Lawrence abused after keeper's early bath

RUMBLINGS of 'Lawrence Out' echoed around Kenilworth Road as a Kelvin Davis-less Luton Town slumped to a miserable home defeat against Wigan.

The Hatters lost their goalkeeper after 23 minutes of Saturday's mid-table meeting for handling outside his area. Wigan had already taken the lead by that time and Davis' replacement Gerry Harrison went on to concede another three.

It was a painful afternoon for the home crowd and a small section levelled their frustration at the Hatters manager on the final whistle. The return of last season's familiar refrain clearly upset an exasperated Lawrence, who fumed afterwards: "People can scream and shout abuse as much as they like.

"We carry a lot of young players for development purposes. If half our experienced players are out through injury or suspension we are vulnerable. If you've got six players missing and your best player is sold, life gets hard from

"We've done alright so far but today with 10 men for 60 minutes and the goalkeeper sent off we got bashed. They brought a sub on who cost £600,000.





"One of those was Landry Zahana-Oni for £25,000 and he was playing in the Ryman League four weeks ago. The other was Alan White at left back. Except for Sean Dyche, Gerry Harrison and Marvin Johnson, all the players

are playing their first full season.

"If you look at the teams before the game and forget goalkeepers and sendings off, it's a hard one. They looked a good side when we had 11 on the pitch. The third goal killed us and it doesn't matter who was in goal for it because it was a great cross and a great header. In fact, Gerry did exceptionally well. "We're very sorry. We tried our hardest but now and again we're going to get

After this defeat, the prospect of a play-off challenge does not seem difficult but near impossible. A season that started so promisingly is now in danger of becoming a mid-table scrap - at best!

Lawrence set a promotion target of 46 points by Christmas ('98 not '99!). Since then, the Hatters have taken seven points from a possible 30 during a dramatic free-fall down the table and are still 12 points short of Lawrence's Yuletide tally.

Luton's problem remains the availability of senior players. There are still enough on the Kenilworth Road books but too many have question marks over their general fitness. If Lawrence had a full squad to choose from, he could field a side with three 30 somethings, five players aged between 26 and 28 and three aged 22.

But of those 11 players, six were sidelined on Saturday, including all three 30 somethings, and the question must be will the likes of Paul Showler, Mitchell Thomas and Julian James ever be fit. Ray McKinnon has also missed too many games this season with niggling hamstring and back problems

On Saturday, Davis' dismissal turned a likely defeat into a certain one with the Hatters' 10 men crumbling against an experienced and well-organised Wigan side.

An early bath for the Hatters' keeper was inevitable after a poor error in judgment. Davis raced out of his area and handled as Wigan striker Graeme Jones looked to knock the ball around him.

Wolverhampton referee Gurnam Singh had little hesitation in bran-dishing the red card and Harrison, already filling in at right back for Graham Alexander, was given an even sterner test of his versatility by lonning Davis' number one shirt.

The reshuffle saw Gavin McGowan drop back from right midfield to right-back and Zahana-Oni move inside to join Sean Evers and Matthew Spring in a narrow three-man midfield that was easily overrun with the visitors' Andy Liddell and Michael O'Neill particularly

Wigan had gone ahead on 15 minutes when ex-Manchester United defender Pat McGibbon headed in from two yards after Alan White generously flicked on O'Neill's corner at the near post.

Harrison's first job between the sticks was to pick the ball out of the net when a suspiciously offside-looking Liddell raced on to Kevin Sharp's long ball and slipped the ball comfortably past the Sunderland loan man. At the other end, Sean Dyche went closest for the shellshocked Hatters, his looping header forcing a fine fingertip save from Wigan keeper Roy Carroll on 38 minutes.

Andrew Fotiadis' quick feet were one of the highlights in a dismal first half for the home team but a groin strain meant he did not reappear alongside the struggling Stuart Douglas in the second period.

Fotiadis' replacement Gary Doherty briefly shone after the restart, dancing through the visitors' defence before seeing his blocked shot
