PHIL GRAY answered his Kenilworth Road critics by turning in a match winning performance to give the Hatters a happy bank holiday in Wigan.

The Irish front man was berated by boo boys against Colchester on Saturday but bounced back with a goal and an assist which will have, at least appeased the couple

of hundred travelling fans who made the long trip up the M6. Gray was the provider for Sean Evers' explosive 78th-minute goal that gave the Hatters a 2-1 lead and then he made the points safe himself moments later with his sec-

It was three minutes of magic that left manager Lennie Lawrence purring at the final

The Hatters boss said: "I chatted to him about Saturday and told him he had to respond by being 100 per cent focussed and totally professional. "He did that by showing real character and by playing his best game in the year he

has been with us. "He led the line well and if ever a performance warranted a goal it was his. I'm well pleased for him but now he's got to do it at home."

Gray's ball to Evers was the pivotal moment in a game that the visitors looked in danger of letting slip from their grasp.

The Hatters appeared to be cruising to three points against a woeful Wigan side after another goal from skipper Steve Davis. Graham Alexander hit an outswinging corner that the criminally unmarked Davis

volleyed into the bottom corner to give his side a half-time advantage. At the other end, the Hatters captain and his back four were rarely troubled by a

home team who struggled to string two passes together. Ex-Bolton winger David Lee, once famously undid Arsenal in a cup tie but, on Monday, he looked hardly capable of undoing his laces.

Equally, striker Stuart Barlow gained an unfortunate reputation for struggling to hit the proverbial barn door at previous clubs Everton and Oldham but he is faring better at Springfield Park and bagged his fourth goal in three

63rd-minute equaliser. A flat-footed Marvin Johnson allowed a hopeful free kick to sail over his head and drop on to the out stretched right boot of Barlow.

Demonstrating predatory skills rarely in evidence during his Goodison Park days, Barlow flicked the ball past Kelvin Davis with the outside of his foot.

The visitors then suffered an uncertain five minutes as the goal finally provided Wigan with some inspiration.
