DAVE FLETT sees Hatters' Cup success continue... lowly Hull stand

PHIL GRAY celebrated his Northern Ireland call-up with two goals to end stubborn Boreham Wood's interest in this season's FA Cup.

In front of the Sky TV cameras, the Hatters striker provided international boss Lawrie McMenemy with a timely reminder of his finishing talents ahead of tonight's European Championship qualifier at home to Moldova.

Gray settled the visitors' nerves on 34 minutes, added a second early in the second half and then chipped to the far post for captain Steve Davis to head in a

The Irish forward has now scored seven times in his last nine games and, on Sunday, became the first Hatters player to score two goals from open hat-trick against Blackpool in January

in the shadow of his man-mountain marker Garry Nisbet, had earlier wasted a good opportunity, firing straight at home keeper Martin Taylor after being released by Sean Evers. Wood captain Nisbet enjoyed an

inspirational game and, as well as contributing to Douglas' also got his name on

the scoresheet and sent a spectacular swirling 40-yard effort just over Davis'

Luckily for the their skipper was in an equally determined nood and it was largely those of Gray and Paul McLaren that the Hatters avoided this

particular banana skin. McLaren returned to the starting line-up in place of the rested Matthew Spring and provided the steal against the part-timers. bravely testing his knee ligaments with several crunching challenges.

In a disappointing first half few away players matched McLaren's lesire for battle and it was

in rather fortunate circumstances that the football league outfit took the lead. Boreham Wood had been stretched for five minutes after losing Dominic

Grime with a cut eye.

Instead of replacing Grime, home manager Bob Makin decided to wait for physio Gary Anderson to stitch up the wound but the numerical advantage seemed to galvanise the Hatters into

Alexander sent in a corner that an unmarked Gray hung in the air for and nodded confidently into the bottom

Minutes later, Gavin McGowan and Kofi Nyamah both curled shots wide before Grime's re-introduction evened

After the interval, Davis drilled a corner wide and Evers hit the post after at the death. the best move of the match involving Alexander, Gray and Douglas.

On 54 minutes, Gray doubled his the loose ball from a strong Evers run

But before you could say 'Open the Floodgates' the home team had pulled a goal back.

Rather than opt for damage limitation, home boss Makin urged giant defender Nisbet forward and the big man responded by getting on the end of a classic Dixon flick and drilling past Kelvin Davis Kelvin Davis

Dixon might be a few pounds heavier than in his Kenilworth Road and England days but the Boreham Wood player coach proved he can still be an

Two minutes later, Nisbet almost added a second but Kelvin Davis' blushes were spared when the ball bounced wide off the home skipper after the Hatters keeper had dropped Mark Brown's free kick

The visitors were in need of respite not for the first time in the afternoon but they had to wait until the 76th minute for it when Davis' header from Gray's cross was only helped into the bottom corner by Taylor.

Even then the home team were not finished and substitute Mark Xavier ensured the outcome was in the balance right until the final whistle when, on 83 minutes, he coolly finished with the outside of his right boot after the ball had squirmed into his path in the area off McKinnon's head.

Referee Paul Alcock, of Paulo di Canio infamy, then made matters even more interesting by awarding an indirect free kick on the penalty spot after Steve Davis' inadvertent back pass

A replay at Kenilworth Road was avoided when Jason Shaw drilled the free kick into the wall and Gray went on side's advantage firing high into an empty net after Douglas had picked up to squander an opportunity for his hattrick by volleying over in the six-yard
