



v CHESTERFIELD

From the manager's chair

OUR excellent performance against Grimsby last Tuesday saw us extend our run of consecutive league wins to three, for only the second time this season, and it meant we had only lost one in 11 matches in **Division Two.**

A lot of those games have been drawn, but now the three straight wins has seen us climb up several places in the table.

I said to the players after the game against York that they could remove any threat of relegation by the next Saturday night, and we took a big step towards that at Blundell Park.

A win at Gillingham on Saturday would certainly have seen us safe.

However, this is only the first step in our end-ofseason campaign, and we should be aiming to reach halfway in the league and try to make it the most successful away campaign in Luton Town's recent history.

Also, it is important that we finish with two decent performances and results at home after all the disappointments this season.

Looking back at the last three games, we felt that victory at Walsall was a benchmark and a turning point and that has proved to be correct.

We followed that with victory over York, and although we were fortunate



in that they had two players sent off, we were awarded a penalty for the first time this season, and although we never totally dominated the visitors, three-nil was a convincing scoreline.

Grimsby Town meanwhile have set excellent standards this season as one of the most attacking football sides in this division.

Games have taken their toll in recent weeks, and they had only scored one or nil in each of their last four games prior to Tuesday.

It was a point I made to the players before the game, and stressed that if we could get a goal I felt certain we would get something from the game.

As it turned out, it was all three points.

The victory owed much to our passing and approach play in the first half

especially. It was also a wonderful strike from David Oldfield, and some astute finishing and good anticipation from Rory Allen which gave us the goal.

There then followed some resolute defending from all concerned when Grimsby threw men forward in the second half, and some excellent goalkeeping from Kelvin Davis.

There were two or three missed chances on Grimsby's behalf, and a touch of luck for us, but the victory was deserved - a fact acknowledged by the Mariners' manager Alan Buckley afterwards, as we maintained a record of just two defeats away from home since September.

At the time of writing these notes the result at Gillingham isn't known, but hopefully that result will have taken any remnants of pressure off us for tonight's game.

At the time of writing, Chesterfield still have an outside chance of a play-off place.

I saw their recent 2-0 win at Southend when they were deserved victors, and as usual with John Duncan's teams they are hardworking. well organised, have lively front players, and are dangerous from set plays.

Hopefully we can continue the good work we showed against York, and we need to be as focused and professional as we have



to achieve that.

It has been such a hard and difficult season at home that we can ill afford to take our foot off the accelerator now.

It is important that we



NEWS - Last Tuesday night's Division Two action

It's glory for Rory at Grimsby

LUTON made it three wins in a row with last Tuesday's 1-0 victory at Grimsby - and moved up to 17th place in the Division Two table.

Rory Allen netted the winning goal after 53 minutes, slotting home the rebound after David Oldfield's shot cannoned off the post.

Allen had been close to an opener after two minutes, and then saw his 29th minute effort ruled out for offside.


And at the other end, Kelvin Davis saved well from Jack Lester and Paul Groves as somehow it remained goalless at the break.

But there was no denying Allen his second goal for the Hatters eight minutes after half-time, and Graham Alexander was close to a second soon after.

Grimsby put the visitors under plenty of pressure, but Davis made another fine save to deny ex-Hatter Kingsley Black, and substitute Neil Woods had a goal disallowed before missing an injury-time sitter.

Yet Luton might have won 2-0 as

substitute Gary Doherty then hit the post with his first touch of the ball.

The defeat virtually ended Grimsby's chances of automatic promotion - indeed by the time you read this, Bristol City and Watford will probably have been promoted.

Elsewhere last Tuesday, Fulham needed a late equaliser to salvage a point in a 1-1 draw at home to Walsall.

Burnley's good run ended with a 2-1 home defeat by Blackpool, and Wigan eased their relegation worries with a 1-0 win over Bournemouth. - Simon Oxley.

Ex-Hatter claims Div Two XI place

THERE were no players from the two sides on duty tonight in the PFA Division Two 'Team of the Season', but ex-Hatter Alec Chamberlain was voted best goalkeeper in the division by his fellow professionals.

The former Luton Player of the Year, has been a key figure in Watford's likely promotion, and indeed is very much in the running for the supporters' award at Vicarage

Promotion favourites Watford and Bristol City, along with Grimsby and Fulham, each provided two players for the Division Two XI, but so too did Walsall in the shape of French striker Roger Boli and winger John Hodge - scorer of a memorable goal here back in November.




LEFT: French striker Roger Boli has scored over 20 goals for Walsall this season.

SPOTLIGHT ON TODAY'S VISITORS

BILLY MERCER - Goalkeeper who signed from Sheffield United for £90,000 in December 1995 following a superb loan spell earlier in the season. The former Liverpool trainee made over 100 league appearances for Rotherham, but found first-team opportunities hard to come by at **Bramall Lane.**

ANDY LEANING - Goalkeeper with over 200 league appearances behind him for York City, Sheffield United, Bristol City and Lincoln City. He arrived at Saltergate in October 1996 as cover for Billy Mercer and made 10 league and cup outings last term.

IAN BRECKIN - Defender who signed in the summer from Rotherham United for a six-figure fee following the departure of club captain Sean Dyche to Bristol City. The centre-half rose through the trainee ranks at Millmoor to make over 100 appearances for his home town club.


DARREN CARR - Summer 1993 capture from Crewe Alexandra for a tribunal fixed fee of £30,000. Centre-half who was Player of the Year in 1994/95, but has been restricted by injury in the subsequent two seasons.

JAMIE HEWITT - Chesterfield-born utility player, who is now in his second spell at Saltergate after rejoining the Spireites in October 1993 from **Doncaster Rovers. Has made over 450** appearances for the club, and netted the last-gasp equaliser in the 3-3 FA Cup semi-final draw against Middlesbrough last term.

MARK JULES - Signed as a wide attacking player, he has developed into a man-marking

hometown club Bradford City, prior to a free transfer to Scarborough in August 1991.

CHRIS PERKINS - Formerly with Mansfield Town, the Nottingham-born defender was picked up on a free transfer in the summer of 1994. Originally signed to provide defensive cover, he ended up making 26 first-team appearances in his debut season, including a Wembley appearance in the play-off final.

LEE ROGERS - The longest serving member of the Chesterfield squad with 10 years at Saltergate behind him, he enjoyed a successful testimonial last season. Joined the club as a trialist in the summer of 1986, following an apprenticeship at Doncaster.

MARK WILLIAMS - A bargain buy from Shrewsbury Town during the summer of 1995, the centre-half swept the board in the end of term awards. He previously joined the Shrews from nonleage Newtown in 1992, after an apprenticeship at Crewe, and started Chesterfield's famous FA Cup run last season with the only goal against Bury in round one.

TOM CURTIS - Scored the penalty which saw off

Nottingham Forest in the cup last season, and until recently the midfielder had combined playing duties with his studies at Loughborough University. Spent two years with Derby before impressing John Duncan during a trial spell.

MARCUS EBDON - Former Welsh Under 21 international who signed from Peterborough for £100,000 in March 1997. The Pontypool-born midfielder was a trainee at Everton prior to moving to London Road.

DAVID REEVES - Much travelled striker who joined the club this season from Preston, as part of the deal that took Tony Lormor to Deepdale. Started his career with Sheffield Wednesday, and enjoyed lengthy spells at Bolton and Carlisle, plus shorter stays at Notts County, **Burnley and Scunthorpe.**

CHESTERFIELD

PAUL HOLLAND - Midfielder who became the club record signing at £155,000 from Sheffield United in January 1996. Had spent just six months at Bramall Lane after joining the Blades from Mansfield where he scored 25 goals in 149 league outings.

ROGER WILLIS - Much travelled midfielder/striker who arrived at Saltergate in the summer after a £130,000 transfer from Peterborough. Has previously played for Grimsby, Barnet, Watford, Birmingham and Southend.

CHRIS BEAUMONT - Sheffield-born striker whose goal against Wrexham sent Chesterfield through to last season's FA Cup semifinal. A £22,500 signing from Stockport County the previous summer, he made over 300 apperances in his seven years at Edgeley Park, after starting his career with Rochdale.

IAIN DUNN - Having played 13 times for Chesterfield in an unsuccessful spell during the 1991/92 campaign, he returned to Saltergate last February from Huddersfield Town.

JONATHAN HOWARD - Sheffield-born striker who finished as the club's top scorer last season with 11 goals. Started his career with Rotherham United, signing professional forms in July 1990, but was limited to just 36 league outings for the Millers.

ANDY MORRIS - Striker nicknamed 'Bruno' for obvious reasons, he is the tallest man in the Chesterfield squad at 6ft 5ins. Currently in his testimonial season, he joined the Derbyshire club from Rotherham in January 1988 and has featured in over 300 games for the Spireites.

STEVE WILKINSON - A £150,000 close season signing from Preston, the former Leicester City, Rochdale (loan), Crewe (loan) and Mansfield Town striker has mover 100 league goals to his credit.

MEET THE MANAGER

Formerly a top striker with a goal in every other game for Tottenham and Derby, JOHN DUNCAN arrived at Saltergate for his second spell in charge following the departure of Chris McMenemy in February 1993.

Having led the Spireites to the fourth division title in 1984/85, he completed an unprecedented double a decade later by clinching promotion with Chesterfield for a second time, as the Derbyshire club beat Bury at Wembley in the Division Three play-off final.

His first taste of management came at Scunthorpe United in 1981, before taking over at Saltergate two years later.

He went on to spend three seasons at Ipswich Town in the late 1980s, and then dropped out of the game before leaving a teaching post to return to the Chesterfield hot-seat.

He signed an extension to his contract in February 1996, which ties him to Chesterfield until the year 2000

The Hatters and The Spireites

CLASHES with the Spireites began at the back end of the last century with Chesterfield's elevation to the Football League Division Two in 1899.

Unfortunately this was to be our final season at this level and we were probably relieved as the Spireites achieved the double over us with the Town putting up a couple of "poor displays" according to the newspaper reports.

We then went almost forty years before catching up with each other again following our promotion to the old Division Two in 1937.

The first game, at Luton, finished I-I with Bill Fellowes on target for the Town, but we suffered a hammering at Saltergate later on in the campaign going down 5-2 in a match marking the last appearance for long serving full back Tom Mackey.

We made up for this heavy defeat in the following season when four goals from new scoring sensation, Hugh Billington, earned us a 5-0 victory at Kenilworth Road.

By the time of the return, in April 1939, both ourselves and the Spireites were neck and neck fighting for promotion and a crowd of 14,925 turned up at Saltergate to see Bill Redfern score twice in a 2-1 win for the Town.

Although we went up to second position in the table following this win we were unable to hold on and were ready to clash with the Spireites again after the War.

In 1946/47 we went down 2-1 at Saltergate to record our fifth straight defeat and could only manage a 1-1 draw in the return.

Over the next two seasons both sides won their home games but in 1949/50 a George Stobbart goal earned us both points in a 1-0 win at Saltergate. A parting of the ways

followed at the end of the next campaign with Chesterfield's relegation to Division Three (North) but, in looking back, our 3-0 home win over the Spireites at the end of March 1951 was vital as we ended a poor season only two points ahead of them!

Paths crossed again in 1965 with our relegation to the old Division Four, and in an early season clash at Kenilworth Road we only managed to put away one chance from half a dozen opportunities, with Billy Stark on target, then letting in the Spireites to steal both points for their first ever win at Kenilworth Road.

Ex Hatter Gareth Salisbury was one of the Chesterfield goalscorers that afternoon but he was missing from the line-up when the Town avenged this defeat with a 3-1 victory at Saltergate later on in the campaign.

The following season was the worst in our history with only one win and four draws on our travels, so our 0-0 draw at Saltergate was greeted with people dancing in the streets of Luton! Earlier on in the campaign we had won 3-2 at home in a match marking the debut of Max Dougan who had been signed from Leicester for £7,000 in the wake of our 8-1 hammering at Lincoln the previous week.

Two goals from 19 year old Bruce Rioch helped seal the victory but at the other end Billy Stark, who we had transferred to Chesterfield the previous summer, did his best to spoil our day by netting twice for the Spireites.

Season 1967/68 saw us win the Division Four title, with Chesterfield also up amongst the leaders throughout much of the

campaign

A solitary lan Buxton goal earned both points in the game at Kenilworth Road, while at Saltergate a crowd of 14,075 turned out to see an entertaining 0-0 draw to maintain our position at the top of the table.

Meetings resumed last season after a long break with Chesterfield winning all three points with a 1-0 win here in September 1996.

In the return last March we drew I-I at Saltergate courtesy of a Tony Thorpe penalty, although precious few Luton supporters saw the goal due to the thick fog. Indeed, the chap standing next to me rang his wife at home from a mobile phone to ask her to check Teletext to find out the goalscorer!



MARVIN JOHNSON continues to make prograess but is still some way off returning following his hamstring injury.


He resumed training a couple of weeks ago, but the hamstring was still causing problems, so he resumed further strengthening work on the muscle.



LEAGUE AND CUP

This evening, in the second of a two-part feature, we look at the career of RICKY HILL

IN the last programme we looked back at the early career of Ricky Hill, signed on by the Town after being spotted playing in a schoolboy game in Hitchin, and how he was gradually introduced to the side before making a midfield position his

After narrow failure to achieve promotion from the old Division Two in 1980 and 1981 we walked away with the championship in 1982.

Our first season back in the big time had the media in raptures but on the final day of the season we needed to win at Manchester City to stay up. A draw was all that City required to achieve the same aim. Ricky takes up the story.

"None of the players doubted our ability to play in the top flight and relegation was not on our minds. We had a low key trip to Henlow Grange before the game and we were so confident of a result that we pooled some money together to get a bet on but no one would accept it. We treated it as just another game.

"On the day our team work was solid with no outstanding individuals but as the game wore on we badly needed a goal as City were looking less and less likely to hurt us. With just five minutes left Brian Stein, who was back in the side after a long lay off following a broken foot, managed to get a cross in and it eventually fell at the feet of substitute Raddy Antic in a packed penalty area. Raddy was the one player you would hope the ball would fall to as he had the technical ability to strike it low with either foot.

"City goalkeeper, Alex Williams, got his hand to the ball but only succeeded in deflecting it past two defenders on the line. We hung on for the final five minutes and at the final whistle angry City supporters stormed on the pitch and I received a thump around the ear for my troubles, and then in the tunnel the City players were saying things they probably regretted the day after!"

This ended a memorable season for Ricky as he had made his England debut coming on as substitute for Tony Morley in a European Championship qualifier in Denmark and then starting against West Germany in a friendly at

Briegel who I was up against." Having got the relegation saga out of the way we gradually built up a squad that could hold its own at the top level with Ricky instrumental, but then came a couple of set backs in his career. "I had suffered hamstring problems before but after a Cup game against Watford in January 1984 I was training ready for the replay when my leg seized up. It took ages before someone diagnosed a calcified hamstring which eventually involved an operation to cut away the extra bone growth. This meant

"In the following campaign we managed to fight our way through to the F.A.Cup semi-final for the first time since 1959 when we were drawn to play against Everton at Villa Park. I scored early on and we held the lead until just before the end and then lost the game in extra time. The final result was an injustice as we had played them off the park and we

were all physically shattered and deflated.

"Although David Pleat reckoned that the defeat was a blessing in disguise as it enabled us to concentrate our minds on avoiding relegation, I am not so sure as it would have given the team a big lift to look forward to a Wembley

We then entered into the most successful spell in our history finishing in the top ten three years running and although Ricky endured a recurrence of his hamstring problem in 1986 he was not out for as long as before but he then broke an ankle and suffered ligament damage at Everton on Boxing Day 1987 which kept him out as we were marching on to Wembley in the Littlewoods Cup.

"Although I was not fully match fit I was lucky enough to make it back just in time for the final which was obviously the crowning point of my time at Luton. The penalty save by Andy Dibble was the turning point as to go 3-1 down would have killed us. Instead we were lifted and went on to win the game with the clincher coming in the final minute. The only sad point was that we were not allowed to show our skills in Europe due to the ban on English clubs taking

Now approaching 30, Ricky decided that he would fancy a

spell playing on the continent before finishing his career and had a verbal agreement that he could leave at the end of the 1988/89 season on a free transfer as a reward for his long service and loyalty. Despite this, a fee was demanded from Le Havre which left a sour taste at the time but that was soon forgotten as it was only club finances that prevented Ricky from returning to Kenilworth Road under Jim Ryan a couple of years later.

"I had a brilliant time in France and earned more money than I had ever earned before. During my time at Luton I was aware that I was a bit of a pauper when listening to some of the other players in the England dressing room, but I did not want to leave the family atmosphere and job satisfaction at Luton. I certainly had opportunities to leave both legal and illegal but remained loyal which I never regretted, and went through the whole of my career without

"I learnt a lot in France about coaching and fitness training which I use today but after my English playing colleague, John Byrne, decided to leave because of personal problems I took the opportunity to return to England and join up with David Pleat who was then at Leicester. I was warned not to go as the place was in turmoil and in retrospect it was not a

good career move."

Pleat left Leicester soon afterwards to be replaced by Gordon Lee and then Brian Little took over and wanted his own men in place with the result that Ricky was given a free transfer. After a short spell at Wimbledon an approach was made by Rodney Marsh to carry out some coaching in the States for Tampa Bay Rowdies and off the Hill family went for a successful spell in the sun.

"Shortly after my arrival the other coaches were sacked and I was put in charge. We reached two National Championship finals and I was voted 'Coach of the Year' but I then fell out with Marsh and returned to England and played for Chertsey while setting up a Soccer School in Harlesden."

It was then back to Florida for a coaching spell with Cocoa Beach and another National final and then on to Sheffield Wednesday where he remains to this day in a coaching capacity alongside ex-Hatters Lil Fuccillo and Rob

It was evident from our chat that Ricky still holds Luton Town F.C. very close to his heart and thanks everyone involved with the club for giving him "The best years of my


FOR the third season in succession, the Loyal Luton Supporters Club are once again sponsoring the Young Team of the Month Award.






LTFC EVACUATION **PROCEDURE**
