LUTON were beaten by the know-how of former Everton striker Stuart Barlow when a win would have taken them into second place; but Lennie Lawrence's team still left the JJB Stadium with praise ringing in their ears.

Wigan manager John Benson said: "Luton were the better side in the first 45 minutes. The tactics employed against us were spot-on. Luton were well organised and there are some good young players at the club who are a credit to the work Lennie Lawrence is doing."

Luton's 19-year-old Gary Doherty was superb at the centre of defence and he is just one of the precocious players who point to an improving future for the cash-starved club. He thought he had put Luton ahead in the 39th minute with a delicate flicked

header from a Matt Taylor right-wing free-kick. Doherty rushed back into his own half in celebration with half of his team-mates, only to realise the goal had been disallowed when he saw Wigan taking a free-kick in their own penalty area.

Lawrence said: "The referee told us that it was offside, and apparently his assistant had his flag up early."

Luton looked capable of holding out for a draw until Barlow scored from close range after a headed pass by Ian Kilford.

Barlow conceded: "We were not at our best today; but that was probably due to a good performance by Luton. In any case these were three valuable points in a battle between two of the top four teams."
