WYCOMBE BUCK THE TREND

he ironies of cup draws have not entirely favoured our league progress this season having been drawn against Wycombe in two competitions played immediately before Nationwide League fixtures against them. We won through in the cup matches but have failed to defeat Wycombe in the

This was a disappointing result coming. as it did, after four straight league wins. Martin Thomas and Darren Freeman, the heroes of our midweek Auto Windscreens Shield victory started on the bench: Kyle Lightbourne made his debut after joining on loan from Coventry and with Robbie Herrera injured and missing his first league match this season. Matthew Lawrence switched to left back.

We started slowly and it was 14 minutes before we tested the Wycombe defence. Paul Peschisolido received the ball wide just inside the penalty area, turned sharply and crossed to Paul Trollope, who had made ground quickly, and was inches wide with a header. Maik Taylor was soon in the action as Wycombe earned midfield possession and after 25 minutes Simpson played the ball towards goal, Harkin flicked-on, and Steve Brown had his shot well smothered by Taylor.

A three man move involving Neil Smith, Paul Bracewell and Pesch led to a shot from Kyle Lightbourne which was deflected by a Wycombe defender for a g o a l

Shortly after, a cross from McAnespie was turned round the post by Forsyth again at the expense of a goal kick!! Released from defensive pressures. Wycombe nearly stole the lead after 31 minutes when the ball was played across the box from the left flank.

Harkin's initial shot was blocked, but when the ball was returned, Steve Brown headed against the bar and shortly after, Michael Simpson shot over having been set up by ex Fulham junior David Carroll.

The second half began at a brisker pace and we wrested control in midfield, but



while the build up play was satisfactory, too often the final ball lacked the penetration necessary to undo a determined Wycombe side. On 58 minutes, a through ball by Bracewell gave Pesch a sight of the goal but his shot was just wide of the right hand post. Darren Freeman replaced Neil Smith as we continued to dictate the pace but it was Pesch who fed Lightbourne whose shot on-the-turn from outside the area was blocked. After 81 minutes another Lightbourne shot was, this time, well saved by Martin Taylor in the Wycombe goal and, as the game drew towards the close, Taylor

made a splendid save to keep out a fierce effort from Steve Hayward after Paul Trollope had paved the way with a break down the left wing.

With our closest rivals all winning their matches, we slipped to sixth position but look forward to regaining winning ways at Luton, and to repeating the dose tonight against the same opponents.

MOODY GETS A HATTERS-TRICK

ulham achieved a third successive away win on a ground where recent success has been somewhat limited. The previous eleven League visits having yielded just a single win back in the Best-Marsh era of 1976.

The return of Paul Moody, back after a one match suspension was a not insignificant factor in the collection of three points, but in truth the whole team played their part in another splendid away day for the 2,000 Fulham faithful present amongst the 8,366 crowd.

The return of Moody meant one change to the Cottagers line up which had faced Wycombe, Steve McAnespie standing down. There were also a change on the bench with the inclusion of our new £400,000 signing Wayne Collins. Luton also made one change to their line up from the team that had lost at Oldham with Paul McLaren returning to first team action.

Barely had the Fulham fans taken their seats than they were up and cheering the opening goal after just 48 seconds. Maik Taylor aimed a long kick deep into Luton territory, finding Moody in the inside right position. The former Oxford striker held off the attentions of a Luton challenge to fire smartly past Feuer.

Luton suffered another blow four minutes later when after a lengthy spell of treatment, defender Alan White was carried off, having fallen awkwardly following a Moody challenge. Former Manchester United trainee Simon Davies replaced White.

Though Luton probably had as much first half possession and certainly looked dangerous when Allen raided on the left flank it was Fulhan who created the scoring changes. Peschisolido almost scored with a shot which drifted inches past an upright and both Moody and Pesch had shots blocked by the Hatters' American goalkeeper Feuer, whose handling at times looked more than a little nervous.

Fulham increased the lead after 37 minutes with Moody again the marksman, scoring with a close range header after a super cross from the right by Bracewell. Luton, for whom Oldfield had earlier rapped the base of a post, then came close when Allen surged through to fire a shot at Taylor.

The Fulham lead might have increased further after Moody skilfully played himself behind the Luton defence to pull the back back for Trollope, the former Derby man failed to connect properly before Patterson gratefully conceded a corner.

Luton's best spell of the match came just prior to the interval and with a little luck the Hatters could have squared things in the final five minutes of the half. But they had to be content with just a single goal in the 43rd minute. McLaren surged forward running around thirty vards before delivering an inch perfect pass to Thorpe who neatly tucked his shot inside the post

The fight Luton showed prior to the break appeared missing after the restart and Fulham re-established their two goal advantage early in the second half when Moody completed his hat trick after 53 minutes. Lawrence made a fine run forward to the edge of the box before releasing a short pass to Trollope whose chest high cross was handled by

Davis. Referee Mathieson pointed without hesitation to the penalty spot.

With regular penalty taker Mark Blake on the bench, Moody stepped forward to score from the spot. Moods was a regular penalty taker during his spell at Oxford and in scoring he became the first Fulham player to score a hat trick since Mike Conroy put three pest Swansea in an FA Cup tie in Nov. 1995.

The Fulham faithful got their first glimpse of Wayne Collins after 58 minutes when he Paul replaced Peschisolido. Two minutes later it was 4-1. Bracewell began the move which led to the defence Luton being pulled completely out of posi-Trollope tion. crossed to an unmarked Hayward who steered in goal number four.

With the game now effectively won Fulham continued to dominate and Wavne Collins whose early touches were impressive, might have had a debut goal with ten minutes remaining. They say goalkeepers are mad! And quite where Feuer was going when he raced out to dispossess Trollope was anyone's guess. The ex Derby man cooly lobbed a pass over the stranded keeper but Collins was unable to steer his header into goal and Luton were lucky not to concede a fifth. Darren Freeman came on to replace the injured but impressive Kyle Lightbourne with seven minutes

The win moved Fulham up into 3rd place. There is still plenty of time yet for the Cottagers to chip away at the points advantage currently held by Bristol City and Watford though Luton in 19th position are just twelve points behind. Still very much all to play for.

Although the above points have been raised previously, at this moment in time whilst you are revamping the Matchday Programme I feel these matters should be included on say a "players news page" or! similar.



Despite their League position, Luton have already won away from home on four occasions this season and the Oldham defeat was their first League reverse away from Kenilworth Road since September. Victories have been gained at Carlisle (1-0), York (2-1), Millwall (2-0) and Southend (2-1).

Luton have made a couple of signings since their last visit including Northern

Ireland international Phil Gray who returned to Kenilworth Road from Fortuna Sittard in September. Middlesbrough defender Alan White arrived in the same month. The leading Luton marksman is once again Tony Thorpe who has 13 League goals this season.

Luton have enjoyed mixed fortunes in cup competition this season. In the FA Cup the Hatters made a shock 1st round exit losing 1-0 at home to Torquay.

Colchester were beaten in the Coca Cola Cup but West Brom proved too strong for the Bedfordshire outfit, clinching a 5-3 aggregate win in Round 2. Luton reached tonight's tie courtesy of a 2-1 home win over Brentford.

Luton Town were formed in 1885 and were members of the Southern League before their election to Division Three in 1920. They have enjoyed three spells in the top division,the first spell came

Lennie Lawrence Appointed Dec 1995

An experienced Manager. Lennie took over from Terry Westley midway through the 1995/96 season but was unable to prevent Luton slipping into Division Two. Lennie is best remembered for his lengthy spell as Chartton boss between 1982 and 1991 when, against all the odds, he took the club into the top flight in 1986, keeping the south London side there for four years .

After leaving Chartton he became Manager of Middlesbrough leading them to promotion in his first season. Sadly the Teesside club fell back into Division One and **Lennie departed for Bradford** in 1994. As a player he represented Croydon, Carshalton and Sutton United.

between 1955 and 1960, they returned in 1974 for one season and more recently held top flight status between 1982 and 1992. Their best

League performance came in 1986/87
when they finished 7th in Division One.
Luton's only major honour came in
1988 when they won the League Cup.
It was a memorable victory achieved in

Fulham have a good record against Luton at Craven Cottage having won 16 of the 23 league games to date. The Hatters were also beaten here in an FA Cup tie in 1964. More recently the teams met in Coca Cola Cup 1st round action in 1994. Both games ended 1-1 prompting a penalty shoot out which Fulham won 4-3, goalkeeper Jim Stannard making the vital save.

IAN FEUER (below) - American international goalkeeper who first arrived in the UK in 1993 when he joined West Ham. Made his League debut on loan with Peterborough toward the end of the 1994/95 season. Joined Luton initially on loan before signing permanently for £580,000 in December 1995. First choice last season but suffered a serious injury early this season.



KELVIN DAVIS - Highly rated young goalkeeper who has won England hon-ours at both under 21 and youth level. Made his debut in the final match of the 1993/94 season at Stoke. Recalled from loan at Hartlepool early this season to deputise for the injured lan Feuer.

DEFENDERS

- STEVE DAVIS Joined Luton from STEVE DAVIS - Joined Luton from Burnley in the summer of 1995 for £750,000.An experienced defender who began as a Southampton trainee signing professional in 1988. Did not gain a regular first team spot at the Dell and was loaned out to Burnley and Notts Co. Returned to Turf Moor on a permanent basis in 1991.
- JULIAN JAMES Has completed ten years at Kenilworth Road since first appearing in a Luton shirt during the 1987/88 season. Now has over 250 League appearances to his credit. Loaned to Preston in 1993. Former England under 21 international.
- MARVIN JOHNSON Experienced defender who has been a consistent member of the Luton side for a number of years. Came through the youth side before signing professional terms in 1985. A member of the victorious League Cup winning side of 1988. Almost 250 league appearances to his
- DARREN PATTERSON Northern Ireland international defender who began his career with West Brom before making his name at Wigan and Crystal Palace. Luton paid £200.000 for his services in August 1995. Loaned to Preston in 1996.
- MITCHELL THOMAS Experienced defender who has won England honours at youth, under 21 and B International level. Now back at the club where he first made his mark having re-signed for the Hatters on a free transfer in November 1993. His first spell at Luton came between 1982 and 1986 when he joined Tottenham for £233,000. A member of the Spurs side which lost the FA Cup Final to Coventry in 1987. Spent three seasons at West Ham before returning to Luton.
- ALAN WHITE Joined the Hatters from Middlesbrough in September 1997 for £40,000. Was signed for Boro as a teenager by Lenny Lawrence having signed schoolboy forms with Derby. Made his Luton debut v West Brom in the Coca Cola Cup in September 1997.

MIDFIELDERS

- GRAHAM ALEXANDER A £100.000 signing from Scunthorpe in July 1995.
 Made his Iron debut v Chesterfield in
 April 1991 going on to make almost
 200 first team appearances at
 Glanford Park. Missed just one
 League match last season.
- SIMON DAVIES Welsh international midfielder who cost £150,000 from Manchester United this summer. The fee will rise to £250,000 depending on appearances. Previously on loan with Exeter.
- SEAN EVERS Another product of the Luton youth scheme. Made his first team debut in an Anglo Italian Cup match against Perugia. Sean made just one League appearance last season. Looking for a more regular chance this season.
- PAUL McLAREN Former trainee who made the breakthrough into regular first team action last season when he made 24 League appearances. signed professional in July 1993. Proved an able deputy in the absence of more experienced midfielders last season.
- PAUL SHOWLER Ex Coine Dynamoes and Altrincham player who was a member of the Barnet side which entered the League back in 1991. Released when Barnet suffered a financial crisis in 1993, he joined Bradford on a free transfer and was a member of the Bantams side which earned promotion to Division One in 1996. Joined Luton for £50,000 in August 1996.
- GARY WADDOCK Veteran midfielder who started his career with OPR scoring his first ever League goal at Craven Cottage in January 1980. A member of the QPR side which reached the FA Cup Final in 1982 and won promotion to the top flight the following season. After a spell in Belgium with Charleroi he joined Millwall in 1990. Has also had spells at Swindon (loan), QPR and Bristol Rovers before joining Luton on a free transfer in December 1994.

FORWARDS

CHRIS ALLEN - Wide left sided player currently on loan from Nottingham Forest, Former England under 21 international who spent six seasons with Oxford before joining Forest for £300.000 in July 1996 following a loan spell the previous season.
