

Division Two Update







Jamie's reign dates back to 1986 when he joined his hometown team as a trainee after suporting Spireites from the terraces with dad Les.

The utility man moved to Doncaster Rovers in August 1992 but returned just over a year later.

He celebrated a testimonial season in 1998-99 and the current campaign has seen him almost ever-present in the Chesterfield squad, missing just one game.

But 31-year-old Jamie's proudest moment came in Spireites' epic FA Cup semi final with Middlesbrough at Old Trafford, when his dramatic last-minute goal earned Chesterfield a 3/3 draw and a replay at Hillsborough.


Lennie Lawrence's side have not had the best of times on there travels this season, having picked up just 12 points form the 51 available and having conceded over 50 goals in the process.



Ten-goal Joe and the Derbyshire Connection

Recently, Steve Payne moved into our forward line and followed the likes of Jimmy Cookson and Roy Poole, each successful converts from defence to attack. Sixty-four years ago our visitors did the same with a man from Brimington Common named Joe Payne, and the result was quite spectacular.

over a Payne header that appeared to be saved before a Luton player bundled the keeper and the ball into the net, but the referee later confirmed that Payne was the scorer. Earlier that season. Ted Drake scored seven for Arsenal at Aston Villa, and Tranmere's Bunny Bell broke a League record with nine goals in his

The Hatters entertained Bristol Rovers as leaders of the Third Division (South) on April 13th, 1936. Handicapped by injuries among forwards, their they turned to a reserve wing-half to lead the line. Joe Pavne had had experience up front, being a regular inside-forward for Bolsover Colliery's Derbyshire League side in the early 'Thirties, but he had no great pedigree as a goalscorer. Nevertheless, Luton's Manager, the former Chester-

field Town centre-forward Harold Wightman, saw something in him. A spell with Sheffield Wednesday on amateur forms had led to nothing, and he joined Luton at the end of the 1934-5 season.

Back to the match. Payne waited 23 minutes for his first, but completed his hattrick seventeen minutes later as Luton turned round with a 4-0 halftime lead. The second half was one-way traffic. Luton piled on eight more goals and, although the Bristol Evening Post headline read "Luton man scores nine against Rovers!", Payne was officially credited with ten goals. There was some confusion

side's 13-4 win over Oldham. Pavne's effort is unlikely ever to be surpassed at Football League level.

After the game Joe reportedly said "They told me to go out and get two or three goals, if I could. But they didn't tell me what to do afterwards, so I just carried on." Luton had to apply to the League for permission to present Payne with the match ball. An item that would be worth a fortune now, no longer exists: it was said Joe's lad that wanted a football

and, unable to afford a new one, Joe gave him the Bristol Rovers ball to kick about.

Joe scored 55 goals as Luton won promotion to the Second Division in '36-7 but was already beginning to suffer from ill-health when he was sold to Chelsea. The war took away much of his career, but gave him the chance to play for Chesterfield. He appeared as a guest against Notts County in December 1944, and scored three goals. In all, he scored 110 goals in 116 League games and will forever retain his place as one of the greatest goalscorers in football history.




Football Matters

Football's female invasion

Many moons ago when I first started attending football matches almost the only females to attend games were the ones serving you in the tea bars. Nowadays football has started to recognise that those days are way behind as, at many clubs, the new nouveau riche are the career women with serious money to spend on their new hobby - or so the recent statistics suggest.

The female percentages of the Premiership crowd varies from 5% at that bastion of male chauvinism, Newcastle United to a staggering 22% at our county neighbours Derby County and Leicester City are a mere percentage point behind, so maybe there's something in the Midland air (Midland ?? I always consider Chesterfield to be northern - is the dividing line

somewhere in Derbyshire ?). Don't ask me for any detailed analysis of why but I do know that I'm now used to seeing many more women at matches and what a good thing too!

Football has had, for most of it's history, a male dominated football crowd - and has had to suffer the consequences. Footballs problems (of the 1960s and 70s) with crowd violence, obscene chanting and racism would surely have been diluted if football had always been a 50/50 split in terms of gender. It seems certain that, as the fabric of society has changed and women have gained more freedom from domestic drudgery, the appeal that football has always had for males started to instigate similar interest for women.

Obviously our antiguated facilities here at Saltergate won't have been the stimulating factor in gaining female interest for the Spireites but I'm sure the introduction of modern all-seater stadia throughout the country has had a big effect in attracting more women (and families generally) into football and, hopefully, improving the crowd mix to an extent that an improvement in atmosphere is now noticeable. Our new stadium (if it ever comes to fruition) should take female needs into account i.e. crEches rather than just a flushing loo if we are to gain in a similar way to the Premiership clubs.

Of course, despite my initial comment, there has always been a female presence at games but

the task for football now is to make that interest grow. Ladies Football is flourishing (2 consecutive record attendances at Barnsley and Norwich for Womens internationals confirm that interest) and most of those fans are potential attendees at league games . Fulham recently had a Ladies Day where all female fans received for their £5 admission payment a free goody bag that contained a programme, toiletries and a voucher to bring a friend for free at their next visit; the way to boost attendances generally is logically through innovative schemes such as Fulham's that offers value and makes the fans feel valued, something we'd all like to feel and goes some way to retaining interest rather than just creating it.

The days of blind loyalty have gone and grim seasons like this one make it hard to attract anyone to games (let alone convince females to start attending). Reading's recent initiative of setting up a web site to unload (after 1p.m. on the day of the game) tickets for £1 - rather than have the seats empty shows a sensible approach to reaching out to hook fans in but ALL clubs MUST recognise the changing face of the leisure industry and adopt policies that encourage women. children and men to a club that appreciates and nurtures their support.

'Hatters Capped'

October 12th 1946 **Division Two Chesterfield** 2 Luton Town 1

An enjoyable game at Saltergate in which Chesterfield were made to fight hard to maintain their unbeaten home record. Spireites forwards impressed as they took every opportunity to shoot at goal. The defence was as usual very strong. Bywater in the Luton goal had a gruelling time but he displayed confidence on his debut. 
Supporters' Club News
