But they were helped by the inexperience of Luton's 21-year-old goalkeeper Nathan Abbey, who had a day to forget.

Abbey made crucial errors after Luton had taken an early lead as Roberts and Cureton cashed in gratefully.

And by the end they had shared the Rovers' goals, leaving manager lan Holloway well pleased with their performance but not so happy about a defence which might have conceded two or three before Rovers got on the mark.

Luton began the brighter and Northern Ireland striker Phil Gray put them ahead in the 14th minute lead when heading home from close range after a pinpoint cross by Stuart Douglas.

Abbey was hopelessly out of position as Roberts accepted his 21st goal of the season.

The goalkeeper dropped his second clanger when he dropped the ball on the edge of his penalty area from an over-hit pass by Pethick and this time Cureton hit into an empty net.

Pethick again made the opportunity for Cureton's second goal on 57 minutes and although Luton put in plenty of effort goalkeeper Jones was equal to everything they threw at him

And to complete Luton's third home defeat of the season and their worst for 15 months Roberts completed his double in stoppage time.

Luton manager Lennie Lawrence called it the blackest day of the season.
