LUTON TOWN threw away another three points after gifting Stoke striker Graham Kavanagh two early goals.

David Kohler recently called the club a ship without a rudder and with six defeats in their last seven games the Hatters are in danger of sinking faster than the Titanic!

Saturday's 2-1 defeat means Lennie Lawrence's side have now:

● Lost seven of their last 10 games at Kenilworth Road.

• Scored just one goal from open play in 583 minutes of football.

• Kept only one clean sheet in 22 matches

But despite those alarming statistics Stoke, having been thumped 4 0 at home by Reading in midweek, were even lower than Luton in the division's form table going into Saturday's game.

Like the angry home crowd, Brian Little's side could not believe the

hosts' generosity in handing them a 17th-minute two-goal cushion. Mitchell Thomas tripped Chris Short to give Kavanagh his first opportunity from the spot after just 10 minutes.

And seven minutes later, the hapless Thomas was at fault again when his poorly headed clearance was met by Kavanagh 15 yards out with a volley that squeezed under

red-faced Kelvin Davis' body.
Ex-Hatter David Oldfield should have set the seal on a miserable first-half for the home side but allowed Davis to save his shot on the stroke of half-time having been given a free run on

Lawrence and his players went into the changing rooms with torrents of abuse ringing in their

Things could only get better in the second-half and they did, but only briefly.

A minute into the interval,

Stoke defender Stephen Woods handled Matthew Spring's header across goal after Gerry Harrison's cross and Graham Alexander confidently dispatched the

penalty.

Moments later, Alan White, who endured another torrid match alongside defensive lynchpin Marvin Johnson, thought he had equalised but his effort was ruled out for a push on Stoke keeper Gavin Ward by Thomas.

That was the closest the home team came to snatching a point, Stoke looking more dangerous in front of goal than the shot-shy Hatters.
