After a poor run of results in October (W2, L3, D1), we know we need to get back to winning ways quickly if we wish to stay in one of the two automatic promotion positions. It is important to be pace setters in Division 2 and I know that Brian Little and the players are determined to be successful and will therefore be doing everything they can to maintain top spot. However, having said this, what is most important is not what position we are in now, next week or indeed next month; but what position we are in after the home match versus Walsall on 8 May. Then and only then will we know if it has been a successful season.

As everyone will have read by now, last week Graham Kavanagh 'signed a new contract which runs until June 2002. I am sure this news will be well received by the vast majority of supporters as it should end any further transfer speculation surrounding the player who, after serving today's one match suspension, can concentrate on helping the team win matches! Graham cost the Club £500,000 when he joined from Middlesbrough in 1996 and earlier in the season we could have sold him for a profit because there were one or two enquiries. However, after watching the player during the early part of the season, the Manager was keen for him to resign and therefore we concluded a deal with his agent, albeit after some fairly intense negotiations. Graham is the second player to sign a long term contract this

season; Dean Crowe signed a fouryear deal earlier in the year. At Stoke, we carefully and consistently monitor all player contracts and, subject to the Manager's wishes, will do everything we can to re-sign the player he wants. However, today more than ever before, clubs are now finding players seeking unrealistic wages as a consequence of Bosman and free agency. Most clubs are already facing financial difficulties. If a player tries to hold a club to ransom or refuses to agree new terms, then there is no alternative but to sell that player before his contract expires. Agents and players must realise that despite the Bosman Ruling, they must be responsible and work with clubs for a healthy financial future for the whole of football and not just on getting more and more money for their respective pockets! If they do not, then there will fewer and fewer jobs available for them as clubs will strive to cut down the number of players in an attempt to afford the ever increasing wages. Today, Tom Pendry MP, Chairman of the Football Trust, will make a cheque presentation to Chairman Keith Humphreys which signifies their final payment of the £3.25 million package of grant and loans

It is also important to remember that last season we were faced with no option but to sell Andrew Griffin to help raise much needed cash for the Club and relegation has cost us dear this financial year as well. Therefore, it would be wrong to assume that, at this time, as a consequence of receiving the final payment from the Football Trust, which repays the last of the money borrowed to build the Stadium, we now have spare money available.

Finally, I would just like to say thank you to the 340 guests who turned up for dinner with boxing legend Marvellous Marvin Hagler on Thursday evening, 29 October and also to all of the 9,600 parents and children who came to the Britannia Stadium for the Fireworks Extravaganza on Friday, 30 October, which was an extremely successful community event!



96 season, Luton Town were marked down as one of the favourites to bounce straight back the following year, but that never materialised and after two disappointing campaigns since then, they are still looking to win promotion, having finished 17th last term.

Not dismayed, current manager Lennie Lawrence (in charge at Kenilworth Road since March 1993) has kept faith with most the players who served him honestly in 1997-98 and if you glance at the League table on page 54 you will see that the Hatters are well in touch with the leading pack and a favourable result today would do their morale and, indeed, confidence no harm at all, In fact, they recently dumped Premiership side Coventry City out of the Worthington Cup, beating the Sky Blues 2-0 at home, and that's no mean feat these days!

The players who are likely to be available for selection against the Potters today are as follows: In goal will be Kelvin Davis (aged 22) who originates from Bedford. He joined the Hatters as a junior in 1992, turning professional two years later. In the next three years he played on loan with Torquay United and Hartlepool and is now first choice between the sticks at


Kenilworth Road, having already gained an England under 21 cap.

In front of Davis, Luton manager Lawrence will choose from right-wing back Graham Alexander, centre-halves Steve Davis (no relation) and the 30 year-old Marvin Johnson, the versatile Alan White and the experienced figure of Mitchell Thomas.

Alexander, 27, comes from Coventry, and appeared for Scunthorpe United before joining the Hatters in a £100,000 deal in 1995. He is tough, keen and exciting and has now played more than 150 games for Luton.

Davis has been with Southampton and Burnley and is one of the best defenders in the Second Division.

Marvin
Johnson was born in sight of Wembley
Stadium and joined Luton as a trainee in 1984,





turning professional on his eighteenth birthday. He's now amassed more than 325 senior appearances for the Hatters. Standing 6ft. tall and weighing 13st. 7lbs. he is a

determined tackler who loves a challenge. White (22) is a native of Darlington, who arrived from Middlesbrough in the close season of 1997. He had been reserve to so many talented defenders on Teeside and jumped at the chance of securing regular first team football with the Hatters. He is a fine player who made 33 appearances in his first season at Luton. Mitchell Thomas is an experienced

campaigner, having previously assisted Spurs and West Ham. He's in his second spell at Kenilworth Road. In midfield Luton are currently relying on Scotsman Ray

McKinnon, Sean Evers, Matthew Spring, Paul McLaren and Gavin McGowan.
McKinnon (28) turned down a move to Hearts to sign from the Hatters from Dundee United in August. He had impressed Hatters' boss Lennie Lawrence in two pre-season friendlies (v. Arsenal and Hull) and needed no second thoughts when asked to move south into the Nationwide League.

Evers (aged 21) comes from Hitchin and joined the Hatters in 1995. He has made only a handful of first team appearances to date and may well be on the bench today.

Spring (18) made an impressive debut for the Hatters a year ago against Plymouth Argyle and is one of the many youngsters blooded by manager Lawrence over the last four years or so. McLaren (22) has graduated through the ranks at Kenilworth Road. He was born in High Wycombe and joined the Hatters as a junior in 1992, turning professional three years ago. He has now made over 50 senior appearances.

Young McGowan (22) made his senior debut four years ago with Arsenal and joined the Hatters this year after two separate loan spells from Highbury.

Luton have Stuart Douglas, Phil Gray, and Andrew Fotiadis as their main attackers.

Douglas (20) is a lively and aggressive striker who turned professional with the Hatters two

Andrew Fotiadis as their main attackers. Douglas (20) is a lively and aggressive striker who turned professional with the Hatters two years ago after serving his apprenticeship at Kenilworth Road. He has made almost 50 first team appearances to date, two-thirds of them as a substitute.

Northern Ireland international Gray (30) has been in League football 12 years and is a vastly experienced player, whereras

Fotiadis (21) was born in Hitchin and signed for the Hatters as a junior in 1994, moving up to the

professional ranks two years later. He is fast-approaching the 50 appearance mark for Luton but has not been a regular in the side this season.

#### STAR VISITORS

• Left full-back Mitchell Thomas (now 34 years of age) has one England 'B' cap to his name which he gained whilst with Spurs. Born in Luton, he started his footballing career at Kenilworth Road back in 1982 and then served with Tottenham and West Ham United before returning to the Hatters fort a second spell in 993. A strong competitor, he can play in any

defensive position and has now amassed over 300 appearances in his time at Luton.

Graham Alexander

• Steve Davis (aged 30) was with Southampton as a teenager and after loan spells with both Burnley and Notts County, he transferred to Turf Moor on a permanent basis in 1991.

He played well over 200 games for the Clarets before making the move south to Kenilworth Road to join Luton for £750,000 in 1995. A determined defender, confident both in the air and on the ground, he has now chalked up in excess of 150 senior appearances for the Hatters and scored the decisive second goal in the Hatters' recent

Worthington Cup win over Premiership side Coventry City. He's no relation to his goalkeeper!

• Phil Gray was born in Belfast in October 1968 and has appeared at four different levels for Northern Ireland, winning 20 full, one under 23, youth and schoolboy caps. He began his career in London with Tottenham (1986). After loan

spells with Barnsley and Fulham, he signed for Luton in a £275,000 deal in 1991. After hitting 2 26 goals in less

than 70 appearances for the hatters he switched due north to Sunderland who acquired his services for £800,000 in 1993. Whilst on Wearside Gray continued to do well in the scoring stakes and netted 41 times in 134 outings for the then Roker Park club before deciding on a move to Nancy in France in 1996. He then moved to Fortuna Sittard and duly returned to Luton for £400,000 in September 1997. Last season he added two goals in 19

more outings for the Hatters. Watch out for him at set pieces and in crowded goal areas!

Lennie Lawrence has challenged his players to prove they are good enough to go up- by netting 46 points before Boxing Day.

That's the target Luton's manager believes can be

the platform for a promotion assault in the second half of the season...and they are already nearly two thirds of the way there.

The Hatters boss bases his theory on two years ago, when Town hit the 46 point mark before the turn of the year and went on to reach the play-offs only to suffer a surprise semi-final defeat over two legs by Crewe.

Many pundits expected them to follow that up with another sustained bid to recapture the First Division status they lost in 1996 last season, but the campaign turned into a nightmare as injuries ravaged Kenilworth Road and Lawrence came under against relegation.

This time, though, the emergence of a new crop of youngsters has made for a different story and one of the Football League's most experienced managers is enjoying the fruits of the youth-led revival in his fourth season at the club.

Lawrence has been quick to praise their contribution as well as that of his more senior stars. 'It is the form of the players like Steve Davis, Marvin Johnson and Graham Alexander which has allowed the youngsters to come in and do well' he says. 'They have come through and come on in leaps and bounds, and now I am saying lets see if we can get 46 points by Boxing Day!

'For me that is a target. Two seasons ago we had 46 points by December 26, and despite drawing a few home games in the second half of the season we still finished third!

# ATEROS THEY NOW.

#### JIMMY ROBERTSON

A fast-raiding, skilful and highly effected rightwinger, Jimmy Robertson had been a junior with Middlesbrough and a part-time player with Celtic before signing amateur forms for Cowdenbeath in 1959. He made his Scottish League debut as a 16 year-old and won both youth and amateur caps for his country before becoming a full-time professional with St. Mirren in 1962. Three months after winning the first of four under 23 caps (versus Wales), he moved to Tottenham Hotspur for £25.000 in May 1964, and quickly became a firm favourite at White Hart Lane, going on to score 43 goals in 215 appearances for Spurs in four-and-a-half years with the club. He also collected his only full cap (again v. Wales at Cardiff in 1964 - lost 3-2) and helped Spurs win the 1967 FA Cup Final, 2-1 v. Chelsea. In October 1968, Robertson made the short trip across North Londo to Highbury, when he joined Arsenal for £55,000, a deal which saw David Jenkins travel in the opposite direction.

He spent two years with the Gunners, hitting seven goals in 46 League games. His next move took him to Ipswich Town in March 1970 where he struck 10 goals in 87 First Division outings up to June 1972 when he signed for the Potters.

'Robbo' did very well at The 'Vic' and he went on to score 14 times in 139 matches for Stoke five years up to September 1977 when he switched to Walsall. He made 16 League appearances for the Saddlers and ended his senior career by having 33 outings for Crewe.

Born at Cardonald, Glasgow on 17 December 1944. Robertson retired from competitive football in May 1979 to become involved with a computer insurance company - Gillen Financial Services of Hanley - of

which he is now a Director.

Married (to Margaret) and with two daughters (Jacqueline 30 and Sally 27, Jimmy still attends certain matches in and around this area, choosing between Port Vale, Stoke City and the 'Alex' although he says: "My biggest sporting lofve these days is golf where I am captain of my club at Newcastle-under-Lyme. I have already wonm more trophy at the small ball game than I did when I was playing football.

"Football has changed so much since I was in the game. It's certainly a big money sport these days. I only wish I had been born 20 years later. Still, I enjoyed my career and I have many fine memories to look back on."







This last week has seen Simon Sturridge and Jamie Cartwright return to normal training following their fractures. They have both had around six weeks off from playing to allow their respective bones to unite. This is then followed by a gradually increasing intensity of lower limb weight bearing work until the great day for them both came when they could actually kick a ball again.

It is important that the players are taken through all forms of activity i.e heading, passing, volleying, turning, jumping, sprinting, tackling so that they themselves are confident in their functional ability once more. We have swapped two lower limb injuries for upper limb ones. Stuart Scheuber sustained a shoulder injury which will sideline him for a week or two and Martyn Shaw fractured two bones in his hand scoring a goal in a youth game.

The wet weather has meant that the pitches for training have been exceptionally heavy. It has been a positive from the point of the injured lads as they have been able to run on soft and heavy ground which has worked their stamina and leg strength whilst not being too hard on their injuries.

The weather has meant that the lads have done much more work on astroturf or in the gym. Surfaces likes these are much harder on the joints and can cause niggles in knees and ankles which would not occur on soft ground.





Backed by a 12,000 following Stoke lost the chance to win the championship at Gigg Lane with three games left. Jimmy Mcllroy's goal was not enough to gain a point as The Shakers won both points with a 2-1 win. Stoke's next opportunity came against today's visitors Luton Town, having already drawn 0-0 away at Kenilworth Road back in September in front of 6.878 fans. Stoke had the chance for their first 2nd Division Championship trophy since 1932-33 with their last home game of the season. 

# Sixties re-visited

SEASON 1960-61

The first campaign of the 1960s wasn't a good one for Stoke City.

They huffed and puffed throughout and eventually finished a rather disappointing 15th in Division Two with this record:

The Potters failed to win any of their opening six matches, losing four of them, including a 4-0 reverse at Sunderland.

Their first League win was achieved at The Victoria Ground on 10th September when Sheffield United were defeated 2-0, Dennis Wilshaw scoring both goals in front of an 11,300 crowd - the lowest of the season at that juncture.

Manager Tony Waddington - who had taken over the

hot seat from Frank Taylor in the summer – wasn't too pleased with the team's performances – the Potters lost their first-ever League Cup-tie 3–1 at Doncaster – and although he stuck with his goalkeeper Jimmy O'Neill, full-backs Tim Ward and Tony Allen and forwards Johnny King and Wilshaw, he made several changes in other departments, often switching players around from position to position.

After 21 League games had been fulfilled - mid-December - Stoke were struggling, having collated just 19 points....but occasionally the team did produce a confident performance, especially when they hammered Plymouth Argyl;e at home by 9-0 with King claiming a hat-trick. After Christmas the Potters' overall form improved slightly - they beat Charlton Athjetic 5-3 at home with a hat-trick from Bill Asprey who had been moved up into the attack and made progress in the FA Cup, ousting West Ham United in the Third Round (after a replay).

Three successive defeats - at the hands of Sheffield United, Swansea Town and

Luton - put the relegation fears into the team, but three wins out of four starts thankfully helped ease matters somewhat.

However, Stoke were still struggling to hold their form and they went out of the FA Cup, beaten 3-1 at Newcastle in the fifth round after they had accounted for Aldershot at the third attempt in the previous round. Sadly in this game at St. James' Park, Wilshaw broke his leg and never played again.

As the season wore on, points became increasingly hard to obtain and between early March and late April, only nine were gained out of a possible 24.

Attendances plummeted alarmingly and when Liverpool came to the Potteries for the final League game of the season on 3rd May, with Stoke safe from relegation, a meagre crowd of just 4,463 saw them win 3-1.

There was a loy to do team-wise for boss Waddington and he knew it, but there were one or two players coming through, ready to become part of the senior squad which in two years time regained their First

Division status after a break of 10 years. In 1960-61, Wilshaw finished up as top scorer with 14 goals; King netted 13. Tony Allen was the only ever-present, playing in all 49 competitive matches. And the average League gate at The 'Vic' was 9,252 - the first time it had fallen below the 10,000 mark since 1908. Tony Matthews

# Looking back.. Paul Shardlow




