

Gerry move in jeopard

LENNIE LAWRENCE is calling for a quick clarification of the club's transfer policy in the wake of David Kohler's announcement that he will resign as chairman.

The Hatters boss is concerned that the situation needs to be resolved to prevent him losing out on loan pair Gerry Harrison and Sean Dyche.

Harrison is his pressing concern with his loan period coming to an end after Saturday's home game against Blackpool, two weeks before the Dyche deadline.

The Sunderland man is currently injured with a hamstring strain which further complicates matters.

Lawrence said: "The board situation needs to be resolved because there's a cond because of the uncertainty.

"So we might be in a position where he stays a third month but if his injury will keep him out for two weeks I need the space his loan takes up."

Lawrence would like former Tottenham left-winger Andy Turner to fill that loan space. The Crystal Palace man has been training with the club and has played in the last two reserve matches.

"We'd like to do somthing with him because he's done a bit in his career," Lawrence said.

It's Rover and out for Hatters play-off hopes

LUTON TOWN are beginning to look matchfacts nervously over their shoulder as the league season enters its final third.

The roller-coaster crisis club need to apply the brakes quickly if they are to avoid hurtling headlong into a relegation battle.

It is 16 games since the Hatters last beat a side with 11 men – the narrow 3-2 FA Cup victory over Boreham Wood! During that run, wins have only been chalked

up against nine-man Wycombe and 10-man Burnley. Both on and off the pitch, the club are in turmoil and, with a difficult March on the horizon – including games against three of the top four sides - results and confidence need to be found fast

Saturday's defeat against Bristol Rovers saw manager Lennie Lawrence finally concede that the

play-offs were an unrealistic target.

"I'm not thinking of anything beyond the next game," he admitted after his side went down to Andy Tillson's 26th-minute goal. "The next two are must wins; otherwise we're looking down very seriously.'

This latest defeat was influenced by the absence of seven players. Gray, Fotiadis, Harrison, Spring, Evers, McGowan and Thomas were all out and, on this evidence, are desparately needed back.


