Willmott's present deal runs out this summer and Lawrence sees no reason to delay discussions any further after his confident display against Blackpool on Saturday.

Lawrence had always intended to offer the Bedford-born centre-half an extension this summer.

"He was always staying even if he'd never played for the first team this season," the Hatters boss said.

"There was no way we'd release him. You have to wait longer for centre-halves and goalkeepers."

"He also lost nine months with a cruciate knee ligament injury.

"In fact, Trevor Peake, a well-respected judge of centre backs, would have put him a tad in front of Matthew Upson before his injury.

"He did well on Saturday another one I now know can go in and do a job.

"He'll be a Luton player, there's no doubt about that."

Despite his impressive debut, Willmott is likely to be replaced for Saturday's trip to third-placed Walsall with Marvin Johnson (groin) and Sean Dyche (bruised ribs) both making encouraging progress this week.


