



LUTON LOOK TO BREAK FREE FROM MID-TABLE MIRE

Currently marooned in the midtable mire, it has been another season of sheer frustration for Luton Town, a club who during the 1980's were regular members of the top flight and enjoyed two consecutive League Cup Final appearances in 1988 and 1989 - lifting the trophy in the former.

After last season's ultimately successful battle against the dreaded drop it was hoped that lessons could be learned this time around. but although The Hatters currently sit some ten points clear of the relegation zone, recent form would tend to suggest that Lennie Lawrence and his boys have some sleepless nights ahead between now and the end of the season.

On home soil they have won seven and lost five of their opening 15 League games - with ourselves being the first side to take home all three points courtesy of Andy Rammell's late winner back in September. Their last two appearances in front of the Kenilworth

Road faithful have seen them firstly allow struggling Notts County to go home with maximum points for only the third time this season before they registered a narrow 1-0 win over Blackpool last Saturday with Stuart Douglas notching the allimportant goal.

Away form has also been nothing to really shout about with seven defeats and four wins - against Burnley (2-1), Fulham (3-1), Wigan Athletic (3-1) and Wycombe Wanderers (1-0) - from 16 games. Goalscoring however hasn't been a problem away from home, and the 21 goals that they have bagged to date is bettered only by Preston North End in the whole of the division.

With injuries and poor form combining to make it a miserable time on the pitch, there are also unsettling events occurring off the field with a recent fire-bomb attack on the home of Chairman, David Kohler leading to him announcing his intention to resign. Plans for a move to a new stadium have also recently been rejected.

In a similar vein to their League position, The Hatters are also stuck in the middle of the attendance and disciplinary league tables. They have an average attendance of 5,495, which is slightly better than ours, whilst they have picked up 49 yellow and five red cards so far.



The £100,000 signing from Scunthorpe United in 1995 has gone on to serve Luton well with some spirited displays down the right-hand side, weighing in with a number of vital goals along the way. SEAN EVERS is a tenacious battler who has progressed through the ranks to earn a regular place in the side. Coping extremely well with the rigors of first-team football since coming into the side over the course of last season, the 21 year-old has a bright future ahead of him. RAY McKINNON is a player of undoubted ability who is trying his luck in the English game for a second time after a previous unsuccessful spell with Nottingham Forest. The former Scotland Under-21 international has served both Dundee United and Aberdeen in the top flight, so he has the necessary experience and know-how in the middle of the park. MICHAEL McINDOE is a left-sided midfielder who was thrust into first-team duty early on in the season after







injuries opened the way for him into the side. Grabbing his chance with both hands, the 18 year-old should carve out a good career for himself in the game if he continues to progress in the same vein. PAUL McLAREN is another player to have come up through the ranks, being offered a professional contract at just 17 years of age. A forceful and attack-minded player, he is a regular member of the side. PAUL SHOWLER has suffered greatly at the hands of injury during his Luton Town career. An attacking midfielder, who is more comfortable on the lefthand side, he helped Barnet during their early Football League days before linking up with Lennie Lawrence for the first time at Bradford City. An honest and hard-working performer. MATH-

EW SPRING is a competitive midfielder who made his Hatters debut as a 17 year-old in September 1997. Highly regarded by the Luton management, he will no doubt have an important role to play in the side over the months and years ahead.

In attack, JIMMY COX is an old-

fashioned winger who is not afraid to

take his marker on. Another member

of Luton's highly successful youth side of last season, he made his first-team breakthrough earlier this season and should expect more opportunities between now and the end of the campaign. STUART DOUGLAS is a pacey striker who has a tremendous scoring record at both youth and reserve team level. Sadly his opportunities were limited last term due to injury, but he has been a regular face in the side this time around. ANDREW FOTIADIS is another local lad who has broke through into the side. Gaining England Schoolboy honours, he is an old-style centre forward who rattles opposition defences with his rugged and determined style. LIAM GEORGE is a speedy forward who has very good skill on the ball. A regular on the scoresheet at both youth and reserve level, he has been unable to stake a claim for a regular first-team berth after breaking a leg shortly after getting into the first-team. Capped at youth level by the Republic of Ireland. PHIL GRAY is a much-loved figure on the Kenilworth Road terraces. Now in his second spell at the club, his career has taken him to Tottenham Hotspur, Sunderland, Nancy in the French league and Fortuna Sittard in Holland. Recalled to the Northern Ireland squad last November after a productive spell in front of goal for The Hatters, ANDRE SCARLETT made a dream debut against Oldham Athletic

in October, when the Brent-born youngster came on as a substitute to score the clinching goal. A tricky player who is very much in Lennie Lawrence's long-term plans. L'ANDRY ZAHANA-ONI arrived at the club in January after impressing whilst turning out for non-Leaguers Bromley. An exciting left winger, he is a French national who had six years with Le Havre before coming over to try his luck in Britain. Spending eight months up in Scotland with Striling Albion prior to moving to Bromley, he cost Luton £2,500 with more installments to follow based upon appearances.

AT THE HELM - LENNIE LAWRENCE

With the club having invested heavily in new players but still struggling in the League, it was decided that an experienced manager was required to steady the ship and so in the Autumn of 1995 Lennie Lawrence was appointed into the hot-seat.

A non-League player who gave service to Croydon, Carshalton and Sutton United, his managerial career commenced as assistant boss at Plymouth Argyle and then Lincoln City. He went to Charlton Athletic initially as reserve coach before landing the top job and making his mark by guiding the unfashionable London club into the top flight and keeping them there for four years. He then guided Middlesbrough into the top flight before moving on to Bradford City where he stayed for 18 months before accepting the challenge at Luton within weeks of moving out of Valley Parade.

With a very young, up-and-coming squad at his disposal, it is hoped that he can lead them along the right lines to produce a fruitful future for Luton Town Football Club.



After two successive League wins on the road, The Saddlers went into the game fully expecting to take another three points from a side who had only tasted victory on two occasions away from Saltergate.




Brissett keeps his marker at bay by cunningly shielding the ball



THE GOOD, THE BAD AND THE URLY

Geoff Allman takes a trip down nemory lane....

THE GOODWalsall 4 Luton Town 0
Division Three, December 14th 1963

This game was played midway through our first season back in the old Division Three after we had been relegated alongside Luton in the previous May. We were at the time in midtable with Luton several places below us as they battled to avoid being sucked into a relegation battle.

Before the start of the game the new 'Saddlers Song' was played over the loudspeaker. The lyrics went something like this; 'Up, up The Saddlers.... there's a job to be done.... there's a game to be played.... there's a match to be won.'

The 3,800 present were maybe too cold to do much singing, but they soon warmed up and found their voices as we tested former England 'keeper Ron Baynham several times in the opening minutes before finally taking the lead mid-way through the first half.

It was a real textbook move as Ken Hodgkisson wrong-footed the defence with a perfectly weighted ball and Ray Wiggin timed his run superbly to flick the ball into the net. By half-time it was 2-0 as Wiggin's shot was blocked by Baynham and as Trevor Foster followed up his shot appeared to be going wide before it hit Gordon Fincham and found the net.

Soon after the break it was 3-0 as Hodgkisson moved out to the right wing, shook off a challenge by John Bramwell and crossed perfectly for Wiggin to head home. As the crowd chanted 'we want six!' we did at least manage to grab another goal as George Meek crossed to the far post where Trevor Foster was on hand to hurl himself forward and score with a spectacular diving header. There were still 20 minutes left on the clock but we couldn't add to our score.

Alas we did not show the same sort of form again that season and ended the campaign just two points clear of relegation. Luton meanwhile finished two points above ourselves.

THE BAD

Walsall O Luton Town 1 Division Three (south), March 21st 1931

Though we began this game third from bottom of Division Three (south), whilst Luton were sixth from top, we had hopes of getting vital points to keep us out of the danger zone as we had taken a point from Kenilworth Road in the previous November and we had beaten fifth place Crystal Palace in our previous home game.

We began brightly enough in the opening minutes. Jackie Barnes mis-kicked when well placed, then John Bartley fully extended visiting 'keeper George Harford with a couple of low shots. For all our pressure we looked in danger on the occasions when Luton broke and we owed much to Tom Godfrey for a last-ditch clearance after George McNestry had beaten Charlie Houldey.

The second half began badly when Bartley was injured in our first attack. He was off the field for some time and never in fact played for the first-team again. Soon after his injury Luton scored the winning goal when Bob Bryce crossed from the left for Buster Brown to turn the ball home.

We continued to dominate the play after that but couldn't find a way through. Then to put a lid on a truly frustrating day a Barnes cross found the injured Bartley right in front of goal, his weak header seemed to have been forced over the line with the referee ready to blow for full-time, however Harford managed to grab the ball and clear. Despite our protests the referee failed to award a goal and duly blew for the final whistle.

It was almost a year ago that we disappointed our fans by failing to take even a point from a Luton side who came here under a relegation shadow with only Southend United below them.

A week earlier both clubs had made loan signings but while Gijsbert Bos, our new man from Rotherham United, did not even make the substitutes bench, Luton's loanee from Tottenham Hotspur, Rory Allen, not only started the game but laid on the opening goal after 35 minutes when he chipped the ball in from the right for David Oldfield to bag his seventh goal of the campaign.

We began the second half on a livelier note with Michael Ricketts on for Clive Platt and after 52 minutes we were level as Adrian Viveash powered home a header from a Dean Keates corner. Our fans now looked for us to take control of the game, but we were rocked back just six minutes later as Oldfield beat lan Roper only to see his shot cannon off the post and fall nicely into the path of Rory Allen who gratefully accepted the chance to notch his first goal for Luton.

Roger Boli desperately looked for what would be his first goal since that memorable FA Cup tie at Old Trafford two months earlier. Twice he went close as we piled on the pressure, but we were caught on the break and with 73 minutes gone Oldfield set up Dwight Marshall for the latter to round Jimmy Walker and stroke the ball into an empty net.

Within a minute the determination of Viveash pulled us back into it as his header was stabbed home by Didier Tholot. Sadly we couldn't force the equaliser and the result left us with a real relegation battle on our hands. We did however manage to pick up eight more points before the end of the season to stay up with four points to spare, whilst Luton went on to record three more wins in a row and ended the campaign three points and two places above us.

Paul Coton was one of those players who graduated via our reserve team ranks to make his first-team debut as a teenager. It seemed that he had a substantial Football League career before him, however those of us who were at Fellows Park on April 8th 1967 were to see what was not only his first ever Football League game but also his last.

Born in Birmingham in 1949 he came to us as an apprentice and after some impressive reserve team games in The Football Combination against the likes of Arsenal and Chelsea, he signed professional on his 18th Birthday in February 1967.

He seemed to be going from strength to strength not only as a well-built right flank defender but also as a most useful attacking force when going up for set pieces.


It was no surprise therefore when he came into our first-team number two shirt to take over from Frank Gregg who had pulled a groin muscle in an unhappy 5-1 defeat at Colchester a week earlier. Shrewsbury Town were our opponents for Paul's debut. Paul was beaten once or twice but kept battling away in a goalless first half.

Sadly though he was caught out late in the game at a time when the score was locked at 1-1. He attempted a back-pass to Keith Ball but Eric Brodie nipped in to set up Trevor Meredith who made no mistake to give The Shrews the lead. Though we later went on to equalise and take a point out of the game Paul still felt badly about his error.

Ken Hill came into the team for the next game and so Paul was back in the reserves in time to be sent off in a game against Bristol City.

Paul went on to spend one more season in our reserve team before making a move to local non-League outfit Telford United. He later decided to emigrate to Australia.

Another crazy tale reaches us from South America where Palmeiras coach Luiz Felipe Scolari made the headlines by claiming that his players were overweight after a narrow win in the Copa Brasil (Brazilian Cup).
