STEVE DAVIS has gone and any lingering play-off hopes have almost definitely disappeared with him.

But for cash-strapped Luton Town life must go on. How difficult it will be without their talismanic leader was illustrated by Saturday's grim 2-2 draw at

Colchester are a Division Three side who stumbled into Division Two via the play-offs.

They looked exactly that against the Hatters. Sadly, for the loyal band of travelling supporters, a Davis-less Luton looked little better.

Burnley's new £800,000 signing, justifiably labelled "the best defender in Division Two" by Lennie Lawrence, would have injected some much-needed class into a desperately drab encounter devoid of quality.

And Lawrence now faces the biggest test of his difficult managerial career at Kenilworth Road – filling the gaping hole left by the loss of Davis' majestic confidence and leadership ability.

A master of scoring and creating, as well as stopping, goals Davis is irreplaceable considering Luton Town's parlous financial state.

David Kohler has made no secret of his need to sell in recent weeks and Davis left for Burnley because the Lancastrians made the first realistic bid for any of the club's star men.

Matthew Spring, Sean Evers and Kelvin Davis could all have gone if any of a number of interested clubs had put their money where their mouth was but Davis' consistency and proven quality always made him the most likely to leave.

Resigned

His absence, therefore, will inevitably be felt the hardest. The only solace in Davis' departure is that selling their best players is hardly a notion foreign to Luton Town which perhaps explains the lack of any real protest at Layer Road from Hatters fans resigned to losing their inspirational skipper.

Marvin Johnson, who now has the responsibility of donning Davis' captain's armband, has seen it all before in his 12 years at Kenilworth Road and is hoping the club can bounce back yet again from the disappointment of losing a key.

Speaking after his first game as skipper on Saturday, Johnson said: "I just hope all the lads, including myself, can respond in the way we should to the sale of Steve Davis.

"We've got to get on with it. Selling our best players has always been the way at this club "I've seen a few come and go. Steve's been outstanding this season but we're a

selling club."
Alan White was handed the unenviable task of filling Davis' boots against Colchester and responded well, putting the Hatters ahead for a second time on

Comparing White to Davis would be unfair, not least because they are very different players, but, like Paul McLaren, the 22-year-old defender wears his heart on his sleeve and these are the type of players Lawrence may need to place his faith in as the Hatters scrap for points in 1999.

Other youngsters, such as Evers and Stuart Douglas, are clearly struggling to
