

half-time but, on this occasion, his 30-yard dead-ball effort skimmed inches wide of the post after another foul on Spring.

In between, the visitors had a valid looking penalty appeal rejected when Dave Carroll seemed to trip Dwight Marshall after Phil Gray's intelligent reverse pass.

Since their promotion to the football league, Wycombe have never beaten the Hatters and rarely looked like breaking that duck on Saturday.

But it might have been different had Keith Scott accepted the simplest of chances on 25 minutes.

Carroll's measured pass beat the Hatters' off-side trap and left the big striker with a clear run on goal. Scott could have almost walked the ball into the net but hit the post in a real early season howler.

The Hatters defence grew stronger after that scare with Graham Alexander outstanding at right back. With Julian James out until Christmas, the ex-Scun-


