Loan ranger Sean returns to shoot down the Gills!

SEAN DYCHE capped his loan return from Bristol City with a goal that gave the Hatters victory over play-off hopefuls Gillingham.

With a rousing performance in the Luton sunshine it was as if winter had never happened. Saturday's display brought back happier memories of Kenilworth Road cup and league triumphs in late summer and autumn with the Hatters once more mentally strong enough to edge a close game and protect a clean sheet.

That they did was largely due to the brilliance of Kelvin Davis. The 22-year-old goalkeeper pulled off four breathtaking saves to deny a strong and determined Gillingham side.

When the two sides met in Kent this season, a Davis mistake cost Luton the points in a 1-0 defeat. He more

than atoned for that error on Saturday.

In the first half, he beat away a stinging drive by the impressive Robert Taylor, palmed out a Nicky Southall effort and tipped over a Carl Asaba header. After the break, the former England under-21

international was less busy but still needed to be on his toes to safeguard all three points in the 87th minute.

Taylor was again the man thwarted, Davis tipping the Gillingham striker's vicious volley over on his back foot.

But the game was far from just a one-man show. Lennie Lawrence's persuasive qualities should be applauded in bringing Dyche and ny Thorpe back to the club with

Taylor off the scoresheet.

Thorpe was given a hero's reception from the home crowd and responded with one of his finest games in a Luton shirt without scoring. The former Kenilworth Road goal king has had a hard time at Fulham and Bristol City since leaving Luton just over

Keeper Vince Bartram, who pushed over his firm drive after a clever diagonal run across the Gillingham penalty box.

That was vintage Thorpe. What wasn't was the impressive link-up play, especially in the second half with Gavin McGowan in particular. McGowan was another Luton ahead.
