From the Chairman's office

BY way of a change I thought that you may appreciate my view on today's game, and enable the manager to concentrate on the job in hand.

Since we were last here. we have played away league games at Wrexham and Watford, and the Auto Windscreens Shield game at Bournemouth.

Wrexham was disappointing because of the length of journey that had to be made, and it's amzing how the drive lengthens when we have lost!

Watford, being a local derby and certainly not as far to travel, was more pleasing not only because I felt we were the better team over 90 minutes, but I felt that the sun was at last shining on us despite the disappointment of not having Steve Davis available due to tonsilitis.

The day was however marred as usual by the injury curse affecting Tony Thorpe - after a collision with Alec Chamberlain, Kelvin Davis - who injured his ankle in the first minute, and Marvin Johnson - who had a hamstring pull with only three minutes to go.

We were therefore starting the game against



Bournemouth on Tuesday without these key players, and although I could not fault the attitude of the players on the night, I do feel that the influence of some of our key players would have given us the result we would have wanted.

The final weeks of this season will be interesting on two fronts.

Firstly the team needs to collect some points to prevent the unthinkable, and the next two home games take on tremendous significance, as we strive to climb up the table to where we feel we ought to be.

And on the other hand we are still awaiting the outcome of our planning application.

On both fronts a positive result is vital for the future of this football club.

I always seem to be pontificating about money, but unfortunately the modern game centres around that commodity.

Having sat in the stand in recent weeks the directors hear the comments of the fans, and somehow we get the impression that the fans don't think we care.

Let me assure you that we have a board of directors who are totally and utterly committed to this football club, and give substantial amounts of their own time in order to further the club both on and off the pitch.

In addition to that the board have injected many millions of pounds into the club in an effort to make the club successful.

Whilst we do not expect all the supporters to make the same financial commitment towards the club, the realities of life in modern football prove that throwing huge quantities of money in player purchases does not not always work, and I suppose the board could be accused of acting like football supporters and not responsible businessmen.



But in our defence all decisions are taken with a view to what is best for Luton Town.

It is therefore vital that for the 90 minutes the players are on the pitch we support them totally - even if we go a goal down - because I assure vou they hear the comments and feel the pressure.

Our only aim is success. We need your support to achieve it. Without it we shall surely fail.

LUTON'S hopes of a Wembley appearance were ended by an 87th minute goal in Tuesday's southern area semi-final at Dean Court, writes Simon Oxlev.

Franck Rolling netted for the Cherries following a scamble in the six-vard box from a corner, and then Dwight Marshall was denied an 89th minute equaliser by lan Cox's goal-line clearance.


Marshall slid in to send Sean Evers' cross past Jimmy Glass in the Bournemouth goal, but Cox denied the Hatters the chance of 'Golden Goal' extra-time.

In the first-half, Simon Davies had seen his lob headed off the line by Neil Young, and Ian Feuer twice denied Christer Warren.

Davies was again close to opening the scoring on 65 minutes, but a minute later Bournemouth wasted a great chance when Jason Brissett headed Warren's left-wing cross wide from just four yards out.

Feuer then saved from Warren and John O'Neill, but with extratime beckoning so came the dramatic finale.

Walsall came from 1-0 down to win 2-1 at Barry Fry's Peterborough,

Miguel De Souza opened the scoring for Posh in the 57th

minute, but goals from French striker Roger Boli (80) and Michael Ricketts (81) sent the Saddlers through.

The northern area final will be between Burnley and Grimsby.

Burnley beat Preston 1-0 with a 39th minute goal from Andy Payton, whilst Grimsby beat Blackpool with a 77th minute winner from Burnett at Blundell Park.





Iffy Onuora stepped up as a second-half substitute to mastermind goals for rookie Jim Corbett, 17, and midfielder Nicky Southall.

But Bradford University graduate Onuora, 30, admitted his economics degree is doing little for his finances. Onuora is transfer-listed after refusing a new contract.

He said: I am not exactly asking the earth. But I have to put my family in Yorkshire first.

"For 18 months I have been living through the wek with my mother in north London. I see my kids only at weekends. That can't be right."

City, though, have taken only three points for the last 15. But Gils boss Tony Pulis said: "They'll go up comfortably."

City skipper Shaun taylor agreed after watching keeper Jim Stannard pull off a string of match-winning saves.

But Taylor said: "We just need a bit of luck to get us going again.

Gillingham's win followed their 2-0 victory at Watford the previous weekend.

City are 10 points clear of third-placed Northampton.

The Cobblers, along with Oldham and Grimsby in the chasing pack, won on Saturday - with Oldham's win coming against fellow play-off hopefuls Fulham.

SPOTLIGHT ON TODAY'S VISITORS

STUART NAYLOR - Goalkeeper who joined City at the start of 96/97 after spending 11 years at West Brom. Started his league career with Lincoln in 1980 before moving to The Hawthorns in 1986. After 400 appearances with the Baggies he lined up for his City debut at Gillingham on the opening day of last season.

KEITH WELCH - Goalkeeper whose career started withhis home-town club Bolton, before moving to Rochdale in 1987. In four years at Spotland he made well over 200 first-team appearances, and a £200,000 transfer fee brought him to Ashton Gate in July 1991. He won back the number one spot from Stuart Naylor at the end of last season and has now also made over 200 league appearances for the Robins.

MICKEY BELL - Defender who was snapped up by City in July for £150,000 from Wycombe, where he was last season's Player of the Year. Formerly with Northampton, and scored against the Hatters from the penalty spot in September's league meeting at Ashton Gate.

LOUIS CAREY - Progressed through the youth ranks at Ashton Gate, and enjoyed an impressive first season in 95/96 making 26 appearances.

SEAN DYCHE - Kettering-born player who made over 200 appearances for Chesterfield prior to his transfer to Ashton Gate in July for a tribunal-set fee of £275,000 which could rise to £325,000. Originally signed as a midfielder from Nottingham Forest in 1990, he was a key figure in Chesterfield's FA Cup success last term, but has suffered a succession of injuries since joining City.

ROB EDWARDS - Has represented Wales at youth, B, Under-21 and senior level, starting his professional career with Carlisle. Joined City for £135,000 in March 1991.

SCOTT PATERSON -

Aberdeen-born midfielder who started his career with Highland League side Cove Rangers. Joined Liverpool for £15,000 in March 1992, but in a twoyear spell at Anfield he failed to make the first team. Joined City on a free transfer.

MARK SHAIL - Signed from non-league Yeovil in March 1993 for £45,000 after gaining representative honours for England at semiprofessional level. Suffered a serious knee injury last season, but receovered to take his place in the play-offs at the end of the campaign. Has again suffered with injury this term.

SHAUN TAYLOR - Joined City from Swindon in September 1996, and has now clocked up 500 senior appearances after spells at Exeter and Swindon - winning a championship medal with the

JIM BRENNAN - Came to the club from Canadian club Sora Lazio in October 1994, and made seven appearances last term. Made an appearance in this season's derby with Bristol Rovers.

KEVIN LANGAN - Jersey-born defender who signed a professional contract in July last year after coming through City's Centre of Excellence.

MATT HEWLETT - Bristol-born midfielder who worked his way through the youth team to land a professional contract and made his senior debut in the 3-1 defeat at Wolves on the opening day of the 93/94 season. Has represented England at vouth level.

ADAM LOCKE - Midfielder who was freed by Colchester at the end of last season. Started his career at Crystal Palace, with a spell at Southend before joining Colchester in 1994.

GARY OWERS - Experienced midfielder who made over 300 appearances for Sunderland. making an FA Cup Final appearance in 1992. Moved to Ashton Gate in December 1994 for £300,000.

DWAYNE PLUMMER - 19-year-old midfielder who is another product of the club's youth policy, and captained the City youth side before signing a professional contract at Ashton Gate.

BRIAN TINNION - Started his league career with Newcastle in 1986, making 39 appearances in a three-year spell before a £150,000 move to Bradford. Joined City for £180,000 in 1993.

PAUL TISDALE - Former England youth international who joined the club from Southampton.

TOMMY DOHERTY - Bristol-born midfielder who came up through the ranks from YTS trainee, and broke into the first team last season in the FA Cup second round match, making a good impression in the 9-2 drubbing of St Albans. Making regular appearances this season.

SCOTT MURRAY - Signed from Aston Villa in December 1997 for an initial fee of £85,000, rising to £150,000 depending on appearances. Although he started his career as a striker at Villa Park, he has successfully converted to right wing-back/midfield. His first-team appearances were limited at Villa, after moving to the Midlands from Scottish non-leaguers Fraserburgh.

COLIN CRAMB - Centre-forward who ended last season as Doncaster Rovers' top scorer with 23 goals. A Scot who hails from Lanarkshire, his good form at his first club Hamilton secured a move to Southampton, where he made one first-team appearance. Further spells followed at Falkirk and Hearts, prior to his arrival at Belle Vue. A tribual-set fee of £150,000 brought him to Ashton Gate during July.

SHAUN GOATER - Bermudan international striker who started his career as a trainee at Manchester United. Joined Bristol City from Rotherham in the summer of 1996, after 86 goals in 262 appearances for the Millmoor club. Was City's top scorer with 25 goals last season, and has already netted 17 so far this term.

GREGORY GOODRIDGE - A Barbadian international who has captained his country on more than 30 occasions. Played for Barbados side Lambada WI before starting his career in England in 1994 with Torquay United. After some impressive outings for the Devon club he made a £100,000 move to QPR, but made just nine substitute appearances for the Londoners. Moved to Bristol City in the summer of 1996.

STEVE TORPEY - Islington-born striker who joined City for £400,000 from Swansea in August 1997. Previously with Millwall and Bradford, before moving to the Vetch Field.

DOMINIC BARCLAY - Bristol-born striker who has developed through City's youth ranks.

MEET THE MANAGER



JOHN WARD's playing career as a striker took him to Lincoln City, Warrington, Watford, Grimsby Town and back to Lincoln, totalling 282 appearances, scoring 100 goals.

On his retirement from playing, he joined Graham Taylor's Watford as coach, moving on to Aston Villa with Taylor to become assistant manager.

When Taylor moved to the England job, Ward became manager at York City, followed by a managerial stint at Bristol Rovers, before leaving for Turf Moor to assist then manager Adrian Heath at Burnley.

He became Bristol City's new manager following the departure of Joe Jordan at the end of March 1997.

He took his new charges into the play-offs with an impressive late run of results, but they came unstuck in the semi-finals losing over two legs to Brentford.

This season City, with Watford, have made the race for automatic promotion a two-horse race, with Ward taking his collection of Division Two Manager of the Month awards to six!

The Hatters and The Robins...

CLASHES with the Robins can be traced back to our earliest days in the Southern League, but our first games in the Football League took place in 1922/23, following City's relegation from Division Two.

A Kenilworth Road crowd of 12,000 turned up on December 2nd 1922 to see the Town do well to hold on to a point in a 1-1 draw.

With no substitutes allowed in those days, injuries to goalscorer Harry Higginbotham and centre half George Foster during the course of the game meant that we were down to nine fit men, and the result was looked on as a point gained.

Neither player was able to turn out the following week in the return game, which the Robins won I-0 on their way to a quick return to the old Division Two.

City's stay at the higher level was short lived and the two sides met again in 1924/25 with this time the Town running out 3-0 winners at Kenilworth Road.

After a couple of heavy defeats at Ashton Gate over the next two seasons, we were glad to have a respite following City's promotion in 1927 and the teams were not destined to meet up again for five years, by which time we had started to build up a side that was gearing up to eventual elevation to Division Two.

In the five years leading up to our promotion in 1937 we lost only once to the Robins with the 'double' being achieved twice.

During our victorious promotion season of 1936/37 City were one of the many clubs to see at first hand the goalscoring ability of Joe Payne, when he scored twice in the 3-2 win at Ashton Gate.

Almost thirty years were to pass before we met again, in the old Division Three, and in October 1963 we suffered 4-1 and 5-1 defeats in the space of six days at the hands of the Robins to confirm our downward

spiral from the elite.

The following season was not much better with the I-0 defeat at Ashton Gate virtually sealing our relegation to Division Four.

By the time we met again, in the old Division Two in 1970, we were in a much improved state of health, and proved this when Malcolm MacDonald scored twice in a 3-0 victory at Kenilworth Road.

It was our turn to leave City behind at the end of season 1973/74 with our promotion to the top flight but not before we had achieved a notable double over the Robins.

An early season 3-1 win at Ashton Gate, courtesy of goals from John Aston, John Ryan and Tom Finney was followed by a solitary Peter Anderson goal in the return which was filmed for 'Match of the Day'.

A year later, with the Town back in Division Two, it was City's time to shine as they secured a promotion place with an emphatic 3-0 victory at Ashton Gate helping them on their way.

Following City's eventual relegation from the old Division

One in 1980 paths crossed again briefly just as we were about to make a bid for promotion to the top flight, while the Robins were in freefall in much the same way we had been twenty years before.

The game at Ashton Gate in October 1980 was notable only for the Town throwing away a 1-0 interval lead to lose 2-1, but goals from David Moss and Steve White made amends in the return the following March.


On now to the recent past and the regular meetings since our relegation from the old Division One in 1992. Unfortunately this does not make happy reading as City are fast becoming a 'bogey' side with our inability to beat them over the past five years.

City were our first visitors following our relegation and they cruised to an emphatic 3-0 win with Andy Cole in scintillating form. By the time of the return we were at the foot of the table but a 0-0 draw at Ashton Gate, although not spectacular, actually set us up for an eventual climb to safety.

We suffered a double defeat in the following season and then went down to a 1-0 home defeat in 1994/95 when City scored from their only worthwhile shot in the whole game. This defeat was our third in a row at Kenilworth Road.

The return match saw us go 2-0 up following two thirty-yard efforts from Scott Oakes, but a blatantly offside effort from Gary Owers set up a grandstand finish, with Junior Bent netting just before the end to earn City an improbable point.

During last seasons games we went down to an early season 5-0 mauling at Ashton Gate and then supporters saw us struggle to take a point in a 2-2 draw in the return.







Bristol City's 10 year league and cup record










He will be out for two to three weeks.

Brentford's assistant manager Glenn Cockerill said: "A relegation battle is a relegation battle, and I'm trying to pass on to the players what I learned in nine seasons with Southampton."

Grimsby could yet catch the league's leading two, as they have games in hand following success in all three cup competitions.

They won 2-0 at Wigan on Saturday with goals from Lee Nogan and Kevin Donovan. Former Juventus defender Pasquale Bruno, once on trial at Luton, made his debut for Wigan.

This afternoon the first of a two-part feature on one of the Town stars of the 1980s..... EMEKA NWAJIOBI

BORN in Nibo-Awka, Anambra State, Nigeria in May 1959, Chukwuemeka Nwajiobi was taken by his parents to England in 1970 when Civil War broke out in the African country.

Settling in south-west London Emeka was made to complete his studies before being allowed to concentrate on football which upset a couple of the London clubs.

"I was invited to Fulham in 1975, at the time of Bobby Moore and Alan Mullery, and played a few games in their South East Counties League side but it was too far from Catford, where I was then living, and I accepted requests for trials at Millwall which was a lot nearer.

"I played for Millwall's juniors and was then, out of the blue, asked to play for the reserves.

"On the day of the game, which was to be watched by the Lion's

management duo of Gordon Jago and Theo Foley, I was asked to step down to the substitutes bench as Millwall wanted to look at a couple of professional

"After a few minutes one of the trialists was injured and I went on and had a good game and obviously impressed the management with the upshot that I was asked to sign forms.

"Unfortunately I knew that my parents would not agree as my studies came first and I had to decline the

After a string of representative honours for London schools and England schools, Emeka went on to to study pharmacy at UWIST in Cardiff, where he played for the British Universities team, and after graduating went to work in a job that did not allow Saturdays off.

Anxious to get back into football Emeka spent several sleepless nights before deciding to hand in his notice and go into locum work back in London.

"I got in touch with one of my old friends, Luciano

Charlton's books and he immediately got in touch with Eddie Presland who was manager of Dulwich Hamlet.

Massiello, who had been on

"Eddie was flabbergasted to discover that I was back in London and lost no time in asking me along to the training ground.

"He wanted me to play in the first team straight away but I refused as I was not match fit, and instead I watched Dulwich play a Saturday game and then finally gave in to pleas by the Chairman and turned out the following Tuesday in a match at Barking."

In a storming display Emeka scored twice and made the other in a 3-1 win to set the bush telegraph lines humming and by the following Saturday scouts from all over the south, including the Town's John Moore, were making a bee line to Champion Hill.

Moore was obviously impressed and within days had alerted David Pleat to the quicksilver goalscorer and he was in attendance at the next game to see for himself.

Rather than view from the stands Pleat spent the whole match on the terraces alongside Emeka's unofficial agent Luciano Massiello no doubt asking him to convince his friend that Kenilworth Road was superior in all respects than White Hart Lane and Stamford Bridge.

At the time (November 1983) the Town were going through a purple patch and were challenging the leaders in the old Division One but needed some attacking cover to take the weight off dual strikers Brian Stein and Paul Walsh.

Although seen as one of the best sides in the land it was also well known that everyone, providing they were good enough, would get a chance and armed with this knowledge the scales tipped in our favour when it came to picking a club.

"Scouts from all over the place were watching me and I had the chance to go to Tottenham who were particularly persistent.

"I decided on Luton in the end because they played football the right way, they did not pressurise me, they would be more likely to give a player such as myself a chance to grab first team football and they had some quality players with one of my particular favourites, Ricky Hill, on their books."

After less than a month on the books of Dulwich Hamlet, Emeka was on his way to Kenilworth Road fully preparing to work his way up through the ranks and hopefully eventually get a chance of playing in the

This chance came much quicker than expected and you can read how this came about in next Tuesday's match programme.

Fair Play standings mirror **Division Two league table**

DETAILS of the latest merit tables for Division Two clubs in the Nationwide League in this season's FA Fair Play Awards scheme are shown below.

The divisional winners of the FA Fair Play Awards will be those clubs who achieve top position in a series of merit tables, with £10,000 going to each of the three successful Nationwide League sides.

Luton Town collected first prize last season, and a cheque for £10,000, which was featured in a matchday programme earlier this season.

Points are awarded on a debit and credit basis, with the FA Fair Play awards going to the club in each division of the Football

League who finishes the season with the highest credit balance.

The merit order in the three tables is determined by the balance accruing to each club, with teams being credited with two points for a goal scored at home and four points for a goal scored away.

Because of the reliance on goals scored, the table oftens mirrors the actual Division itself, and this is demonstrated below, with Bristol City and Watford heading the Division Two clubs, followed by the current play-off contenders.

However points are deducted for players cautioned (one point) or sent off (two points).

WITH the winter weather yet to cause any major disruption, the Football League have once again set out their early warning procedure for the inspection of

In an effort to prevent unnecessary inconvenience to the travelling clubs and their supporters, League clubs are instructed to liaise closely to ascertain the travelling arrangements of the visitors.

Home clubs are also asked to contact the match

referee for his travel details and any plans to stay overnight in order that he can be reached at short notice

Clubs can also request referees to travel the day before the match if an early pitch inspection is necessary. In the event that the match referee is unable to travel early to the ground, the Football League would call in a local official to advise them on the condition of the playing surface.


LTFC EVACUATION **PROCEDURE**

IN the event of any emergencies at Luton Town Football Club, the emergency services and the club have agreed on an evacuation policy which is designed to:

- a) Ensure the safe and controlled evacuation of the ground.
- b) Ensure the dispersal of the crowd from the area to allow the emergency services to carry out their tasks.

In the event on an evacuation of all or part of the stadium, you will receive instructions over the public address system on how you should leave the stadium. Stewards will direct you to the nearest exit. It may be that vour normal exit route will not be available. On leaving the stadium, you will find some roads closed to pedestrian traffic, to enable swift and unobstructed arrival of the emergency services.
