gold. The session will finish off with a small game but, most important, the children are encouraged to have fun. Some of them have even been recommended by us and taken on by Chesterfield's Centre of Excellence Squad.

Luton Town are today's visitors to Saltergate.

The Hatters currently languish towards the wrong end of Division Two following a poor start to the current campaign. Lennie Lawrence's side has been depleted for much of the season with a crop of injuries, at one time ruling out his entire back four and goalkeeper.

The only consolation for Luton fans is that they did have a similar start last term, but from the Christmas period on were rarely out of the top three. The Hatters eventually just missed out on an automatic promotion spot and were then beaten in the play-offs by Crewe at the semi-final stage.

Leading scorer is again Tony Thorpe who has this week been linked with several Premiership sides. Thorpe bagged a club record 30 goals last term and Luton will surely want to retain the services of such a prized possession.

One recent departure is that of first team coach Wayne Turner, with Trevor Peake and John Moore taking over.

While the Spireites hectic schedule continues, Luton have managed an eleven day lay-off and, with several first teamers now returning to first team duty after injury, they will be looking to climb the Division Two table in the near future and start a similar run to that of last season.

MEET THE BOSS

Lennie Lawrence was appointed manager of Luton Town in December 1995 replacing Terry Westley. Lennie's playing career was in non-league football with Croydon, Carshalton Athletic and Sutton United. His managerial career began with the assistant manager's job at Plymouth. He was also caretaker manager at Lincoln for a short time before becoming manager of Charlton Athletic in 1982, having initially joined as reserve team coach.

Lawrence guided the Addicks to the runners up spot in 1985/86 to gain promotion to the top division after an absence of 29 years. The following season Charlton was involved in the end of season promotion/relegation play off overcoming Second Division Leeds United in a dramatic play off final replay. After another couple of seasons of battling against the drop they were finally relegated in 1990.

He left Charlton in 1991 after nine years with the club and headed north to Middlesbrough, he took the Teesiders into the Premier League in 1992 in his first season in charge. They were relegated the following season and Lawrence was replaced with Bryan Robson. He joined Bradford in May 1994 before leaving Valley Parade in November 1995 and a month later he joined Luton Town. Unable to keep the Hatters in Division One he guided them to the Division Two play offs in his first full season in charge. TREVOR PEAKE

He joined Luton for £100,000 in August 1991. Trevor was appointed reserve team coach in 1995 and holds the record of Luton's oldest player when he came on as a substitute against Wrexham back in September.

Alan joined the club from Middlesbrough in September for a fee which could rise to £90,000 dependant upon appearances. He was originally signed by Lennie Lawrence during his time at Ayresome Park. Alan made his Luton Town debut in the Coca Cola Cup against West Brom.

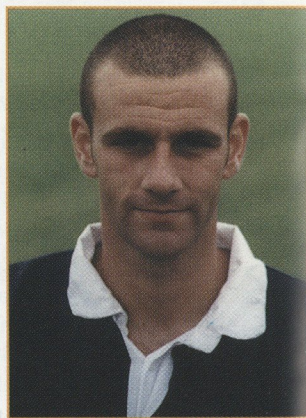
STEVE DAVIES

Phil originally joined Luton in 1991 before moving to Roker Park for £800,000 in 1993. He had three seasons at Sunderland before moving to France to play for Nancy on a free-transfer under the Bosman Ruling. From there he moved to Dutch side Fortuna Sittard returning to Luton in September 1997 for £400,000.

DAVID OLDFIELD

David is another player currently enjoying a second spell with Luton Town. He began his career with the Hatters progressing through the junior ranks before moving on to Manchester City for £600,000 and

then to Leicester. He rejoined Luton for £150,000 in July 1995.

TONY THORPE

Tony became the first Luton player since Malcolm McDonald to score thirty goals in a season during the last campaign. The 23 year old striker joined the club in August 1992 following a brief spell with Leicester City and made his debut against Newcastle United in the Fourth Round of the F.A. Cup in January 1994.

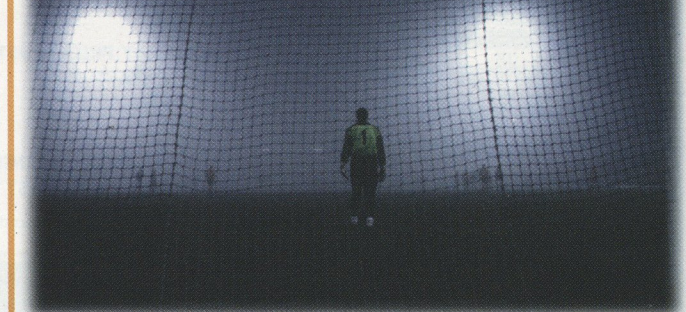
ANDREW FOTIADIS

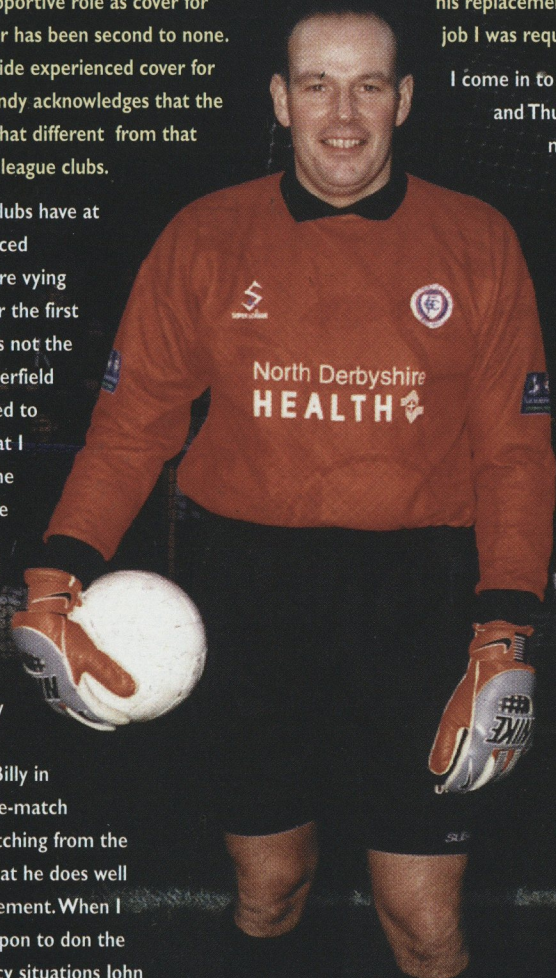

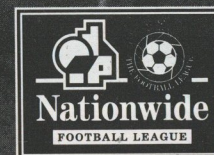

TALKING POINT

Two new grounds

both with room for improvement

Last season I missed our First Round victory over Bury. In order to similarly help our Cup progress this season I ensured my annual Belgian weekend coincided with the same milestone - if we get to Wembley, who says superstitions are crazy?

Friends in Belgium managed to obtain tickets for the crucial World Cup decider between Belgium and Ireland - so off we went to the Stade Roi Baudouin (formerly Heysel), totally rebuilt they told me - they should have added 'not quite!' Of all the grounds in the World that have undertaken revamping - you would expect Heysel to be exemplary in its commitment to safety - not so! Almost total darkness made it difficult to establish but - no turnstiles at the ground so entrance is effected by showing your match ticket to a steward at the gate. Inevitably as kick off approaches the, by now, drenched, crowd pushes ... the stewards on the inside were also pushing ... result: people falling over, being pushed into scaffolding, crash barriers collapsing ...somehow a major catastrophe didn't happen ... more thanks to luck than planning.

Inside a pleasant enough all seater stadium, minus any frills, played host to a titanic struggle. One thing that did surprise was the luck of commercialism - no programmes on sale, virtually no goods for sale outside and no food or drink available in our section of the ground.

Three nights later saw me visit Derby's new ground for the first time; the fixture against Newcastle appealing enough. None of the safety issues here - although the craziest car parking experience ever. We arrived at the wrong entrance and had to

return to the A52 for a mile journey to connect with our car park which is 100 yards away (but not accessible on match days).

The good view and initial impressiveness of the scene wore off as the tedium of the game sank in - the ground is really quite small; all seats were taken for home fans, the only gaps being where the Toon Army had decided they couldn't face Dalglish's sterility. If Derby had thought a little better their takings on that night alone would have been significantly greater.

Commercialism was well managed - goods readily available, Derby's own match day TV station is intended to keep fans happy before and after the game I can understand the rationale; we waited almost an hour to escape the car park - my tip, travel by train when you go!

On this evidence Britain has learnt so much more than our foreign counterparts when it comes to giving fans the safety and facilities they need and deserve - it's just such a shame that all these new grounds lack any soul; visiting the toilet at half time resembles a trip to any breeze block "DIY" warehouse - and I'm no fan of "DIY".

Let's hope that benchmarking is high on the "must do" list when we get round to planning the new Saltergate replacement - I've become accustomed to the moving idea but we must learn from the many mistakes of others that we are to meet the basic needs of the paying customers; Derby didn't even have a clock!
