Warnock's World

As we welcome Lennie Lawrence's Luton Town to Boundary Park this afternoon, a lot of water has gone under the bridge since my last notes a month ago. While disappointed not to have played Burnley at home, I could understand the referee's ruling that particular day.

Since then we have tried hard to eliminate the same circumstances from happening again with experts called in to examine the drainage system. It is a blow to prepare for a match and then to lose out at the last minute, but you have to overcome these things.

Unfortunately it has left us with quite a few away games to play, hence no fixture here since the visit of Walsall the Friday before Christmas.

I thought your support, and the way you got behind the lads at York, was tremendous and I am sure you, like me, couldn't understand why Sean McCarthy's goal was disallowed in injury time.

It was one of those decisions we couldn't do anything about but it denied us what could prove two important points in our bid for a play-off place.

But, if you want to look at fate I had the same referee and linesman three years ago at Huddersfield and, on the linesman's flag the referee sent off Lee Sinnott in our match against Rotherham.

I asked the referee to look at the video and he realised the linesman was totally wrong and quashed the dismissal which was for denying an opponent a goalscoring chance.

That season we finished sixth in the table and won promotion through the playoffs and on Saturday it was ironic to have the same referee and linesman who denied us two points.

I only wish in this case the referee was able to look at the video and overturn the decision made by the linesman after he took over in the middle.

All I hope for now is that we have the same conclusion as that season! If you read the papers you are no doubt aware I was very hurt at the way in which we were knocked out of the F.A. Cup at Cardiff.

I felt certain players let the club down and, whether you call it punishment or not, they certainly made up for it the following week.. I think the commitment at York showed they had put it behind them.

I can only apologise to those of you who made the long journey to have to stand in pouring rain and watch us lose in the F.A. Cup. It must have been hard to take.

We are trying to bring new players into the club, but it is difficult at this moment in time. I am hoping, if not by today, we will have somebody for next Saturday. You will have seen I tried to bring Steve Whitehall from Mansfield and Burnley's Paul Barnes, and I think we need a forward to pep up our drive for promotion. In the programme for the Burnley match, which most of you won't have seen, I looked back on the first half of the campaign.

I think a fair reflection, like a school half-term report, is that we have done well, but can do even better.

I don't think we have had our fair share of luck when you look at some of the things which have gone against us, and here I am talking about refereeing decisions at critical times in matches, some of the crazy goals we have conceded and also injuries which have disrupted us.

There is a saying that luck evens itself out over the course of a season, and I sincerely hope that is true. Without wishing to tempt fate, I don't think it could be as bad in the second half of the campaign.

I think there is enough ability and confidence in the club to sustain a promotion bid, though realistically the play-offs is the best we can hope for at this stage.

Obviously we don't need many more injuries like

the one suffered by Carl Serrant playing for England under 21's which is likely to keep him out for several more weeks.

We need our better players, and Carl has had a terrific season and richly deserved his England call-up and the injury was something we could have done without.

I would say the plus points have been that we have mounted a promotion challenge without spending any money - other clubs have spent massive amounts for this level - and we have looked a solid side.

We have had opportunites to have won every game home or away, apart from Fulham, and really should have collected more points than we have done so.

Paul Reid has been outstanding in midfield where Paul Rickers has also done well. Richard Graham and Doug Hodgson have struck up a tremendous partnership in defence and Gary Kelly has been in a different class since returning from injury.

We will have to be at our best this afternoon because Luton, despite their troubles, have not lost away since the end of September. This, coupled with us being unbeaten at home, should make for a cracking game.

Nick Owen doesn't believe he is as mad as a Hatter to be a lifelong Luton

The former host of breakfast television's "Good Morning with Ann and Nick" feels football would benefit if supporters backed their local club instead of latching on to the glamour teams.

Berkhamstead-born Nick declared: "I feel more passion for Luton Town than any Manchester United fan does for their team. They are in my blood. "I acknowledge we need a bigger ground which offers uninterrupted views, but despite its faults Kenilworth Road is a homely and friendly place." Nick added that he hopes the Government inquiry will sanction the goahead for a new ground which he believes will be the club's making. Luton have unveiled grandiose plans for the "Kohlerdome" with a permanent roof and a pitch which can be removed so other functions can be held inside the stadium.




"It will be fantastic if it comes off and I am sure it will attract more support because of the facilities. They are very poor at Kenilworth Road which is really hemmed in and, for starters, parking is nigh impossible around the

Nick, who in '98 celebrates 40 years watching Luton, is disappointed by Luton's dreadful League showing this season.

The 50-year old cites a crippling injury list as the main reason for the dramatic decline as they fight to hold on to their Second Division status. It is a remarkable turnabout to last season when they were denied promotion in the play-offs after finishing third.

"We were the classiest side in the Second Division and ought to have gone up. Perhaps we needed to toughen up a little," he explained. Since Nick began watching the Hatters in 1958/59 season it has been a real roller-coaster ride as he has seen them play in all four divisions.





Indeed Nick, who now lives in Birmingham, kicked off his Luton days with the club on Luton reached the F.A. Cup Final losing 2-1 to Nottingham Forest at Wembley, a day he

He said: "I was at boarding school so couldn't go to the Final. I watched the game on a black and white television bedecked in Luton colours and was heartbroken at the

Nick's debut came the previous August when Father Bertie took him to see the 1-1 home draw against Leeds United.

Luton, who had finished eighth in the First Division in 1957/58, were relegated in 1960 and by 1965 had plummeted to the Fourth.

"It was a very depressing period and it wasn't until the late 1960's that a revival began under Allan Brown's management," he explained.

Brown, ironically, scored the goal in Nick's first-ever match, and it was he who took them up to the Third Division.

Bruce Rioch was the hero of that era and later in the heady days under Alec Stock it was Malcolm MacDonald.

MacDonald was bought as a full-back from Fulham and converted by Stock into one of the deadliest strikers of his generation and later he was to become a full England

Nick explained: "It is a thrill that these heroes of my youth are now friends. Soon I am hoping to do a documentary about Malcolm's eventful life.

"The MacDonald era was very exciting but, as today, it has always been a case of having to sell to survive. That will remain so long as we have such a tiny ground and small crowds.

"You could make a formidable side from the players now at other clubs - John Hartson, Mark Pembridge, Paul Telfer, Iain Dowie and Tim Breaker readily spring to mind." Harry Haslam eventually guided Luton back to the First Division, but only for one season in 1974/75.

He remembered the emergence of the Futcher twins, Paul and Ron, who both later went on to play for Latics.

Nick pinpoints David Pleat's first spell at the club during the glorious eighties as arguably the best era of his years as a Hatter.

There were two returns to Wembley for Littlewoods Cup Final appearances with the 1988 victory against Arsenal his proudest moment.

Nick said: "It was a fantastic match which we won with virtually the last kick of the match. We had been 2-1 down when Andy Dibble saved a penalty which, had Arsenal scored, would surely have sealed victory.

"We should have retained the cup the following season after being in the lead against Nottingham Forest."

Nick remembers Brian Horton, Jimmy Ryan and Alan West from the early eighties as being favourites and later it was Brian Stein, Ricky Hill and Mick Harford who were the stars of the side.

But, he doesn't forget unsung heroes such as David Preece, a player he says never received the acclaim he deserved, David Moss, Mal Donaghy, Steve Foster, Les Sealey

Nick's move to Birmingham was brought about because that was where breakfast television was broadcast. It means a 180-mile round trip for home matches along with

In the past Nick has missed many matches because of his heavy work schedule. But as host of the weekday programme Midlands Tonight he is free each weekend. Nick added that it was a great thrill when Luton created the "Nick Owen Lounge" in his honour as was being asked to become president of the supporters club.

As for treasured possessions he said a limited edition print of Kenilworth Road from his son was the best Christmas present he has ever received.

Nick who fronted ITV's coverage of the 1988 Olympic Games and 1990 World Cup also has a special paperweight which incorporates a piece of Luton's former plastic pitch. Nick who also appears on ITV's Wish You Were Here and hosts Royal Film Premiers concluded by saying another cherished moment was interviewing the late Eric Morecambe on breakfast television.

He said: "Eric was on the programme at various times over a two-hour period and it was one of the happiest interviews I have conducted.

"He stayed on for two hours after the show and we had a great time but, sadly, 40 days later he was dead.

Wrexham innocently became embroiled in a refeering controversy at the end of their F.A. Cup third-round tie at Premiership club Wimbledon.

Referee Steve Dunn blew the final whistle a split second before Marcus Gayle's header found the net.

It would have been the match-winning goal for Wimbledon as the game ended goalless as plucky Wrexham last season's cup quarter-finalists lived to fight another day. The incident brought back memories of the 1978 World Cup in Argentina when Clive Thomas's whistle denied Brazil a winning goal against Sweden.

In the furure that followed FIFA advised referees that full time should only be signalled before a corner is taken or after it is cleared or scored from, not during the flight of the ball as occurred with Neal Ardley's corner.

Dunn issued a statement saying "As the ball went out of play the 45 minutes, plus time added on for stoppages, were up. When the ball was returned to the field of play I blew

Grimsby continued their cup exploits by soundly beating First Division Norwich City 3-0, and could even afford to miss a penalty.

It has been a memorable campaign for the Mariners who defeated Sheffield Wednesday and holders Leicester in the Coca-Cola Cup before bowing out at Liverpool.

Grimsby, after a disappointing start to their League campaign, are suddenly coming good and firmly in the fray for a play-off place.

Sheffield Wednesday are clearly uncomfortable against Second Division opponents as they were held 1-1 at Watford in the third round of the cup.

They was little joy for the other Second Division sides as Wigan crashed out at neighbours Blackburn, Fulham at Tottenham, Northampton at Leicester, Preston at home by Stockport and, of course, Latics at minnows Cardiff.

Bristol Rovers drew 1-1 at home to Ipswich Town and the replay took place after these notes were written as also applied to the rescheduled ties involving Bournemouth and Huddersfield at Dean Court and Walsall who were at Peterborough.

The draw fro the fourth round of the F.A. Cup still largely needed to be resolved, though Grimsby have a plum tie at Leeds United.

Carlisle, battling against relegation, have agreed a nursery-club partnership with premiership club Derby County which mirrors the arrangement struck between

The immediate dividend for Derby is that they have been able to steal a march on the clubs trying to sign exciting 20-year-old forward Matt Jansen. He is one of the division's hottest properties along with Latics' Carl Serrant until the latter's recent injury. Jansen and the equally talented prospect Rory Delap are to spend time training with Derby and a £3 million double transfer remains a distinct possibility.

Carlisle have also benefitted by taking Derby's Nick Wright, a reserve forward, on loan. Watford and Bristol City remain the team's to beat at the top of the Second Division as the pair continue to set a scorching pace.

Bottom-club Burnley provided a glimmer of hope that Watford can be caught as they defeated the leaders 2-0 at Turf Moor.

It will still take an almighty slip-up for these clubs not to win the two automatic

Bristol City, who have been hit by injury troubles, splashed out a six-figure sum for Aston Villa middle player Scott Murray to beef up their challenge.

It's anybody's guess who will land play-off places with only 11 points separating them from the bottom four relegation places.

Club's certainly appear to be pushing out the boat in their efforts to ensure they finish in

Northampton, promoted last season but still in the hands of administrators, are one

They splashed out £75,000 for Middlesbrough reserve striker Chris Freestone, captured former Ipswich and Tottenham player Jason Dozzell on a short-term contract with a view to a permanent deal, paid £20,000 for former Bury and Barnsley defender Charlie Bishop and have taken Birmingham's Paul Tait on loan.

Millwall have added to their collection of strikers by signing Sheffield United's Aussie Carl Veart in a £100,000 deal.

Billy Bonds earlier this season spent around £600,000 on strikers Paul Wilkinson (Barnsley), Paul Shaw (Arsenal) and Kim Grant (Luton), but so far the Lions have yet to sound an ominous roar to the rest of the division.

Chesterfield have captured Gerry Creaney on loan from Manchester City in a bid to

Creaney had an excellent spell at Burnley earlier in the season, though his goals could not haul them away from the drop zone.

It has been surprisingly quiet on the transfer front at Fulham who have spent over £5 million - a colossal sum - since Kevin Keegan and Ray Wilkins were installed as the managerial team. They too, are beginning to look good bets for a play-off place. Southend, battling against relegation for the second successive season, pulled off a coup by signing Neville Southall on loan from Everton where he was starring in the Premiership until recently.

When you are down on your luck little goes your way as Southend have discovered with inspirational midfielder Mike Marsh, the former Liverpool player, being forced to retire

There was also a managerial casualty earlier this week when Preston parted company with Gary Peters by mutual consent.

Preston have had a disappointing season. They are currently 17th and Saturday's home defeat by Gillingham signalled the parting of the ways, though Peters has been offered a youth development post at Deepdale which he is considering.

Assistant manager David Moyes takes charge until at least the end of the season.



Jurgen Klinsmann

Headline Maker

Struggling Tottenham Hotspur are hoping the arrival of world synonomous German striker Jurgen Klinsmann can kickstart their season and lead the relegation battling club to Premiership safety.

The 33-year-old international's return has been hailed with euphoria from the White Hart Lane faithful, who believe that he can resurrect a season that currently sees their side languishing in the relegation zone.

The rewards for Klinsmann, who is in his second spell at

It is rumoured he could collect up to #1 million, including bonuses, if Spurs avoid relegation. That is a small price the club would be willing to pay when you consider the cost of the drop in modern football, which would more than likely see the striker leaving as he only signed a short

Also, in terms of the popularity of the marketable striker, who Spurs' merchandising manager Kay Lyons considers to be 'the man with the midas touch', his return is likely to bring a financial windfall to the club as fans rush to have Klinsmann No.33 printed on their shirts.

Klinsmann built up a good rapport with the fans the last time he played in England, three years ago, and that was one of the main reasons why he came back for more.

"The fans helped make up my mind," he said. "I had a fantastic year last time around and it appears they have never forgotten me - and neither have I stopped feeling for them and this club."

The hopes of so many people rest on the German but it is a pressure which does not worry him. He explains: "It is a wonderful challenge for me. I will put in everything I possibly can."

But he must recapture the form which won him the Footballer of the Year award during his last spell at White Hart Lane if he is to stand any chance of ensuring the club's survival.

In that one season, Klinsmann scored 29 goals and helped Tottenham reach the semi-finals of the FA Cup, where they lost to Everton. However, recently, his form in Italy's Serie A with Sampdoria this season has been far from consistent.

An ankle injury limited his appearances and, with only two goals to his name, he found himself confined to the substitutes bench. Therefore, now the pressure is on him more so to prove that his glory days are not over. Klinsmann disagrees: "I don't see a danger in coming back a second time. I am already captain of the German national side, so to cope with the pressure is not a problem for me. I am used to expectations being high." He is also confident that he can help the team out of their

current crisis. "I have experience and I am the kind of player who likes to push his team mates and give them a lot of mental support. I see it as a very good chance to help the team come up the league because I don't think they deserve to be down where

Tottenham chairman Alan Sugar was furious when Klinsmann departed in an acrimonious move to Bayern Munich last time around after serving just one year for Tottenham. So, it was a surprise to everyone when Sugar authorised the re-signing of the German striker.

"It was all a long time ago and it is all water under the bridge," explains Sugar. "I'm very pleased to have Jurgen back, you couldn't get anyone better to bring the good spirit back and we know he can score goals."

Another pleased to see his return is former Spurs' manager Gerry Francis — although for him it is too late.

"It's a great move that will give the club a great lift," he explained. "He's still a very good player who will be involved with Germany in the World Cup finals. He will also help a lot of the younger players who perhaps need a bit of leadership and experience. Klinsmann's international career began in 1987 when he made his debut for West Germany against Brazil, and since then he has become a major influence in the nation's success which saw them win the 1990 World Cup and 1996 European Championships. His time at Bayern Munich went well for two seasons, when he scored 30 goals, but after falling out with coach Giovanni Trapattoni, he returned to Italy with Sampdoria.

But just two starts into his new Spurs career, Klinsmann is clear of the extent of the problems facing the club, who are in the midst of an injury crisis ruling out the likes of Darren Anderton. Les Ferdinand and Chris Armstrong.

"I have never known anything like it at any club I have played for." he said. "I didn't think the situation would be so bad." Klinsmann has proven he is an exceptional finisher, but it remains to be seen whether Spurs have the players, who can remain fit, to provide Klinsmann with chances on which he can thrive. The team has changed a lot since Klinsmann's last visit and there is no longer a Sheringham or Barmby for the blonde-haired German to feed off.

However, there are still several months to go in the season and Klinsmann certainly has the experience and talent to pull Tottenham out of the slump. And if he does, what is to say he will not extend his present six month contract with the club.

Relegated at the end of the 1995-96 season, Luton Town were marked down as one of the favourites to bounce straight back into the First Division the following year.



Davis (29) was with Southampton as a teenager. After loan spells with Burnley and Notts County he was transferred to Turf Moor on a permanent basis in 1991 and played over 200 games for the Clarets before making the move to Luton for £750,000 in 1995.

White (21) a native of Darlington, arrived from Middlesbrough in the close season of 1997 where he had been reserve to so many talented defenders. He is slowly emerging as a fine player.

Left full-back Thomas (33) has an England 'B' cap in his locker (gained with Spurs). Born in Luton, he started his career at Kenilworth Road in 1982 and then served with Tottenham and West Ham United before returning to the

Hatters in 1993. A strong footballer, he can also play in the centre of defence.

In midfield Luton are now relying on the experience of Gary Waddock, the determination of Paul McLaren, the running and marksmanship of David Oldfield and the work-rate of on-loan winger Chris Allen.

Waddock (35) has been in top-class football 18 years. He has 21 Republic of Ireland caps to his credit and more than 600 appearances at club level. Since

> making his League debut with Q.P.R. back in 1979 he has served with Millwall, Q.P.R. (again), Swindon Town (on loan), Bristol Rovers, Charleroi in Belgium and of course Luton, whom he joined in 1994.

McLaren (21) has graduated through the ranks at Kenilworth Road. He was born in High Wycombe and joined the Hatters as a junior in 1992, turning professional three years ago. He has now made over 50 senior appearances.

Oldfield (29) was born in Perth, Australia and played his early football with Luton (1986-89), he then assisted Manchester City, Leicester City and Millwall (on loan) before returning to Kenilworth Road for a second spell in 1995. Down the years Oldfield has scored over 70 goals in more than 400 senior appearances - and he's played once for England's under 21 side.

After failing to hold down a regular place in Nottingham Forest's first XI, Allen opted for a loan spell with Luton and he's doing a fine job. Born in 1972, he played for his home town club Oxford United before joining Forest for £300,000 in 1996, after a short period on loan. He is fast, tricky and packs a fine shot. In-form Graham Alexander and Tony Thorpe are Luton's two main strikers.

Alexander, 26 from Coventry, played for Scunthorpe United before joining the Hatters in a £100,000 deal in 1995. He is tough, keen and exciting and has played

more than 100 games for Luton.

Thorpe (23) comes from Leicester. He was a junior at Filbert Street before turning professional with Luton Town in 1992. An excellent goalscorer, he has now netted almost 50 goals in less than 150 games for the Hatters.

In reserve and likely to be on the subs' bench today are former Manchester United starlet Simon Davies, who joined Luton last summer and teenagers Andrew Fotiades and Matthew Spring, both whom are highly thought of at Kenilworth Road.

VISITING MANAGER

Lennie Lawrence became Luton Town's seventh manager in the last 20 years when he took office at Kenilworth Road in December 1995. He never played professional football, choosing to serve a cluster of amateur clubs, namely Croydon, Carshalton Athletic and Sutton United. He

was assisant-manager/coach at both Plymouth Argyle and Lincoln City and to date, besides the Hatters, he has taken charge of Plymouth (in a caretaker capacity in 1978. Charlton Athletic (1982-91), Middlesbrough and Bradford City. During his time at The Valley he guided Charlton to the runners-up spot in Division Two in 1986 having earlier led the Pilgrims to promotion from Division Three (1981).

DISABLED SUPPORTER SURVEY

The Football trust, in conjunction with McDonald's Restaurant Ltd, has published the results of a national survey of facilities for supporters with disabilities at FA Premier League, Football League and Scottish Premier Division grounds.

The research scheme was launched in February of this year with the aim of highlighting those clubs who have provided the highest standards of facilities for their disabled supporters. The aims were to look at how facilities have improved since the last survey of this nature was carried out in 1992 and what improvements are still required.

The report assesses the nature and extent of facilities for supporters with disabilities and highlights examples of good practice at professional clubs.

In conjunction with the survey the Football Trust launched their "National Guide to Disabled Football Supporters Facilities", a pocked size club-by-club guide to facilities.

The research and the guide provides an invaluable and enlightening source of information on the facilities currently on offer at grounds throughout the country.

YOUR RIGHT TO CRITICISE

A message to all supporters from Latics' Safety Officer Frank Carlisle.

One of the most difficult but less obvious aspects of crowd management to resolve is when a spectator or group of spectators critisises either a particular player, the team in general, the manager or the Board of the Club.

What's wrong with critisism? you may ask and not unreasonably so. What is wrong with critisism is when it goes too far and reaches a point when it starts to interfere with other spectators who may feel more inclined to offer support through a difficult period for whoever is concerned.

'Going too far' in my view is when the critisism becomes constant and perhaps abusive to the point when other spectators become unsettled by the behavior.

Every spectator has a right to an opinion and the right to express that view. Balanced against this is the right of every spectator to be allowed to watch the football and not be disturbed or unsettled by the 'constant critic'.

In the event of receiving such a complaint the stewards are instructed to ask the person at the source of the complaint to moderate his/her behavior. Failure to respond to this request will probably result in that person being asked to leave the ground. This is because the next stage of the conflicting views is likely to be a disturbance which could threaten the safety of spectators in that area.

No-one, from the Chairman downwards, wishes to stop supporters expressing their opinions but over-riding this is the need to ensure the safety of ALL spectators., and this is the major responsibility of any football club in the country. So, criticise if you must, but please be mindful of the views of other fans near you and respect their right to support rather than criticise.

Every complaint of such behavior will be dealt with on merit but in the end safety has to be the deciding factor. Enjoy your football. Frank Carlisle.







I had recovered from a niggling calf strain which had kept me out for five weeks. Barnsley reserves had no game for some time so when Neil Warnock inquired about a replacement for the injured Carl Serrant, Danny Wilson told him he was prepared to let me go, primarily to get fit.

Is there any likelihood of the transfer becoming permanent?

I am here for one month, and after that who knows what might happen. I suppose much depends on how quickly Carl recovers so I can only take one game at a time. My contract at Barnsley

expires at the end of the season and it remains to be seen whether I am offered a new deal. I am open minded and coming to Oldham will do me no harm whatever happens.

Do you have a lot of competition at Barnsley for the left back/wing back spot?

Danny Wilson has strengthened the squad so he has cover for all positions. He spent £750,000 for Bristol City's Darren Barnard who started the season in the side. I had to wait for my chance but, when it came, I did well until getting injured and losing it again.

How did you find your debut at Preston on Boxing Day?

It was my first match of any description for around six weeks so obviously I tired. I found the pace quick and the ball rarely seemed dead with players from both sides chucking long throws into the penalty areas. I found the standard good and judging from what I have seen so far it will take a good team to get out of this division. I simply hope I can help push Oldham up the table during my time

Didn't you know Neil Warnock from earlier in your career?

Neil was managing Scarborough and I was in the side which won promotion from the Conference to the Football League which were heady days. Barnet were the favourites to go up but we pipped them and it was a great achievement because we hadn't been fancied.

What are the qualities of the manager having twice served him?

Neil's great strength is that he creates a good spirit within the club. That was the case at Scarborough and when I arrived here that also struck me immediately. He had a big influence on my career because the team and myself went on to greater things at Scarborough. I also enjoy the training which is varied and not dour and a chore which it has been elsewhere.

In the non-League days did you have a job outside the game?

I had been an apprentice at Nottingham Forest and professional at Hull before drifting out of League football. While playing for Scarborough I also worked as a sales rep for brewers Whitbreads and also a disposable nappy company.

WHO'S COMING -WHO'S GOING, RING LATICS CLUBCALL 0891 12 11 42

Was it a rude awakening having to do normal work?

Strangely I really enjoyed the jobs but when Scarborough won promotion to the League the opportunity arose to go back full time which I didn't need asking twice to do.

You must be one of a select band who have played at the highest level as well as part-time?

I was fortunate to play in the Premiership for Ipswich and we managed to stay there for three season which was a great experience. Amazingly the game against Preston was the first I have played in the Second Division. I have now appeared in all four division as well as the Conference

I believe you have an impressive record of helping teams win promotion?

I have been fortunate to be involved in four promotion campaigns and there is no greater feeling than helping a team go up. Hull were promoted from the Fourth Division, Scarborough into the League, Ipswich from the First to the Premiership in its first year and finally Barnsley last season.

What was it like playing for Barnsley whose rise to the Premiership was something of a footballing fairytale?

Barnsley has had a tough time with the closure of the mines and unemployment rife, so the football club's success has given the whole town a lift as nobody ever expected them to reach the top division for the first time in the club's history. There are 16,000 seasonticket holders so the ground is packed for every match and there is always a fantastic atmosphere. I just hope we can survive which would be an incredible achievement. We have clawed our way back to the pack, though we remain bottom, I don't think we have played that badly but at that level you get punished for making mistakes. We have given away some bad goals and found opponents are lethal in the last third of the field.

Describe the highlights of your career?

I won four caps for England's semi-professional side the season Scarborough went into the League, and I was proud to represent my country. I was named in the PFA all-star team for the Fourth Division while still at Scarborough, while Ipswich reached the quarter-finals of both the FA Cup and Coca-Cola Cup in the same season.

Which managers have influenced your career most?

Neil Warnock at Scarborough because that is where it took off. John Lyall, the former West Ham manager, was a wily character during my time at Ipswich, while Danny Wilson for his achievements at Barnsley and the way he plays the game.

As you are 34 years of age how long do you think you can continue playing?

I don't see any reason why I cannot go on for two or three more years. I am still fit, though the older you get you tend to pick up more niggly injuries I have been fortunate to have no major injury and I don't feel ready to hang up my boots. I think players nowadays look after themselves better than they have ever done, and I think that is why they play a lot longer. John Wark was still playing for Ipswich at the age of 37 and, though not fantastically mobile, there was nobody better at reading the game. You need a mix of youth and experience which has been the case in all the promotion-winning sides, and we also have that mix here which I hope bodes well for the remainder of the season.




