JUST two weeks ago Hull City's Tigers humbled Lennie Lawrence's Pussycats out of the FA Cup. On Saturday, it was the turn of Millwall's Lions to deliver another Kenilworth Road mauling!

Luton Town have lost the winning habit and face a difficult struggle to recapture it.
With games against in-form Reading and Bournemouth

over Christmas that will not be easy and Town need to improve fast if they are to avoid a very unhappy New Year in the bottom half of the Division Two table.

At least, neither of their next two opponents possess feline nicknames!

Saturday's unconvincing performance saw the Hatters drop further off the play-off pace after goals from Neil Harris and Lucas Neill helped bogey team Millwall to a third successive victory at Luton.

If ever there was a game to miss and catch up on a bit of last-minute Christmas shopping then this was the one for

Santa Claus himself would have struggled to deliver a more generous gift than the three points a lacklustre Luton team handed over to Millwall.

Graham Alexander, Sean Evers, Mitchell Thomas and Ray McKinnon were all missing from the starting line-up but the two inexperienced replacements Andre Scarlett and Stuart Fraser were arguably the best Hatters players on the pitch.

Scarlett hugged the touchline to great effect in his first

full start for the Hatters, his trickery on both flanks causing the only consternation in a well-drilled Millwall

Former youth team captain Fraser was assured at left back, having only played one reserve game after a cartilage operation. But aside from the teenage duo, most Luton players were below their best.

Confidence is currently at a low in the Kenilworth Road camp and the Hatters need to overcome the mental barrier of winning again - quickly!

"After every game we don't win, it becomes more important to win the next one," Lawrence reflected on his side's concerning decline in form after this latest disap-

The Hatters have now gone six games without a league victory. More significantly, they have trailed at some stage in each of those games and never really threatened a win.

Against Millwall, a string of missed chances early in the game saw the home team's confidence gradually subside after a dominant first half-hour.
