O'Connor had put the visitors ahead after 32 minutes.

Luton, with Taylor recalled after suspension for the first time since he was sent off at Stoke last month, were soon into their stride and made all

of the early running. It was one-way traffic until Stoke, in a rare counter-attack, stole into the lead through O'Connor. The goal was made on the left by Clive Clarke, who threaded his way in from the touchline and whose pass was side-footed

Luton continued to press and they drew level with 62 minutes gone. The goal came from a corner, won by Gray, who then headed home Taylor's cross at the far post.

Stoke were dangerous on the counter, and Clarke almost forced another goal when Nathan Abbey spread himself to save. But it was Luton who eventually snatched a second goal after 78 minutes when Gray swept the ball home from a cross by the ball home from a cross by Douglas.
