LUTON TOWN bowed out of the Worthington Cup last night after a 2-2 draw at Bristol Rovers.

The Hatters stormed to the quarter finals of last season's competition but fell at the first hurdle this time round, going out 4-2 on aggregate.

Lennie Lawrence rested eight players from the side that beat Reading 2-1 on Saturday. Phil Gray, Nathan Abbey and Julian Watts were the only players to keep their places — on loan defender Julian Watts was captain for the evening.

Emmerson Boyte should have given the Hatters an early lead

when he latched onto Tresor Kandol's fifth-minute pass and raced on goal. But the 20-year-old wingback shot straight at home keeper Lee Jones when it seemed easier to score.

The visitor's other chances before the interval fell to Gray, who blazed over on 17 minutes and volleyed straight at Jones just past the half-hour.

At the other end, rookie keeper Abbey was rarely tested with Rovers apparantly content to defend their twogoal first-leg adavantage.

The Hatters lacked the attacking invention to ignite a lacklustre first half and Stuart Douglas and Kandol were often frustrated by a well oiled home offside trap.

Jamie Cureton had the home side's best chance of the half moments before the break but was denied by Abbey and Robbie Pethick hit a post.

Abbey kept Luton in the tie on 57 minutes when he saved from the powerful Jason Roberts but the division's leading scorer was not to be kept off the scoresheet for long.

And it was an Abbey clanger that gifted him his sixth goal of the

campaign three minutes later – the Hatters keeper dropped a Pethick cross and Roberts chipped over Watts to restore Rover's two-goal aggregate lead.
